- 3) The building of positive relationships between students and members of law enforcement.

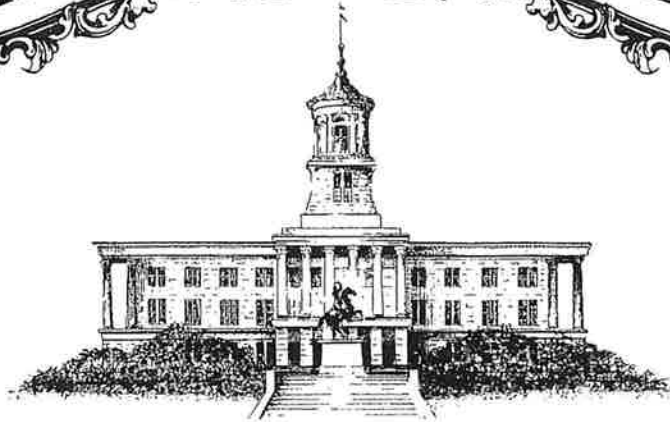
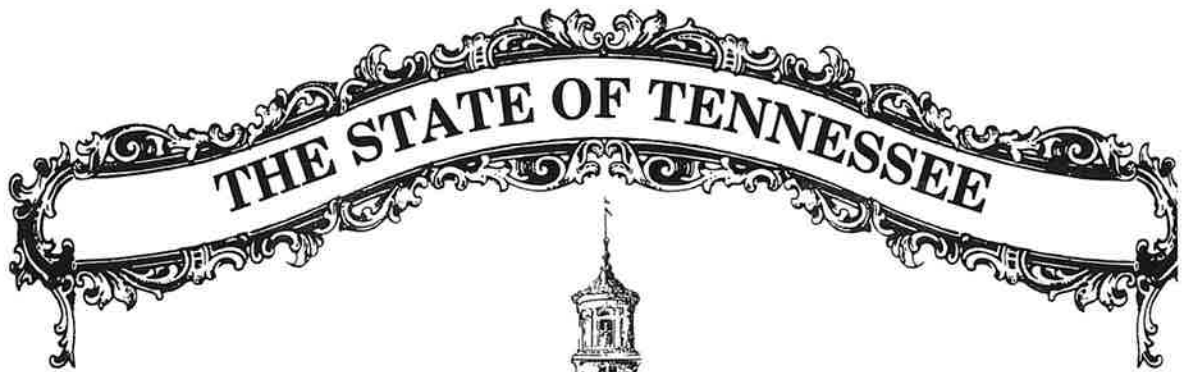

AN ACT to repeal Chapter 313 of the Private Acts of 1949; as amended by Chapter 679 of the Private Acts of 1949; Chapter 398 of the Private Acts of 1951; Chapter 219 of the Private Acts of 1953; Chapter 170 of the Private Acts of 1953; Chapter 111 of the Private Acts of 1963; Chapter 19 of the Private Acts of 1963; Chapter 366 of the Private Acts of 1968; Chapter 74 of the Private Acts of 1969; Chapter 274 of the Private Acts of 1974; Chapter 138 of the Private Acts of 1975; Chapter 306 of the Private Acts of 1982; Chapter 143 of the Private Acts of 1988; Chapter 1 of the Private Acts of 1991; Chapter 161 of the Private Acts of 1996; Chapter 29 of the Private Acts of 2003; Chapter 72 of the Private Acts of 2004 and Chapter 1 of the Private Acts of 2023, and any other acts amendatory thereto, relative to the Hamblen County Highway Department.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Chapter 313 of the Private Acts of 1949, as amended by Chapter 679 of the Private Acts of 1949, Chapter 398 of the Private Acts of 1951, Chapter 170 of the Private Acts of 1953, Chapter 219 of the Private Acts of 1953, Chapter 19 of the Private Acts of 1963, Chapter 111 of the Private Acts of 1963, Chapter 366 of the Private Acts of 1968, Chapter 74 of the Private Acts of 1969, Chapter 274 of the Private Acts of 1974, Chapter 138 of the Private Acts of 1975, Chapter 306 of the Private Acts of 1982, Chapter 143 of the Private Acts of 1988, Chapter 1 of the Private Acts of 1991, Chapter 161 of the Private Acts of 1996, Chapter 29 of the Private Acts of 2003, Chapter 72 of the Private Acts of 2004, Chapter 1 of the Private Acts of 2023, and any other acts amendatory thereto, are repealed effective August 31, 2028.

SECTION 2. The Hamblen County, Tennessee, Road Commission is abolished effective August 31, 2028. Should a vacancy on the Road Commission occur prior to August 31, 2028, the vacancy shall not be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term. Nothing in this Act shall be construed as having the effect of removing any incumbent from office or abridging the term of any official prior to the end of the term for which they were elected. The amount of compensation paid to members of the Road Commission shall be determined by the legislative body of Hamblen County and is payable out of the county highway fund. The members of the Road Commission shall elect one (1) of their members to serve as chairman. A majority of the Road Commission shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of business.

SECTION 3. For the purpose of providing an efficient system of roads, highways, and bridges and the building, construction, reconstruction, maintenance and repair of roads, highways, and bridges in Hamblen County, Tennessee, the office of Road Superintendent for said County is hereby created. At the regular August election in 2028, and every four (4) years thereafter, a Road Superintendent shall be elected by popular vote by the qualified voters of Hamblen County to serve a term of four (4) years. The Road Superintendent shall assume office on September 1 following the election and shall continue to hold office until a successor is elected and qualified. The qualifications and salary for the Road Superintendent shall be as prescribed by the County Uniform Highway Law, Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 54, Chapter 7.

SECTION 4.

(a) The Road Superintendent shall have all the powers and duties set forth in the County Uniform Highway Law, Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 54, Chapter 7.

(b) In addition to the duties prescribed in subsection (a), the Road Superintendent, at the Superintendent's discretion, may oversee the Hamblen County

Sanitation Department. Any supplemental salary arising out of and relating to such oversight of the Hamblen County Sanitation Department shall be subject to the approval of the legislative body of Hamblen County.

SECTION 5. Purchasing for the highway department shall be governed by the County Uniform Highway Law, Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 54, Chapter 7, and any other purchasing laws applicable to Hamblen County.

SECTION 6. All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby expressly repealed. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given without the invalid provision or application, and to that end, the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 7. This act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the legislative body of Hamblen County. Its approval or nonapproval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the county legislative body and certified to the Secretary of State.

SECTION 8. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this act, it shall be effective upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, it shall become effective upon being approved as provided in Section 7.

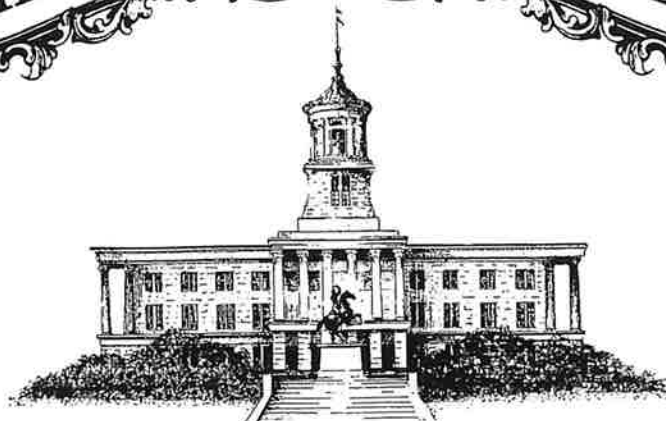
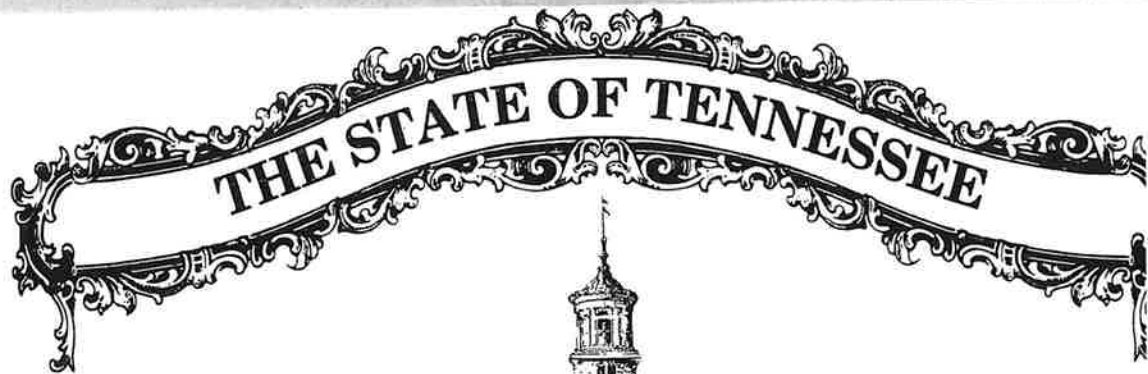

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Chapter 677 of the Private Acts of 1949, as amended by Chapter 434 of the Private Acts of 1968, and any other acts amendatory thereto, is amended by deleting SECTION 1 and substituting:

SECTION 1. That there is hereby created the office of County Attorney for Hamblen County. The County Attorney shall be elected by the Hamblen County Commission annually at the September meeting designated for the election of County Attorney.

SECTION 2. Chapter 677 of the Private Acts of 1949, and any other acts amendatory thereto, is amended by deleting SECTION 2 and substituting:

SECTION 2. [Deleted by 2026 amendment]

SECTION 3. Chapter 677 of the Private Acts of 1949, as amended by Chapter 434 of the Private Acts of 1968, and any other acts amendatory thereto, is amended by deleting SECTION 3 and substituting:

SECTION 3. The County Attorney for services, shall be paid an annual retainer fee of Twelve Hundred Dollars (\$1200), payable in equal monthly installments out of the general funds of the County, by warrant of the County Judge or Chairman upon the trustee. For legal services performed on behalf of the County, the County Attorney shall be entitled to receive additional reasonable compensation and reimbursement for actual expenses incurred. All compensation and reimbursement are subject to review by the County Legislative Body through the Consent Calendar. Claims for expenses shall be itemized and certified by the County Attorney, upon standard County financial policies, shall be paid in the same manner as the retainer and other fees.

SECTION 4. This act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the legislative body of Hamblen County. Its approval or nonapproval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the legislative body and certified to the secretary of state.

SECTION 5. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this act, it shall be effective upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, it shall become effective as provided in Section 4.

This Agreement (as further defined in Section 12) is entered into this date of _____ ("Effective Date"), by and between Manhattan Telecommunications Corporation LLC, having its principal place of business at 55 Water Street, 32nd Floor, New York, NY 10041 (hereinafter referred to as "MetTel"), and _____ having its principal place of business at _____ (hereinafter referred to as "Customer").

1. PRODUCTS AND SERVICES / TERM. Customer agrees to acquire from MetTel the services ("Services"), software ("Software") and equipment ("Equipment") identified on the schedules to this Agreement ("Schedules"), for a 36 month period, unless a different term is specified on the Schedules (as applicable, the "Initial Term"). Services, Software and Equipment are collectively referred to as "Products." The effective date of the Initial Term for any Product will be the date that the applicable Product is installed, delivered and/or available for use, as applicable, or, for existing Products, the date hereof. THE TOTAL MAXIMUM AGGREGATE LIABILITY HEREUNDER, IF ANY, OF METTEL AND ITS AFFILIATES AND SUPPLIERS AND THEIR OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, AGENTS AND EMPLOYEES FOR DAMAGES ARISING OUT OF THIS AGREEMENT, THE RELATIONSHIP CREATED HEREBY OR OUT OF THE FURNISHING OF PRODUCTS SHALL BE LIMITED TO: (I) FOR SERVICE FAILURES: A REPAIR OR RE-PERFORMANCE OF THE SERVICE, AND A PRO-RATA REFUND OF ANY PREPAID FEES FOR CONTINUOUS SERVICE FAILURES IN EXCESS OF 24 HOURS, (II) UNLESS DIRECTLY CAUSED BY THE WILLFUL MISCONDUCT OF METTEL, NO LIABILITY FOR INJURY TO PERSONS OR PROPERTY, LOSSES (INCLUDING ANY LOSS OF BUSINESS), DAMAGES, CLAIMS OR EXPENSES OF ANY KIND CAUSED BY EQUIPMENT OR SOFTWARE, AND (III) IN ALL OTHER CASES PROVEN DIRECT DAMAGES IN AN AMOUNT LIMITED TO THE SERVICE CHARGES PAID BY CUSTOMER UNDER THIS AGREEMENT DURING THE THREE MONTHS PRECEDING THE DATE OF ACCRUAL OF THE FIRST CLAIM, EVEN IF THE OTHER LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY SET FORTH HEREIN FAIL OF THEIR ESSENTIAL PURPOSE. IN ADDITION, NONE OF METTEL OR ITS AFFILIATES AND SUPPLIERS OR ANY OF THEIR OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, AGENTS OR EMPLOYEES WILL BE LIABLE TO THE CUSTOMER FOR ANY CONSEQUENTIAL, INDIRECT, INCIDENTAL, RELIANCE, EXEMPLARY, SPECIAL, PUNITIVE OR OTHER LIKE DAMAGES INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION LOSS OF USE, PROFITS, REVENUE, BUSINESS OR GOODWILL WITH RESPECT TO ANY CLAIMS ARISING UNDER THIS AGREEMENT OR REGARDING THE PRODUCTS TO BE PROVIDED HEREUNDER, EVEN IF METTEL HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES. WITHOUT LIMITING THE FOREGOING, IT IS EXPRESSLY UNDERSTOOD AND ACKNOWLEDGED THAT THE UNDERLYING SERVICE PROVIDER SHALL HAVE NO LIABILITY WHATSOEVER FOR CUSTOMER LOSSES, CLAIMS OR DAMAGES FOR ANY CAUSE WHATSOEVER, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ANY SERVICE FAILURE, REGARDLESS OF THE FORM OF ACTION, WHETHER IN CONTRACT OR IN TORT OR OTHERWISE.

6. LETTER OF AUTHORIZATION/AGENCY. MetTel will act as Customer's authorized agent for all matters related to obtaining connectivity service records and to the provisioning of local and long-distance communications services associated with all Customer's telephone numbers for which Service is ordered under a Schedule. MetTel has the authority to order local, regional, and long distance changes on all numbers associated with the accounts listed on the Schedules to this Agreement. MetTel shall not release any information regarding Customer's telecommunications services without obtaining the Customer's written approval except where required pursuant to subpoena or court order. To the extent possible, MetTel shall freeze Customer's services so that a third party (including another carrier) cannot complete a change without having the Customer contact MetTel and authorize the change.

7. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION. Each party shall hold in confidence and not use, except to perform its obligations hereunder, information received from the other party that is designated confidential or proprietary or that a reasonable person would treat as confidential based upon the nature of the information disclosed or the circumstances of the disclosure ("Confidential Information") for the Term and a period of 2 years thereafter. The parties agree that Confidential Information shall include the pricing and terms and conditions of this Agreement, any proposals or requests for proposals, and information relating to the disclosing party's technology, business affairs, and marketing or sales plans. Neither party shall use Confidential Information for any purpose other than in furtherance of performance under this Agreement or disclose Confidential Information to any third party other than to entities that are bound by non-disclosure obligations that are substantially similar to those set forth in this Agreement. The fact that the parties are engaged in a business relationship is not Confidential Information. Customer must obtain MetTel's written permission prior to disclosing any MetTel Confidential Information to any competitor of MetTel. The foregoing restrictions shall not apply to information that: (a) is or becomes publicly available through no act or omission of the receiving party; (b) was already in the lawful possession of the receiving party without an obligation of confidentiality; (c) is lawfully disclosed to the receiving party by a third party that is not restricted from making such disclosure; (d) is required to be disclosed by subpoena or other legal process, limited to the extent required by the terms of such subpoena or other legal process; (e) is approved in writing by the disclosing party for further disclosure; (f) is independently developed without reference to the Confidential Information and is so documented by the receiving party; or (g) is required to port telephone numbers. Receiving party acknowledges that the unauthorized use or disclosure of any such Confidential Information is likely to cause irreparable injury to disclosing party for which there is no adequate remedy at law. Accordingly, receiving party acknowledges that disclosing party may seek injunctive relief against it to prevent or remedy any breach of the confidentiality obligation described herein without disclosing party being required to post bond.

8. TERMINATION.

8.1. Default. A party shall be deemed in default of this Agreement (a "Default") upon the occurrence of any one or more of the following events:

- (a) except with respect to payment defaults, such party materially fails to perform its material obligations under this Agreement and such nonperformance is not remedied within thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice thereof, provided that if the breach is of such a nature that it cannot be cured within thirty (30) days, then such party shall not be in Default so long as it commences to cure within such period of time and thereafter diligently and continuously pursues such cure to completion; or
- (b) such party fails to make any payment under this Agreement when due and such failure is not remedied within ten (10) days after receipt of written notice thereof.

Upon the occurrence of a Default and subject to the applicable notice and cure periods and Section 8.2 below: (i) the aggrieved party may terminate or suspend the applicable Services affected by such uncured Default, and (ii) with respect to Licensed Software and/or Rented Equipment, MetTel may terminate the applicable Product. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Customer understands and agrees that Customer cannot terminate Customer's payment obligations with respect to Software or Equipment in a Schedule, which obligations are more specifically addressed in Section 17 relating to Software and Section 18 relating to Equipment prior to the end of the applicable Initial Term for any reason. The foregoing shall be in addition to any other rights and remedies that MetTel may have under this Agreement or at law, in equity or otherwise.

8.2. Effect of Termination. If Customer discontinues any Service before the expiration of the applicable Initial Term or applicable Additional Term, or if MetTel terminates this Agreement or any Service for Customer's Default, Customer will be liable to MetTel for termination charges equal to the monthly recurring charges for the applicable discontinued Services, multiplied by the number of months remaining in the Term, plus any charges MetTel incurs from third parties because of Customer's early termination of the applicable Services and for any charges that may have been waived. Customer must give MetTel prior written notice of any Service termination (using MetTel standard forms), and, in addition to the amounts set forth above, will be responsible for all charges for such Service up to the date such Service is disconnected, as well as any charges in connection with the termination. Additionally, if MetTel terminates Service, Licensed Software and/or Rented Equipment for Customer's Default, and/or Customer is in default under any Schedule, and/or any Service is discontinued before the expiration of the applicable Initial Term or applicable Additional Term without contracting for a replacement Service where any Licensed Software and/or Rented Equipment, as applicable, utilized in connection with the discontinued Service will be redeployed, in addition to the amounts set forth above, Customer will pay MetTel an amount equal to (a) any Monthly Licensed Software Charges (as established by Section 17 below), multiplied by the number of months remaining in the applicable Term, discounted at 3% per annum, related to any Licensed Software utilized in connection with the discontinued Service, plus (b) any Monthly Equipment Rental Charges (as established by Section 18 below), multiplied by the number of months remaining in the applicable Term, discounted at 3% per annum, relating to any Rented Equipment utilized in connection with the discontinued Service, plus (c) any applicable taxes; and Customer will be required to return any Rented Equipment and any other equipment supplied by MetTel in connection with the discontinued Service to the location designated by MetTel (at Customer's expense) in good working condition and free from all liens, charges and encumbrances within 10 days after termination of the Service for which it was used or of this Agreement, or Customer will pay MetTel's purchase price for the equipment as invoiced by MetTel. If MetTel assigned the Rented Equipment and right to receive Monthly Equipment Rental Charges and/or Monthly Licensed Software Charges to a third-party for financing purposes, then the assignee may exercise any of MetTel's rights and remedies independently from MetTel.

9. INTERNET & IP VOICE SERVICES DISCLOSURE.

9.1. 911 Disclosure. The Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") requires MetTel to obtain Customer's acknowledgement that it has received the following disclosures regarding possible circumstances that COULD IMPAIR YOUR ABILITY TO ACCESS E911

SERVICE: (1) if you utilize equipment that relies on electricity, you will lose E911 service (and service generally) if such devices lose access to electricity such as in a power failure. To reduce the risk of disruption, Customer should deploy a back-up power supply to operate phones and related equipment; (2) if you move your location you must notify us at least 30 days in advance so that we may program the correct information into the E911 system. Otherwise, the E911 system will not contain your correct information; (3) you may be unable to complete calls to 911 or otherwise in the event of network failures or congestion; (4) if you obtain telephone numbers that are not associated with your calling area, you may not be able to reach E911 services; (5) you must notify MetTel of any change in your designated key personnel for E911 notifications, otherwise notifications that an end-user has placed a 911 call will not be deliverable. By executing this Agreement, Customer acknowledges that it understands and accepts the above limitations, and that it will convey these limitations to all persons who may have occasion to use the Services. 9.2. VoIP 911 Service and Acknowledgement. Please read the VoIP Schedule on the MetTel website at <http://www.mettel.net/company/voip-911.html> which is incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this agreement. If you are subscribing to VoIP Service (hosted PBX, VoIP or SIP Trunking), Customer (you) agree to the terms of the VoIP Schedule and further agree that: (1) you have received and have read and understood the terms and conditions relating to VoIP Service, including 9-1-1 service; (2) you and all users of your Service understand the nature and limits of 9-1-1 service associated with VoIP; and (3) if you change the location in which you use Service in any way, including operating Service outside of the address that you have given to MetTel, you must immediately contact MetTel, and that failure to do so may adversely affect your 9-1-1 service.

9.3. Alarm Systems and Internet Voice Application Disclosure. Please view additional important disclosures at our Policies URL concerning interoperability of VoIP and POTS replacement products with alarms systems and other legacy equipment.

10. NOTICES. Notices under this Agreement shall be sent to MetTel, Legal Department, 101 Crawfords Corner Road, Suite 4-311, Holmdel, NJ, 07733, and to Customer at the above address. Either Party may change their mailing and/or billing address by written notice in accordance with this Section. Notices may be sent by first-class U.S. mail, postage prepaid, certified, return receipt requested, or by an overnight carrier, and shall be deemed effective five (5) business days after mailing by first-class U.S. mail, one (1) business day after mailing by an overnight carrier or upon receipt.

11. MISCELLANEOUS. MetTel may perform its obligations under this Agreement through its affiliates, agents, suppliers or subcontractors (the "MetTel Providers"), but MetTel shall not be relieved of its obligations by using the MetTel Providers. MetTel may assign all or part of this Agreement to any of its affiliates or successors. MetTel may assign its rights to payments hereunder, and its rights in the Equipment and Software, to a third party for financing purposes as provided for in the Licensed Software and Equipment Rental Sections below. With reasonable prior notice, Customer may assign this Agreement to any entity that is the successor to substantially all of its assets or business, subject to MetTel's acceptance of the assignee and execution and delivery of MetTel standard assignment forms. All other attempted assignments shall be void without MetTel's prior written consent. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of New York, without regard to its choice of law principles, and the venue for any legal action or litigation involving this Agreement and all proceedings, depositions etc. in such action or litigation shall be held exclusively within New York County and the courts of the State of New York, or the federal courts of the United States of America in New York. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any claim related to Rented Equipment or the payments due under a Schedule and attributable to Rented Equipment shall be governed by the internal laws of the state in which MetTel (or, if such rights to Rented Equipment are assigned, then MetTel's assignee's) principal place of business is located. Any dispute concerning the Rented Equipment or the payments due under a Schedule and attributable to Rented Equipment will be adjudicated in a federal or state court in such state. Customer hereby consents to personal jurisdiction and venue in such courts and waives transfer of venue. Customer and MetTel acknowledge and agree that each party has been represented by independent counsel of its own choosing in the negotiation and execution of this Agreement. Each party agrees that any cause of action or claim will be resolved individually and Customer agrees that it will not consolidate or seek class treatment for any claims in connection with this Agreement, unless previously agreed to in writing by both parties. If any part of this Agreement is rendered invalid or unenforceable, the rest of the Agreement will remain valid and enforceable. Provisions of this Agreement that by their terms or nature must survive expiration or termination of this Agreement, will survive expiration or termination of this Agreement, including, but not limited to Sections 3, 5, 7, 8, 11 – 18 and 20 – 22. Failure to insist on strict performance of any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement will not operate as a waiver thereof or of any subsequent default or failure of performance, and no waiver by either party of any breach shall be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach or as a waiver of the provision itself or any other provision. Purchase orders or other non-MetTel ordering documents relating to Products issued by Customer containing different or additional terms will be construed solely as evidence of Customer's internal business processes and will have no effect on this Agreement or any Products except to the extent evidencing acceptance of a Schedule. If objection is not received by MetTel within three months after an invoice is rendered, the items and charges appearing thereon shall be determined to be correct and binding upon Customer. Customer authorizes MetTel to monitor and record calls to or from MetTel concerning the Services for MetTel's training and quality control purposes.

12. TARIFFS, SERVICE PUBLICATIONS, ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement consists of (in order of priority): (i) the terms in the body of this Master Service Agreement ("MSA"), (ii) any attachments incorporated herein by reference (iii) any attachments and Schedules later added to this agreement ((ii) and (iii), collectively, "Attachments") (iv) MetTel product guides, price lists and product use terms (collectively, "Service Publications") and (v) any applicable tariffs ((i) – (v) collectively, the "Agreement"). This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all other representations, understandings or agreements that are not expressed herein, whether oral or written. The rates, terms and conditions that apply pursuant to applicable tariffs are subject to change in accordance with the rules of applicable state regulatory commission and/or Federal Communications Commission. Service Publications are found on the MetTel website (<https://www.mettel.net/about-mettel/legal/tariffs-product-guides/>) as of the date of this Agreement, referred to hereafter as the "Policies URL"), are subject to change from time to time when updated on the MetTel website and are incorporated herein by reference to the extent they do not conflict with the terms of the MSA or any Schedule. Except as otherwise set forth herein, no amendment, waiver or modification of this Agreement shall be valid unless in writing and signed by both parties. Handwritten changes to this Agreement (including without limitation any Attachment) are not valid. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which will be deemed to be an original copy of this Agreement and all of which, when taken together, will be deemed to constitute one and the same agreement.

13. USE OF PRODUCTS. Products purchased under this contract cannot be resold. Customer agrees that it is responsible and accepts full liability for all use of the Products, with or without its permission, and will not resell the Products purchased under this Agreement or distribute/ transfer the Products purchased under this Agreement to any person or entity other than its employees. The Products may not be used for any unlawful, abusive, or fraudulent purpose, in violation of the then-current acceptable use policy ("AUP") located at the Policies URL or another designated url, to support illegal robocalling activity, or in any way that violates or infringes upon the rights of others. Customer agrees to promptly reply, and assist MetTel to reply, to a request from law enforcement or a traceback administrator authorized by USTelecom's Traceback Group for information about suspicious robocalls that have been sent to a downstream provider. Customer shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless MetTel and its affiliates and suppliers and their respective officers, directors, agents, affiliates, and employees from and against any claims, liabilities, losses, costs, or damages, (including legal fees and costs) arising out of any user's use or attempted use of Products. Broadband speed claim(s) represent maximum downstream and/or upstream speed capabilities which may vary and are not guaranteed. Factors including line quality and Customer's distance from the exchange may limit available bandwidth.

14. WARRANTIES. CUSTOMER AGREES THAT THE PRODUCTS ARE PROVIDED ON AN "AS IS" OR "AS AVAILABLE" BASIS, WITH ALL FAULTS, AND THAT METTEL DOES NOT WARRANT THAT THE PRODUCTS WILL BE WITHOUT FAILURE, DELAY, INTERRUPTION, ERROR, DEGRADATION OF QUALITY OR LOSS OF CONTENT, DATA OR INFORMATION, AND SPECIFICALLY DISCLAIMS ANY AND ALL EXPRESS OR IMPLIED WARRANTIES AS TO ANY PRODUCTS, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION ANY IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY, FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, TITLE OR NONINFRINGEMENT OF THIRD PARTY RIGHTS. METTEL IS NOT THE MANUFACTURER OF ANY EQUIPMENT. WITH RESPECT TO METTEL, CUSTOMER PURCHASES OR RENTS THE EQUIPMENT, AS APPLICABLE, "AS IS." EQUIPMENT SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE WARRANTIES, IF ANY, PROVIDED TO CUSTOMER BY THE EQUIPMENT MANUFACTURER. MODIFICATIONS MAY VOID OR OTHERWISE LIMIT ANY WARRANTY APPLICABLE TO THE EQUIPMENT. WITH RESPECT TO SECURITY PRODUCTS INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION CLOUD FIREWALL & SASE, CUSTOMER HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT NO VENDOR CAN ASSURE COMPLETE SECURITY AND NOTHING HEREIN OR ELSEWHERE SHALL BE DEEMED TO IMPLY A SECURITY GUARANTEE OR ASSURANCE.

15. UNAUTHORIZED USAGE. It is understood that MetTel is under no obligation to investigate the authenticity of calls charged to Customer's account and shall not be liable for any fraudulent or unauthorized calls processed by MetTel and billed to Customer's account. Notwithstanding, in the event MetTel discovers or reasonably suspects fraudulent calls are being made, or that the Services are being used in connection with (i) illegal, fraudulent or abusive activity, (ii) activity that places MetTel's (or its providers') network at risk or could subject MetTel (or its providers) to liability to a third party or (iii) in a manner that violates this Agreement, the AUP or infringes the rights of a third party (including without limitation, to support illegal robocalling activity), nothing contained herein shall prohibit MetTel from taking immediate action, without notice to Customer, that is reasonably necessary to prevent such calls or transmissions from taking place, but is under no obligation to do so.

16. HOSTED PRODUCTS. This section applies solely to MetTel-hosted Services, including hosted PBX. MetTel will provide Customer with password-protected access to its hosted Service(s). Passwords are selected by Customer or its end-users, and Customer shall be solely and exclusively responsible for protecting all account passwords and the use and control of access to Customer's account.

17. LICENSED SOFTWARE. This section applies to all SD-WAN services and any other Products listed on a Schedule designated as "Licensed Software" on such Schedule. By Customer's acceptance of the terms of such Schedule, Customer thereby agrees to pay MetTel the monthly amounts set forth on the Schedule relating to the Licensed Software, plus applicable taxes (the "Monthly Licensed Software Charges") for the Initial Term of the applicable Licensed Software. The Initial Term for Licensed Software will commence on the earlier of (i) the date of activation of the Licensed Software, or (ii) ninety (90) days after the date of shipment of the Equipment associated with the Licensed Software (if any). Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, Customer understands and agrees that Customer is unconditionally obligated to pay all Monthly Licensed Software Charges for the applicable Initial Term, and is not entitled to withhold any Monthly Licensed Software Charges or reduce or set-off against any amounts owed relating to the Licensed Software for any reason. Licensed Software cannot be discontinued before the expiration of the applicable Initial Term for any reason. At the conclusion of the Term, Licensed Software and Customer's obligation to pay Monthly Licensed Software Charges relating thereto will automatically terminate without further action required by either party, unless MetTel in its sole discretion allows a limited month to month extension, subject to authorization from the underlying provider. Customer understands that MetTel may assign Customer's payment obligations relating to any Licensed Software to a third-party for financing purposes and that, if assigned, the assignee will have all of MetTel's rights to receive the Monthly Licensed Software Charges, but will not be subject to any claim, defense, or set-off assertable against MetTel or anyone else.

18. RENTED EQUIPMENT. This section applies to any Equipment listed on a Schedule designated as "Rented Equipment" on such Schedule and all Equipment provided under a Schedule for a monthly fee. By Customer's acceptance of the terms of the Schedule, Customer thereby agrees to rent the Rented Equipment and pay MetTel the monthly amounts set forth on the Schedule relating to the rental of the Rented Equipment, plus applicable taxes (the "Monthly Equipment Rental Charges") for the Initial Term designated on the Schedule for the applicable Rented Equipment. The Initial Term for any Rented Equipment will commence on the date the applicable Rented Equipment is delivered or any later date designated by MetTel. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, Customer understands and agrees that Customer is unconditionally obligated to pay all Monthly Equipment Rental Charges for the Initial Term, and is not entitled to withhold Monthly Equipment Rental Charges or reduce or set-off against any amounts owed relating to the rental of the Rented Equipment for any reason. Customer's obligations with respect to Rented Equipment cannot be discontinued before the expiration of the applicable Initial Term for any reason. Customer agrees to keep the Rented Equipment in good working order, use it for business purposes only, not modify or move it from its initial location without MetTel's consent and to keep the Rented Equipment fully insured against loss at its replacement cost, with MetTel named as loss payee, and to provide proof of such insurance satisfactory to MetTel upon MetTel's request. Customer will be responsible for any damage to or loss of the Rented Equipment, and understands that no such loss or damage to the Rented Equipment will relieve Customer from its obligation to make all Monthly Equipment Rental Charges for the entire Initial Term. MetTel owns the Rented Equipment and is authorized to file UCC financing statements to reflect its interest in the Rented Equipment. Customer agrees to pay when due, either directly or by reimbursing MetTel, for all taxes and fees relating to the Rented

Equipment (including, but not limited to, sales or use tax due upfront which will be payable over the Initial Term with a finance charge). Customer's obligations with respect to the Rented Equipment (including, but not limited to, Customer's obligation to pay Monthly Equipment Rental Charges) shall continue on a month to month basis after the end of the Initial Term, or any subsequent Additional Term, unless Customer (A) provides MetTel at least thirty (30) days prior written notice that Customer has determined to return the Rented Equipment at the end of the applicable Initial Term or Additional Term and (B) Customer timely returns the Rented Equipment to the location designated by MetTel, at Customer's expense. If the returned Rented Equipment is not immediately available for use by another customer without need of repair, Customer will reimburse MetTel for all repair costs. Customer understands that MetTel may assign the Rented Equipment and Customer's payment obligations relating to the Rented Equipment to a third-party for financing purposes and that, if assigned, the assignee will have all of MetTel's rights with respect to the Rented Equipment and Customer's payment obligations relating to the Rented Equipment, but will not be subject to any claim, defense, or set-off assertable against MetTel or anyone else. All Schedules, orders or attachments that include equipment are subject to review and approval by MetTel credit, and may require a deposit. Equipment prices do not include shipping charges, which will be the responsibility of Customer. Risk of loss or damage to any Equipment (including portions thereof) and Software passes to Customer on delivery to the freight carrier. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if MetTel and Customer enter into a separate rental or finance agreement relating to any equipment provided by MetTel (an "Equipment Use Agreement"), Customer's obligations with respect to such equipment (payment or otherwise) shall be solely governed by the Equipment Use Agreement, and any modification or termination of this Agreement or the Services shall not operate to modify or relieve Customer from any of Customer's obligations under the Equipment Use Agreement. An Equipment Use Agreement may be required for orders with significant Equipment. Amounts owed MetTel under any Equipment Use Agreement are not included in the charges for the Services, Software or Equipment under this Agreement, though such amounts may be invoiced along with the charges owed by Customer to MetTel under this Agreement for Customer's convenience. Customer agrees to execute and return a Delivery Confirmation statement to MetTel reflecting Rented Equipment received. Each Schedule containing Rented Equipment is (or shall be treated as) a "Finance Lease" as that term is defined in Article 2A of the Uniform Commercial Code ("UCC"). Customer agrees to forgo the rights and remedies provided under sections 507-522 of Article 2A of the UCC with respect to Rented Equipment on a Schedule.

19. INSTALLATIONS. Installation means Service delivery to the demarcation point (the MetTel designated physical interface between the MetTel Service and Customer's telecommunications equipment) which is generally at the MPOE (minimum point of entry). Service, wiring (including extensions of the demarcation point) and equipment for use on Customer's side of the demarcation point are the responsibility of Customer and may be provided by MetTel at an additional cost. Installation does not include buildout or the construction of facilities (if applicable). Cloud-based Services like cloud firewall or SIP call paths are installed and active when the service has been enabled for use in the cloud. Software and Equipment (including Equipment provided in connection with a Service like Starlink) does not include installation except as specified in a Schedule.

20. METTEL SOFTWARE.

(A) Use. The following terms apply to any software application embedded in CDS Products and any software application provided to Customer for use with the Service for which there is not a specified monthly payment provided for in a Schedule including, without limitation, the Bruin portal at app.Bruin.com (including any successor, "Portal"), in each case, provided by or on behalf of MetTel ("MetTel Software"). Subject to compliance with this Agreement, and except where a separate license is provided, MetTel hereby grants to Customer a non-exclusive, non-transferable, non-sublicensable, revocable license to use such MetTel Software in object code form only and solely by Customer for Customer's internal business purposes in connection with the Services during the Term. MetTel Software will be deemed a Service under this Agreement but not subject to a Term unless otherwise identified and provided as a separate Service under a Schedule to this Agreement or embedded in another Product. Customer may not and may not permit others to (i) provide, disclose or make MetTel Software available to any third party, or (ii) copy, decompile, reverse engineer, disassemble, modify, rent, lease, loan, distribute, or create derivative works (as defined by the U.S. Copyright Act) or improvements (as defined by U.S. patent law) from, the MetTel Software or any portion thereof, or otherwise attempt to discover the source code or underlying ideas, algorithms, structure or organization of, or reproduce the design of, the MetTel Software or components thereof. Customer agrees that MetTel Software contains proprietary content, design, information and material that is protected by applicable intellectual property and other laws, including but not limited to copyright, and will not use or permit use of such proprietary content, information or materials in any way whatsoever except for permitted use of the MetTel Software provided under this Section. MetTel reserves the right to modify the Portal or upgrade its online and software-based services from time to time. Customer shall be solely and exclusively responsible for protecting all account passwords and the use and control of access to Customer's account. Except for limited rights to use MetTel Software, no license under patents, copyrights, trademarks, service marks, trade names or other indicia of origins or other right is granted to Customer in the MetTel Software or in MetTel's trademark, copyright, patent, trade secret or other proprietary rights nor shall any such rights be implied or arise by estoppel with respect to any transactions contemplated under this Agreement.

(B) Feedback. Customer or its employees may communicate to MetTel suggested modifications, design changes, or improvements to the MetTel Software ("Feedback"). Customer agrees that MetTel will have any and all rights and interests in any Feedback without the payment of any consideration, and that any Feedback will be considered Confidential Information.

21. CUSTOMER PROPRIETARY NETWORK INFORMATION ("CPNI"). Pursuant to federal law, CPNI is (A) information that relates to the quantity, technical configuration, type, destination, location, and amount of use of a telecommunications service subscribed to by Customer, and that is made available to MetTel by Customer solely by virtue of the carrier-customer relationship; and (B) information contained in the bills pertaining to telephone service received by Customer. MetTel will not use, disclose, or permit access to Customer's CPNI except in its provision of services from which such information is derived, or as authorized or required by federal law, or as expressly authorized by Customer. To protect customers' CPNI from inappropriate disclosure to unauthorized third parties, MetTel has implemented strict safeguards that restrict the ability of MetTel representatives to disclose certain information to or permit certain changes to accounts by inbound callers or visitors to MetTel's offices and that regulate MetTel's ability to provide customers with account access over online portals. The FCC permits business customers and their telephone service providers to agree to flexible customer authentication methods that are suited to an efficient business relationship. Customer hereby agrees that its MetTel dedicated account representative and MetTel customer support personnel who are responsible for commercial accounts may disclose Customer CPNI or make changes to Customer's account at the request of persons that they reasonably believe to be Customer's authorized representatives and that MetTel may provide

online access to Customer CPNI via the Portal or in any commercially reasonable manner, and that third parties authorized in writing to MetTel may have access to Customer's CPNI. Customer may at any time contact its dedicated account representative to request access to its CPNI. Customer hereby authorizes MetTel to share Customer CPNI with Customer's agents and employees as though such persons were the Customer hereunder; such authorization may be withdrawn as to any person or entity at any time upon written notice to MetTel. Customer agrees that MetTel may share CPNI with its affiliates, agents, and partners relating to business operations, and with businesses acting on MetTel's behalf, to determine if Customer could benefit from the wide variety of MetTel and Affiliate, agent, partner products and services, and in its marketing and sales activities. Customer may withdraw its authorization at any time by informing MetTel in writing. Customer's decision regarding MetTel's use of CPNI will not affect the quality of Service MetTel provides to Customer.

22. FIXED-RATE SERVICES. For purposes of this Agreement, "Fixed-Rate Services" means Services for which MetTel's underlying rates and charges do not change during the applicable Term. Rates, discounts and terms for any Services for which MetTel's underlying costs from the underlying carrier change are subject to change from time to time, subject to any applicable tariffs.

23. PRIVATE LINE / MPLS. Where Customer is ordering private line or MPLS service from MetTel, the end points for which are located in the same state, Customer agrees that MetTel will classify such services as jurisdictionally interstate and pass through applicable taxes and surcharges accordingly, such as the federal Universal Service Fund surcharge, unless by checking this box [Initials _____] Customer warrants and certifies that ten percent (10%) or less of the traffic across each such service is and will be interstate. Under FCC rules, it is the nature of the traffic itself, and not the physical endpoints of the facility provided by MetTel, that determines jurisdiction. For example, Internet traffic is interstate when used to connect to content delivered from a different state or country. Customer shall notify MetTel within 15 days if the foregoing certification is no longer valid.

24. LEGAL AND REGULATORY CHANGES. If any law, regulation or other action of a government authority (collectively a "Government Action") after the Effective Date affects the charges or allocation or collection of costs under this Agreement, the parties agree that MetTel may adjust the charges under this Agreement to conform to such Government Action while collecting the same charges that would have been collected absent the Government Action.

25. SUNSET AND TECHNOLOGY TRANSITION. MetTel will not sunset any Services during the Term without providing Customer at least 30 days prior written notice or, if longer, such period required by applicable law, prior to the sunset date and will continue to provide the sunseting Services at the rate provided in this Agreement through the sunset date, after which such Services will be disconnected. No Service disconnected in connection with a sunset by MetTel will incur termination charges. Customer may elect to terminate the sunseting Services at any time during the period preceding the sunset date, at which time MetTel will provide reasonable assistance in coordinating cutover to Services provided by other carriers. In addition, MetTel may transition Products to alternatives providing substantially similar functionality provided the aggregate monthly recurring charges for the new Products are not greater than such charges for the Product being replaced. Such replacements will not be a sunset within the meaning of this Section.

26. CREDIT REVIEW. Service acceptance by MetTel is subject to MetTel's initial and continuing credit approval procedures and policies. MetTel reserves the right to withhold initiation or full implementation of any or all Services or delivery of any equipment under this Agreement pending MetTel's satisfactory review and approval thereof which may be conditioned upon terms specified by MetTel, including but not limited to security for payments due hereunder.

27. TECHNOLOGY MIGRATION. Customer has retained MetTel to assist with technology migration and replacement of its TDM voice Services such as POTS, Centrex, PRI and BRI (collectively, "Legacy Services") with new technology. As such, Customer agrees and hereby requests that wherever reasonably possible MetTel replace any Legacy Services provided under this Agreement with alternate Products (including without limitation, Services using Voice over IP) providing substantially similar functionality, provided in each case that the aggregate monthly recurring charges for the replacement Products (excluding taxes and surcharges) are not greater than such charges for the replaced Legacy Service, and that such charges will not be increased over a new thirty-six month Initial Term that the parties agree will begin upon activation of the replacement Product ("Replacement Product"). Upon either party's request the parties will prepare and execute a Schedule setting forth the Replacement Product and will work in good faith to complete conversion to the Replacement Product, including without limitation, by providing site access to complete the installation.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have caused this Agreement to be executed by their respective duly authorized officers, each copy of which will for all purposes be deemed to be an original.

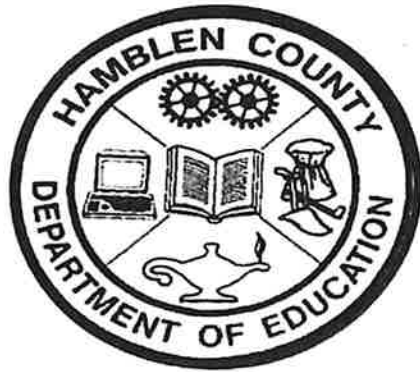

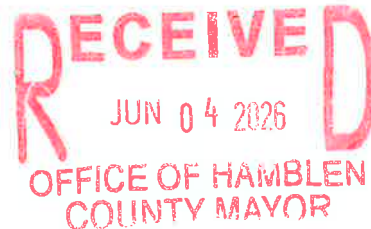

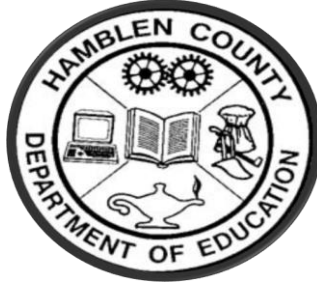

ARTICLE III

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS AND MINIMUM STANDARDS OF DESIGN

A. Streets

1. Conformity to the Major Road Plan: The location and width of all streets and roads shall conform to the official major road plan adopted by the Hamblen County Planning Commission.
2. Relation to Adjoining Street System: The proposed street system shall extend existing streets and projects. They shall be extended at a width no less than the required minimum width as set forth in this article or the width of the existing street or road, whichever is greater.
3. Access Streets to Subdivision Boundaries: Sufficient access streets or right-of-way to adjoining properties shall, at the discretion of the Planning Commission, be provided in subdivisions to permit harmonious development to the area.
4. Street Right-of-Way Widths: The minimum width of right-of-way, measured from lot line to lot line, shall be as shown on the major road plan, or if not shown on such plan shall be not less than as follows:

- a. Major Collector Streets: 50 feet
- b. Minor Collector Streets: 50 feet

(Collector streets are those which carry traffic from minor streets to the major system of arterial streets and highways and include the principal entrance streets of a residential development and streets for major circulation within such a development.)

- c. Minor Residential Streets: 50 feet

(Minor streets are those which are used primarily for access to the abutting residential properties and designed to discourage their use by through traffic.)

- d. Cul-de-Sac Streets: 40 feet

(Cul-de-sacs are permanent dead-end streets or courts designed so that they cannot be extended in the future.)

- e. Dead-end Streets: Not allowed

(Dead-end streets are similar to cul-de-sacs except that they provide no turnaround circle at their closed end and are not permitted as streets in any proposed subdivision. Stub streets planned for future continuation are not considered to be dead-end streets.)

- f. Marginal Access Streets: 40 feet

(Marginal access streets are minor streets, which are parallel to and adjacent to arterial streets and highways; and which provide access to abutting properties and protection from through traffic.)

- g. Alleys: 25 feet

(Alleys are minor public ways used primarily for service access to the back or side of properties otherwise abutting on a street. In cases where topography or other physical conditions make a street of the required minimum width impracticable, the Planning Commission may modify the above requirements. Through proposed neighborhood or local business areas, the street right-of-way width shall be increased ten (10) feet on each side to provide for movement of vehicle into and out of necessary off-street parking areas without interference to traffic.)

5. Additional Right-of-Way Width on Existing Streets:

(Subdivisions that adjoin existing streets shall dedicate additional right-of-way to meet the above minimum street width requirements.)

- a. The entire right-of-way shall be provided where any part of the subdivision is on both sides of the existing street.
- b. When the subdivision is located on only one side of the existing street, one-half of the required right-of-way, measured from the center-line of the existing roadway, shall be provided.

6. Restriction of Access: Where a subdivision abuts or contains an existing or proposed major street, the Planning Commission may require marginal access streets, reverse frontage with screen planting contained in a non-access reservation along the rear property line, or such other treatment as may be necessary for adequate protection of residential properties to afford separation of through and local traffic.

7. Street Grades:

- a. Arterial Maximum Grade: (The maximum grade on arterial streets shall not exceed six (6) percent.)
- b. Major Collector Maximum Grade: (The maximum grade on major collector streets shall not exceed eight (8) percent.)
- c. Minor Collector and Minor Residential Streets, Maximum Grade: (The maximum grade on minor collector streets, minor residential streets, and cui-de-sacs shall not exceed sixteen (16) percent.)

8. Horizontal Curves: Where a deflection angle of more than ten (10) degrees in the alignment of a street occurs, a curve of reasonably long radius shall be introduced. On streets sixty (60) feet or more in width, the center line radius of curvature shall be not less than three hundred (300) feet; on other streets, not less than one hundred (100) feet.

9. Vertical Curves: All changes in grade shall be connected by vertical curves of minimum length for other streets. Profiles of all streets showing natural and finished grades drawn to a scale of not less than one (1) inch equals one hundred (100) feet horizontal, and one (1) inch equals ten (10) feet vertical, may be required by the Planning Commission.
10. Intersections: Street intersections shall be as nearly at right angles as is possible, and no intersection shall be at an angle of less than sixty (60) degrees. Property line radii at street intersections shall not be less than twenty (20) feet, and where the angle of street intersection is less than seventy-five (75) degrees, the Commission may require a greater curb radius, having a desirable radius without curtailing the sidewalk at a street corner to less than normal width, the property line at such street corner shall be rounded or otherwise set back sufficiently to permit such construction.

At grade intersections shall be located to provide adequate sight distance as follows:

- a. Major streets (arterial streets and highways and major collectors): minimum sight distance of six hundred (600) feet, measured between points five (5) feet above center line of roadway.
- b. Minor collector streets: minimum sight distance of four hundred (400) feet, measured between points five (5) feet above the center line of roadway.
- c. Other minor streets (local streets, marginal access streets, and cui-de-sacs): minimum sight distance of two hundred and fifty (250) feet, measured between points five (5) feet above center line of roadway.

The Planning Commission may, when it deems necessary to do so in the interest of public safety, increase sight distance requirements or reduce sight distance requirements because of topographic characteristics.

11. Tangents: Reverse curves in road right-of-way shall be connected by tangents of not less than one hundred (100) feet in length for major streets, seventy-five (75) feet for minor collector streets, and fifty (50) feet for other minor streets.
12. Street Jogs: Street jogs with center line offsets of less than one hundred twenty-five (125) feet shall not be allowed.
13. Cul-de-Sac Streets: Cui-de-sacs shall not be longer than one thousand (1,000) feet, measured along the center line from the entrance street right of way to the center of the tum-around. The cul-de-sac tum-around shall have a right-of-way radius of fifty (50) feet and a roadway radius of forty (40) feet. It shall also have a transition curve radius of not less than seventy-five (75) feet to connect the tum-around with the end of the street. The length and design of the cul-de-sac may be varied by the planning commission due to topographical conditions.
14. Temporary Dead-End Streets: Where in the opinion of the Planning Commission, it is desirable to provide for street access to adjoining property, proposed streets shall be extended by dedication to the boundary of such property. Such dead-end streets shall be

provided with a temporary turn-around having a roadway diameter of at least eighty (80) feet.

15. Private Streets and Reserve Strips: There shall be no private streets platted in any subdivision. Every lot in the subdivided property shall be served from a publicly dedicated street. There shall be no reserve strips controlling access to streets, except where the control of such strips is definitely placed with the community under conditions approved by the Planning Commission.
16. Street Names: Proposed streets, which obviously in alignment with others already exist and named, shall bear the names of the existing streets. In no case shall the name for proposed streets duplicate existing street names, irrespective of the use of the Suffix Street, avenue, boulevard, driveway, place or court. The Planning Commission can assist the sub divider in avoiding duplication.
17. Alleys: Alleys shall be provided to the rear of all lots used for business purposes, and shall not be provided in residential blocks except where the sub divider produces evidence satisfactory to the Planning Commission of the need for alleys.
18. Surface Drainage: All streets and roads must be so designed as to provide for the discharge of surface water from the right-of-way of all streets and roads by grading and drainage as shall be approved by the Planning Commission. Where it is the opinion of the Planning Commission that water cannot be adequately discharged by surface drainage, the Planning Commission may require the installation of a storm water system.

B. Blocks

1. Length: Blocks shall not be less than four hundred (400) feet nor more than twelve hundred (1200) feet in length, except as the Planning Commission considers necessary to secure efficient use of land or desired features of street pattern.
2. Width: blocks shall be wide enough to allow two (2) rows of lots, except where reverse frontage on major streets and roads is provided or where prevented by topographical conditions or size of the property; in which case, the Planning Commission may approve a single row of lots of minimum depth.

C. Lots

1. Arrangement: Insofar as practical, side lot lines shall be at right angles to straight street lines or radio t curved street lines. Each lot must front for a minimum of fifty (50) feet upon a public street or road, this width to be maintained continually from street upon reaching the building setback line, except in special instances, such as cui- de-sacs; in which case each lot must have frontage of at least forty (40) feet. In the event that a parcel or tract of land has less than one hundred (100) feet, but eighty (80) or more feet frontage on a public street or road and is therefore incapable of being subdivided under these regulations then, and in that event, a subdivision of such parcel of land will be allowed so long as each of the remaining lots, after subdivision, has at least forty (40) feet

1-101 General provisions

- (1) Purpose. It is the purpose of this chapter to:
 - a. Protect, maintain, and enhance the environment of Hamblen County and the public health, safety and the general welfare of the citizens of the County, by controlling discharges of pollutants to the County's stormwater system and to maintain and improve the quality of the receiving waters into which the stormwater outfalls flow, including, without limitation, lakes, rivers, streams, ponds, wetlands, and groundwater of the County;
 - b. Enable Hamblen County to comply with the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System permit (NPDES) and applicable regulations, 40 CFR § 122 as applicable for stormwater discharges;
 - c. Allow the County to exercise the powers granted in Tennessee Code Annotated § 68-221-1105, which provides that, among other powers cities have with respect to stormwater facilities, is the power by resolution to:
 - i. Exercise general regulation over the planning, location, construction, and operation and maintenance of stormwater facilities in the County, whether or not owned and operated by the County;
 - ii. Adopt any rules and regulations deemed necessary to accomplish the purposes of this statute, including the adoption of a system of fees for services and permits;
 - iii. Establish standards to regulate the quantity of stormwater discharged and to regulate stormwater contaminants as may be necessary to protect water quality;

- iv. Review and approve plans and plats for stormwater management in proposed subdivisions or commercial developments;
- v. Issue permits for stormwater discharges, or for the construction, alteration, extension, or repair of stormwater facilities;
- vi. Suspend or revoke permits when it is determined that the permittee has violated any applicable ordinance, resolution, or condition of the permit;
- vii. Regulate and prohibit discharges into stormwater facilities of sanitary, industrial, or commercial sewage or waters that have otherwise been contaminated; and
- viii. Expend funds to remediate or mitigate the detrimental effects of contaminated land or other sources of stormwater contamination, whether public or private.

(2) Administering entity. Hamblen County shall administer the provisions of this chapter.

(3) Stormwater management resolution. The intended purpose of this resolution is to safeguard property and public welfare by regulating stormwater drainage and requiring temporary and permanent provisions for its control. It should be used as a planning and engineering tool for permit compliance and to facilitate the necessary control of stormwater.

1-102. Definitions. For the purpose of this chapter, the following definitions shall apply:

Words used in the singular shall include the plural, and the plural shall include the singular; words used in the present tense shall include the future tense. The word “shall” is mandatory and not discretionary. The word “may” is permissive. Words not defined in this section shall be construed to have the meaning given by common and ordinary use as defined in the latest edition of Webster’s Dictionary.

1. **Administrative or Civil Penalties** - Under the authority provided in Tennessee Code Annotated § 68-221-1106, Hamblen County declares that any person violating the provisions of this chapter may be assessed a civil penalty by the County of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and not more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) per day for each day of violation. Each day of violation shall constitute a separate violation.
2. **Analytical monitoring-Test Procedures for the Analysis of Pollutants** - Test procedures for the analysis of pollutants shall conform to regulations published pursuant to Section 304 (h) of the Clean Water Act (the "Act"), as amended, under which such procedures may be required. Pollutant parameters shall be determined using sufficiently sensitive methods in Title 40 C.F.R. § 136, as amended, and promulgated pursuant to Section 304 (h) of the Act. The chosen methods must be sufficiently sensitive as required in state rule 0400-40-03-.05(8).
3. **Aquatic Resource Alteration Permit (ARAP)** physical alterations to properties of the waters of the state require an ARAP or a §401 Water Quality Certification (§401 certification). ARAP means a permit issued pursuant to T.C.A. § 69-3-108 of the Act, which authorizes the alteration of properties of waters of the state that result from activities other than discharges of wastewater through a pipe, ditch, or other conveyance.

4. **As built plans (record drawings)** mean drawings depicting conditions as they were actually constructed.
5. **Best Management Practices (“BMPs”)** means schedules of activities, prohibitions of practices, maintenance procedures and other management practices to prevent or reduce the discharge of pollutants to waters of the state. BMPs also include treatment requirements, operating procedures; and practices to control plant site runoff, spillage, leaks, sludge or waste disposal, or drainage from raw material storage. BMPs include source control practices (non-structural BMPs), and engineered structures designed to treat runoff.
 - Structural BMPs are facilities that help prevent pollutants in stormwater runoff from leaving the site.
 - Non-structural BMPs are techniques, activities and processes that reduce pollutants at the source.
6. **BMP Manual** provides technical guidance including additional policies, criteria, standards, specifications, constants, and information for the proper implementation of the requirements of the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System permit (NPDES) and applicable regulations, 40 CFR § 122 as applicable for stormwater discharges.
7. **Borrow Pit** is an excavation from which erodible material (typically soil) is removed to be fill for another site. There is no processing or separation of erodible material conducted at the site. Given the nature of activity and pollutants present at such excavation, a borrow pit is considered a construction activity.
8. **Buffer Zone or Water Quality Riparian Buffer** is a permanent strip of natural perennial vegetation, adjacent to a stream, river, wetland, pond, or lake that contains dense vegetation made up of grass, shrubs, and/or trees. The purpose of a water quality riparian buffer is to maintain existing water quality by minimizing risk of any potential sediments, nutrients or other pollutants reaching adjacent surface waters and to further prevent negative water quality impacts by providing canopy over adjacent waters. Stream buffers are measured from the top of bank, not the centerline on the stream.
9. **Channel** means a natural or artificial watercourse with a definite bed and banks that conveys continuously or periodically flowing water.
10. **Clearing** refers to removal of vegetation and disturbance of soil prior to grading or excavation in anticipation of construction activities. Clearing may also refer to wide area land disturbance in anticipation of non-construction activities. Clearing, grading, and excavation do not refer to clearing of vegetation along existing or new roadways, highways, dams, or power lines for sight distance or other maintenance and/or safety concerns, or cold planing, milling, and/or removal of concrete and/or bituminous asphalt roadway pavement surfaces. The clearing of land for agricultural purposes is exempt from federal stormwater NPDES permitting in accordance with Section 401(1)(1) of the 1987 Water Quality Act and state stormwater NPDES permitting in accordance with the Tennessee Water Quality Control Act of 1977 (T.C.A. 69-3-101 et seq.).
11. **Commencement of construction:** the initial disturbance of soils associated with clearing, grading, excavating or other construction activities.

12. **Common plan of development or sale** is broadly defined as any announcement or documentation (including a sign, public notice or hearing, sales pitch, advertisement, drawing, permit application, zoning request, computer design, etc.) or physical demarcation (including boundary signs, lot stakes, surveyor markings, etc.) indicating construction activities may occur on a specific plot. A common plan of development or sale identifies a situation in which multiple areas of disturbance are occurring on contiguous areas. This applies because the activities may take place at different times, on different schedules, by different operators.
13. **Control measure** refers to any Best Management Practice (BMP) or other method used to prevent or reduce the discharge of pollutants to waters of the state.
14. **CWA** means the Clean Water Act of 1977 or the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1251, et seq.)
15. **Design storm** is a storm event as defined by Precipitation-Frequency Atlas of the United States. Atlas 14. Volume 2. Version 3.0. U.S. Department of Commerce. National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), National Weather Service, Hydrometeorological Design Studies Center, Silver Springs, Maryland or its digital product equivalent. The estimated design rainfall amounts, for any return period interval (i.e., 1-yr, 2-yr, 5-yr, 25-yr, etc.,) in terms of either depths or intensities for any duration, can be found by accessing the data available at https://hdsc.nws.noaa.gov/hdsc/pfds/pfds_map_cont.html . The design storm events for Hamblen County are:

16. **Discharge or discharge of a pollutant** refers to the addition of pollutants to waters from a source.
17. **Ecoregion** is a relatively homogeneous area defined by similarity of climate, landform, soil, potential natural vegetation, hydrology, or other ecologically relevant variables. Ecoregions can be determined for specific stream segments by using Tennessee's Online Water Quality Assessment Data viewer <http://tdeconline.tn.gov/dwr>.
18. **Exceptional Tennessee Waters** are surface waters designated by the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation as having the characteristics set forth at Tennessee Rules, Chapter 0400-40-03-.06(4). Characteristics include waters within parks or refuges; scenic rivers; waters with threatened or endangered species; waters that provide specialized recreational opportunities; waters within areas designated as lands unsuitable for mining; waters with naturally reproducing trout; waters with exceptional biological diversity and other waters with outstanding ecological or recreational value.
19. **Hot spot** means an area where land use or activities generate highly contaminated runoff, with concentrations of pollutants in excess of those typically found in stormwater. Examples might include operations producing concrete or asphalt, auto repair shops, auto supply shops, large commercial parking areas and restaurants.

20. **Improved sinkhole** is a natural surface depression that has been altered in order to direct fluids into the hole opening. Improved sinkhole is a type of injection well regulated under the Underground Injection Control (UIC) program of the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation. Underground injection constitutes an intentional disposal of waste waters in natural depressions, open fractures and crevices, such as those commonly associated with weathering of limestone. More information regarding an Underground Injection Control Permit can be found on TDEC's DWR webpage at <https://www.tn.gov/content/tn/environment/permit-permits/water-permits1/underground-injection-control-permit.html>
21. **Level 1** - Fundamentals of Erosion Prevention and Sediment Control training and certification program administered by University of Tennessee Water Resources Research Center (<https://tnepsc.org/index.asp>).
22. **Level 2** - Design Principles for Erosion Prevention and Sediment Control for Construction Sites training and certification program administered by University of Tennessee Water Resources Research Center (<https://tnepsc.org/index.asp>).
23. **Linear Project** is a land disturbing activity as conducted by an underground/overhead utility or highway department, including, but not limited to, any cable line or wire for the transmission of electrical energy; any conveyance pipeline for transportation of gaseous or liquid substance; any cable line or wire for communications; or any other energy resource transmission ROW or utility infrastructure, e.g., roads and highways. Activities include the construction and installation of these utilities within a corridor. Linear project activities also include the construction of access roads, staging areas and borrow/spoil sites associated with the linear project. Land disturbance specific to the development of residential and commercial subdivisions is not considered a linear project.
24. **Monitoring** refers to tracking or measuring activities, progress, results, etc., and can refer to non-analytical monitoring for pollutants by means other than 40 C.F.R. § 136 (and other than state- or federally established protocols in the case of biological monitoring and assessments), such as visually or by qualitative tools that provide comparative values or rough estimates.
25. **Municipality** means any incorporated County or town, county, metropolitan or consolidated government, or special district of this state empowered to provide storm water facilities.
26. **Operator** means any person who owns, leases, operates, controls, or supervises a source. Including, but not limited to, an owner or operator of any "facility or activity" subject to regulation under the NPDES program.
27. **Permanent Stabilization** means that all soil disturbing activities at the site have been completed and one of the three following criteria is met:
- A perennial, preferably native, vegetative cover with a uniform (i.e., evenly distributed, without large bare areas) density of at least 70 percent has been established on all unpaved areas and areas not covered by permanent structures, and all slopes and channels have been permanently stabilized against erosion.

- Equivalent permanent stabilization measures such as the use of riprap; permanent geotextiles; hardened surface materials including concrete, asphalt, gabion baskets have been employed.
 - For construction projects on land used for agricultural or silvicultural purposes, permanent stabilization may be accomplished by returning the disturbed land to its preconstruction agricultural or silvicultural use.
28. **Point source** (or Outfall) means any discernible, confined, and discrete conveyance, including but not limited to, any pipe, ditch, channel, tunnel, conduit, well, discrete fissure, container, rolling stock, concentrated animal feeding operation, landfill leachate collection system, vessel or other floating craft from which pollutants are or may be discharged. This term does not include introduction of pollutants from non-point source agricultural and silvicultural activities, including stormwater runoff from orchards, cultivated crops, pastures, range lands, forest lands or return flows from irrigated agriculture or agricultural stormwater runoff. In short, outfall is a point where runoff leaves the site as a concentrated flow in a discrete conveyance.
29. **Pollutant** means sewage, industrial wastes, or other wastes.
30. **Priority Construction** means those construction activities discharging directly into, or immediately upstream of, waters the state recognized as impaired for siltation or Exceptional Tennessee Waters.
31. A **rainfall event** is defined as any occurrence of rain preceded by 10 hours without precipitation that results in an accumulation of 0.01 inches or more. Instances of rainfall occurring within 10 hours of each other will be considered a single rainfall event.
32. **Registered Engineer and Registered Landscape Architect** An engineer or landscape architect certified and registered by the State Board of Architectural and Engineer Examiners pursuant to Section 62-202, Tennessee Code Annotated, to practice in Tennessee.
33. **Runoff coefficient** means the fraction of total rainfall that will appear at the conveyance as runoff. Runoff coefficient is also defined as the ratio of the amount of water that is not absorbed by the surface to the total amount of water that falls during a rainstorm.
34. **Sediment** means solid material, both inorganic (mineral) and organic, that is in suspension, is being transported; or has been moved from the site of origin by wind, water, gravity or ice as a product of erosion.
35. **Sediment basin** A temporary basin consisting of an embankment constructed across a wet weather conveyance, an excavation that creates a basin or by a combination of both. A sediment basin typically consists of a forebay cell, impoundment, permanent pool, primary spillway, secondary or emergency spillway and surface dewatering device. The size and shape of the basin depends on the location, size of drainage area, incoming runoff volume and peak flow, soil type and particle size, land cover, and receiving stream classification (i.e., waters with unavailable parameters, Exceptional TN Waters, or waters with available parameters).
36. **Sedimentation** means the action or process of forming or depositing sediment.

37. **Significant Contributor** is defined as a source of pollutants where the volume, concentration, or mass of a pollutant in a stormwater discharge can cause or threaten to cause pollution, contamination, or nuisance that adversely impact human health or the environment and cause or contribute to a violation of any applicable water quality standards for receiving water.
38. **Soil or Topsoil** means the unconsolidated mineral and organic material on the immediate surface of the earth that serves as a natural medium for the growth of plants.
39. **Steep Slope or Steep Grade** means a natural or created slope of 35% grade or greater.
40. **Stormwater** means rainfall runoff, snow melt runoff, and surface runoff and drainage.
41. **Stormwater control measure or SCM** means permanent practices and measures designed to reduce the discharge of pollutants from new development projects or redevelopment projects.
42. **Stream** as defined by TCA 69-3-103(38) "stream" means a surface water that is not a wet weather conveyance.
43. **Stormwater associated with industrial activity** is defined in 40 C.F.R. 122.26(b)(14) and incorporated here by reference. Most relevant to the County is 40 C.F.R. 122.26(b)(14)(x), which relates to construction activity including clearing, grubbing, grading, filling and excavation activities, including borrow pits containing erodible material. Disturbance of soil for the purpose of crop production is exempt from NPDES permit requirements, but stormwater discharges from agriculture-related activities that involve construction of structures (e.g., barn construction, road construction, pond construction) are considered associated with industrial (construction) activity. Maintenance to the original line and grade, hydraulic capacity; or to the original purpose of the facility (e.g., re-clearing, minor excavation performed around an existing structure necessary for maintenance or repair and repaving of an existing road) is not considered a construction activity.
44. Construction **Stormwater discharge-related activities** means activities that cause, contribute to or result in point source stormwater pollutant discharges. These activities may include excavation, site development, grading and other surface disturbance activities; and activities to control stormwater including the siting, construction and operation of best management practices (BMPs).
45. **Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP)** is a written site-specific plan required by the Tennessee Construction General Permit (CGP) that includes a narrative pollution prevention plan and graphical erosion and sediment control plan. In its basic form, the plan contains a site map, a description of construction activities that could introduce pollutants to stormwater runoff, a description of measures or practices to control these pollutants, and erosion and sediment control plans and specifications. The SWPPP should be prepared in accordance with the Tennessee Erosion and Sediment Control Handbook (latest edition).
46. **Take of an endangered species** means to harass, harm, pursue, hunt, shoot, wound, kill, trap, capture or collect, or attempt to engage in any such conduct.

47. **Tennessee Erosion and Sediment Control Handbook** is a guidance issued by the Division of Water Resources for the purpose of developing Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plans and Erosion and Sediment Control Plans required by the Construction General Permit CGP.
48. **Temporary stabilization** is achieved when vegetation or non-erodible surface has been established on the area of disturbance and construction activity has temporarily ceased. Under certain conditions, temporary stabilization is required when construction activities temporarily cease.
49. **Treatment chemicals** are polymers, flocculants or other chemicals used to reduce turbidity in stormwater discharges by chemically bonding to suspended silts and other soil materials and causing them to bind together and settle out. Common examples of anionic treatment chemicals are **polyacrylamide-chitosan (PAM-CS)**.
50. **Turbidity** is the cloudiness or haziness of a fluid caused by individual particles (suspended solids) that are generally invisible to the naked eye, similar to smoke in air.
51. **Urban Area** is the designated area within the County, which is determined by the latest decennial census by the United States Census Bureau. An updated map is kept in the Planning and Codes Department office and can be found on the department website.
52. **Waste site** is an area where material from a construction site is disposed of. When the material is erodible, such as soil, the site must be treated as a construction site.
53. **Waters** (or waters of the state) means any and all water, public or private, on or beneath the surface of the ground, which are contained within, flow through, or border upon Tennessee or any portion thereof, except those bodies of water confined to and retained within the limits of private property in single ownership which do not combine or effect a junction with natural surface or underground waters.
54. **Waters with unavailable parameters** means any segment of surface waters that has been identified by the TDEC as impaired or failing to support one or more classified uses. Unavailable parameters exist where water quality is at, or fails to meet, the levels specified in water quality criteria in Rule 0400-40-03-.03, even if caused by natural conditions. In the case of a criterion that is a single response variable or is derived from measurement of multiple response variables, the unavailable parameters shall be the agents causing water quality to be at or failing to meet the levels specified in criteria. Resources to be used in making this determination include biennial compilations of impaired waters, databases of assessment information, updated GIS coverages (<https://tdeconline.tn.gov/dwr/>), and the results of recent field surveys. GIS coverages of the streams and lakes not meeting water quality standards, plus the biennial list of waters with unavailable parameters, can be found at <https://www.tn.gov/environment/program-areas/wr-water-resources/water-quality/water-quality-reports---publications.html>.
55. **Water quality riparian buffer** means a permanent strip of natural perennial vegetation adjacent to a stream, river, wetland, pond, or lake that contains dense vegetation made up of grass, shrubs, and/or trees. The purpose of a water quality riparian buffer is to maintain existing water quality by minimizing the risk of any potential sediments, nutrients, or other pollutants reaching

adjacent surface waters and to further prevent negative water quality impacts by providing canopy over adjacent waters.

56. A **one-week period** is a synonym of a calendar-week; typically, a period from Sunday through Saturday

57. **Water quality treatment volume (WQTV)** is a portion of the runoff generated from impervious surfaces at a new development or redevelopment project by the 1-year 24-hour design storm. The WQTV is further determined by the type of treatment provided.

58. **Wet weather conveyances** are man-made or natural watercourses, including natural watercourses that have been modified by channelization, that meet the following:

- The conveyance carries flow only in direct response to precipitation runoff in its immediate locality.
- The conveyance’s channels are at all times above the groundwater table.
- The flow carried by the conveyance is not suitable for drinking water supplies.
- Hydrological and biological analyses indicate that, due to naturally occurring ephemeral or low flow under normal weather conditions, there is not sufficient water to support fish or multiple populations of obligate lotic aquatic organisms whose life cycle includes an aquatic phase of at least two months. (Tennessee Rules, Chapter 0400-40-3-.04(3)).

1-103. Construction Stormwater Management

1. MS4 Stormwater Construction BMP Manual.

a. Adoption. Hamblen County adopts as its MS4 stormwater construction BMP manual(s) the following publication(s), which is incorporated by reference in this resolution as if fully set out herein:

- i. TDEC Erosion and Sediment Control Handbook (2026 or most current edition)
- ii. TN Permanent Stormwater Management and Design Guidance Manual (2014 or most current edition)
- iii. City of Morristown Stormwater Design Guidance Manual (2024 or most current edition)

b. Hamblen County has adopted, for use in designing Stormwater Control Measures, construction design storm events. The construction design storm events adopted by the County are as follows:

Storm Event	1-yr, 24-hr	2-yr, 24-hr	5-yr, 24-hr	10-yr, 24-hr	100-yr, 24-hr
Precipitation Depth	2.41"	2.86"	3.45"	3.94"	5.75"

- c. Requirements for design storm for all waters as well as special conditions for unavailable parameters waters or exceptional Tennessee waters must be consistent with those of the current Tennessee Construction General Permit (TNR100000).
2. The municipality has adopted, for use in designing EPSC measures, the design storm requirements from the current Tennessee Construction General Permit for all waters as well as special conditions for unavailable parameters or Exceptional Tennessee Waters.
3. Waste Control Construction site operators are required to minimize the exposure of building materials, building products, construction wastes, trash, landscape materials, fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, detergents, sanitary waste and other materials present on the site to precipitation and to stormwater.
4. Priority Construction
 - a. Priority in construction shall be, at a minimum, those construction activities discharging directly into, or immediately upstream of, waters the state recognized as unavailable condition for siltation or Exceptional Tennessee Waters.
 - b. Requirements for all priority construction activities must include preconstruction meetings with construction site operators for priority construction activities.
5. Land development permit

This section shall be applicable to all land development, including, but not limited to, site plan applications, subdivision applications, land disturbance applications and grading applications. These standards apply to qualifying new development or redevelopment site(s), when required. Every person/entity will be required to obtain a land disturbance permit from the County in the following cases:

- a. One (1) acre or more;
 - i. New development that involves land development activities of one (1) acre or more;
 - ii. Redevelopment that involves other land development activity of one (1) acre or more;
- b. Projects of less than one acre of total land disturbance may also be required to obtain authorization under this resolution if:
 - i. Hamblen County has determined that the stormwater discharge from a site is causing, contributing to, or is likely to contribute to a violation of a state water quality standard; or is likely to be a significant contributor of pollutants to water of the state,
 - ii. changes in state or federal rules require sites of less than one acre that are not part of a larger common plan of development or sale to obtain a stormwater permit;

- iii. any new development or redevelopment, regardless of size, that is defined by the County to be a hot spot land use; or
- iv. the minimum applicability criteria set forth in item (a) above if such activities are part of a larger common plan of development, (see “common plan of development” definition).
- v. The creation and use of borrow pits, that are not permitted under the Tennessee Multi Sector Permit (TMSP), where material is excavated and relocated offsite, and fill sites where materials or earth is deposited by mechanized methods resulting in an increased elevation or grade.
- vi. As determined by the County for single or duplex residential lots of any size, lots that have karst features, adjoining lakes or streams, slopes exceeding fifteen percent (15%), floodplains or streams to cross are required to submit an erosion control and stormwater management plan. Depending on site specific conditions the requirement that the plan be developed by a qualified licensed professional engineer or landscape architect may be waived by the Stormwater Administrator
- vii. Minimal plan requirements shall include pre- and post-stormwater runoff directions, construction access, erosion/sediment control measures, swales, BMPs, and vegetative soil stabilization.
- viii. If unpermitted construction activity is on-going, the County will issue and immediate stop-work order. If, in addition to the County’s permit, a TDEC permit was required but was not obtained, the violator will also be reported to TDEC.

6. Land disturbance Permit

Persons seeking the issuance of any Hamblen County Land Disturbance Permit must provide proof of coverage under the Tennessee Construction General Permit (CGP) (if applicable) when requested; and a copy of the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) to the County when requested.

- a. Copies of additional applicable local, state or federal permits (i.e.: ARAP, UIC, approved hydrologic determination, etc.) must also be provided to the County.
 - b. The County has the authority to withhold local permits prior to receiving copies of the aforementioned permits.
 - c. In circumstances where no such permits have been required, the County may still require a SWPPP as part of the land disturbance permit application.
 - d. **The County Stormwater Coordinator may request bonding to assure stormwater infrastructure is installed in accordance with the approved site plans.**
7. Building Permit. No building permit shall be issued until the applicant has first obtained a Land Disturbance Permit where required by this resolution.
8. Construction site operators are required to implement appropriate erosion prevention and sediment control measures and best management practices. EPSC requirements shall meet the

Tennessee's CGP design storm(s), be consistent with the TDEC EPSC Handbook best management practices and with the requirements of this resolution.

9. Where site assessments are required by the CGP, the operator shall provide a copy of the assessment to the County.
10. Twice-Weekly inspections of the site and the BMP's/SCM's must be performed by an individual who has either received certification under the Level I Fundamentals of Erosion Prevention and Sediment Control course or has other credentials identified as equivalent within this resolution.
11. Landscaping and stabilization requirements.
 - a. Any area of land from which the natural vegetative cover has been either partially or wholly cleared by development activities shall be stabilized. Stabilization measures shall be initiated as soon as possible in portions of the site where construction activities have temporarily or permanently ceased. Temporary or permanent soil stabilization at the construction site (or a phase of the project) must be completed not later than 14 days after the construction activity in that portion of the site has temporarily or permanently ceased. In the following situations, temporary stabilization measures are not required:
 - i. where the initiation of stabilization measures is precluded by snow cover or frozen ground conditions, stabilization measures shall be initiated as soon as practicable; or
 - ii. where construction activity on a portion of the site is temporarily ceased, and earth disturbing activities will be resumed within 14 days.
 - b. For steep slopes of 35% or more, stabilization measures shall be initiated within 7 days Construction buffer zones. Construction buffer zones shall be those water quality buffers and buffer zones as defined in 1-102 above and shall meet the requirements in this resolution and, where appropriate in the TNCGP. The criteria for the width of the construction buffer zone can be established on an average width basis at a project, as long as the minimum width of the buffer zone is more than the required minimum width at any measured location. If the new development or redevelopment site encompasses both sides of a stream, buffer averaging can be applied to both sides, but must be applied independently. Water quality riparian buffer widths are measured from the top of bank also referred to as the "ordinary high-water mark." Construction buffers are not primary sediment control measures and shall not be relied on as such. Stormwater discharges must enter the water quality riparian buffer zone as sheet flow, not as concentrated flow, where site conditions allow. The designer/operator must comply with the vegetation requirements and the permissible land uses set forth for buffers in the TN CGP. Where it is not practicable to maintain a construction water quality riparian buffer, BMPs providing equivalent protection to a receiving stream as a natural water quality riparian buffer must be used.
 - c. In arid, semiarid, and drought-stricken areas where initiating vegetative stabilization measures immediately is infeasible, alternative stabilization measures such as properly anchored mulch, soil binders or matting must be employed.

- d. Cut or fill slopes designed at 2:1 (horizontal:vertical) or greater inclination must include written recommendations from a geotechnical engineer; proposed developments with these slopes must adhere to the recommendations made by a professional engineer licensed in the state of Tennessee.
- 12. Notice of Termination (NOT) the operator shall provide the County with a copy of the NOT when it is issued by TDEC.
- 13. As built plans (record drawings). All applicants are required to submit actual as built plans certified by the design engineer for any structures located on-site after final construction is completed. The plan must show the final design specifications for all stormwater management facilities and must be sealed by a registered professional engineer licensed to practice in Tennessee. A certification by the design engineer certifying that SCM's will function within original design parameters as constructed shall be included. A final inspection by the County is required before any performance security or performance bond will be released. The County shall have the discretion to adopt provisions for a partial pro-rata release of the performance security or performance bond on the completion of various stages of development. In addition, occupation permits shall not be granted until corrections to all BMP's/SCM's have been made and accepted by the County. No bonds or securities shall be released by the County until the department has accepted the as-built plans. The warranty period for any infrastructure to be accepted by the County for maintenance shall not commence until the County has accepted the as built plans.
- 14. Equipment manufacturer startups. No bonds or securities shall be released until any equipment to be maintained by the County passes any specified manufacturer startup procedure. The warranty period shall not commence prior to the equipment passing any specified manufacturer startup procedure.

1-104. Permanent stormwater management within Urban Area: design and construction inspection.

- (1) Hamblen County requires permanent stormwater management within the Urban Area as determined by the latest decennial census by the United States Census Bureau; permanent stormwater management is solely limited to those portions of the County.
- (2) In order to comply with Hamblen County's permanent stormwater standards for new development and redevelopment projects, design and install SCMs as established by Tennessee Rule 0400-40-10-.04 and comply with other requirements of Tennessee Rule 0400-40-10-.04.

- (3) SCMs must be designed to provide full treatment capacity within 72 hours following the end of the preceding rain event for the life of the new development or redevelopment project. The designer may select from the most appropriate alternatives listed in the County's BMP Manual.
- (4) Designs shall be based on the 24-hour design storm adopted by the County:

The County has adopted, for use in designing water quality SCMs, the design storm requirements as established in Tennessee Rule 0400-40-10-.04. The Post Construction/Permanent water quality design storm is a 1-year, 24 storm event for water quality SCMs. See definition of Design Storm Event for the municipality's rainfall amounts for each return period interval.

- (5) Water Quality Riparian Buffers. Post Construction/Permanent water quality riparian buffers shall be those buffers defined in 1-102 above and shall meet the requirements described in this resolution. The criteria for the width of the post construction/permanent buffer zone can be established on an average width basis at a project, as long as the minimum width of the buffer zone is more than the required minimum width at any measured location. If the new development or redevelopment site encompasses both sides of a stream, buffer averaging can be applied to both sides but must be applied independently. Water quality riparian buffer widths are measured from the top of bank also referred to as the "ordinary high-water mark." Stormwater discharges should enter the post construction/permanent water quality riparian buffer as sheet flow, not as concentrated flow, where site conditions allow.

Post Construction/Permanent buffers for waters with available parameters for siltation or habitat alteration or unassessed waters:

- a. Average buffer width: 30 feet.
- b. Minimum buffer width: 15 feet

Post Construction/Permanent buffers for Exceptional Tennessee Waters or waters with unavailable parameters for siltation or habitat alteration:

- a. Average buffer width: 60 feet.
- b. Minimum buffer width: 30 feet

The designer/operator must comply with the vegetation requirements and the permissible land uses set forth for buffers in the MS4 permit.

1-105. Permanent SCM maintenance and inspection (Urban Area only).

- (1) As built plans. All applicants are required to submit actual as built plans for any structures located on-site within 90 days after final construction is completed. The plan must show the final design specifications for all stormwater management facilities and must be sealed by either a registered professional engineer or landscape architect licensed to practice in Tennessee. A sealed certification by the design engineer that all SCM's will function within design parameters as constructed shall accompany the as built plans. A final inspection by the Hamblen County staff is required before any performance security or performance bond will be released. The County shall have the discretion to adopt provisions for a partial pro-rata release of the performance security or performance bond on the completion of various stages of development. In addition, occupation permits shall not be granted until corrections to all stormwater management facilities have been made and accepted by the County.
- (2) In addition to the certified as built drawings, the County shall be provided with a permanent stormwater management plan for the site and all stormwater management facilities (e.g., SCM's). Occupation permits shall not be granted until the permanent stormwater management plan has been approved and accepted by the County.
- (3) Inspection of stormwater management facilities. Periodic inspections of facilities shall be performed, documented, and reported in accordance with this chapter, as detailed in §1-106.
- (4) Records of installation and maintenance activities. Parties responsible for the operation and maintenance of a stormwater management facility shall make records of the installation of the stormwater facility, and of all maintenance and repairs to the facility, and shall retain the records for at least five (5) years. These records shall be made available to the County during inspection of the facility and at other reasonable times upon request.
- (5) Failure to meet or maintain design or maintenance standards. If a responsible party fails or refuses to meet the design or maintenance standards required for stormwater

facilities under this chapter, the County, after notice as specified in the Enforcement Response Plan, may correct a violation of the design standards or maintenance needs by performing all necessary work to place the facility in proper working condition. In the event that the stormwater management facility becomes a danger to public safety or public health, the County shall notify in writing the party responsible for maintenance of the stormwater management facility. Upon receipt of that notice, the responsible person shall have thirty (30) days to effect maintenance and repair of the facility in an approved manner. In the event that corrective action is not undertaken within that time, the County may take necessary corrective action. The cost of any action by the County under this section shall be charged to the responsible party.

- (6) In the event that the stormwater management facility becomes a danger to public health/public safety-the County may take such immediate corrective action as deemed necessary.

1-106. Permanent SCM's: new, existing, and ongoing developments (Urban Area only).

(1) On-site stormwater management facilities inspection and maintenance agreement

- a. Where the stormwater facility is located on property that is subject to a development agreement, and the development agreement provides for a permanent stormwater maintenance agreement that runs with the land, the owners of property must execute an inspection and maintenance agreement that shall operate as a deed restriction binding on the current property owners and all subsequent property owners and their lessees and assigns, including but not limited to, homeowner associations or other groups or entities.
- b. The maintenance agreement shall:
 - i. Assign responsibility for the maintenance and repair of the stormwater facility to the owners of the property upon which the facility is located and be recorded as such on the plat for the property by appropriate notation.
 - ii. Provide for a periodic inspection by the property owners in accordance with the requirements of subsection (5) below for the purpose of documenting maintenance and repair needs and to ensure compliance with the requirements of this resolution. The property owners will arrange for this inspection to be conducted by individual(s) approved by the County who will submit a signed written report of the inspection to the County. It shall also grant permission to the County to enter the property at reasonable times and to inspect the stormwater facility to ensure that it is being properly maintained.
- c. Provide that the minimum maintenance and repair needs include but are not limited to: the removal of silt, litter and other debris, the cutting of grass, cutting and vegetation removal, and the replacement of landscape vegetation, in detention and retention basins, and inlets and drainage pipes and any other stormwater facilities. It shall also provide that the property owners shall be responsible for additional maintenance and repair needed to meet the intended design specification of the stormwater facility.

- d. Provide that maintenance needs must be addressed in a timely manner, on a schedule to be determined by the Hamblen County staff.
- e. Provide that if the property is not maintained or repaired within the prescribed schedule, Hamblen County shall perform the maintenance and repair at its expense and bill the same to the property owner. The maintenance agreement shall also provide that the County's cost of performing the maintenance shall be a lien against the property.

(2) Existing problem locations – no maintenance agreement

- a. The County shall in writing notify the owners of existing locations and developments of specific drainage, erosion or sediment problems affecting or caused by such locations and developments, and the specific actions required to correct those problems. The notice shall also specify a reasonable time for compliance. Discharges from existing SCM's that have not been maintained and/or inspected in accordance with this resolution shall be regarded as non-compliant discharges.
- b. Inspection of existing facilities. The County may, to the extent authorized by state and federal law, enter and inspect private property for the purpose of determining if there are illicit non-stormwater discharges, and to establish inspection programs to verify that all stormwater management facilities are functioning within design limits. These inspection programs may be established on any reasonable basis, including but not limited to: routine inspections; random inspections; inspections based upon complaints or other notice of possible violations; inspection of drainage basins or areas identified as higher than typical sources of sediment or other contaminants or pollutants; inspections of businesses or industries of a type associated with higher than usual discharges of contaminants or pollutants or with discharges of a type which are more likely than the typical discharge to cause violations of the County's NPDES MS4 stormwater permit; and joint inspections with other agencies inspecting under environmental or safety laws. Inspections may include but are not limited to: reviewing maintenance and repair records; sampling discharges, surface water, groundwater, and material or water in drainage control facilities; and evaluating the condition of drainage control facilities and other SCM's.

(3) Owner/Operator Inspections. The owners and/or operators of the SCMs shall:

- a. Perform routine inspections to ensure that all SCM's are properly functioning. These inspections shall be conducted on an annual basis, at a minimum. These inspections shall be conducted by a person familiar with control measures implemented at a site. Owners or operators shall maintain documentation of these inspections. The County may require submittal of this documentation.
- b. Perform comprehensive inspection of all stormwater management facilities and practices. These inspections shall be conducted once every five years, at a minimum.

Such inspections must be conducted by individual(s) approved by the County. Complete inspection reports for these five-year inspections shall include:

- i. Facility type,
 - ii. Inspection date,
 - iii. Latitude and longitude and nearest street address,
 - iv. BMP owner information (e.g. name, address, phone number, fax, and email),
 - v. A description of BMP condition including: vegetation and soils; inlet and outlet channels and structures; embankments, slopes, and safety benches; spillways, weirs, and other control structures; and any sediment and debris accumulation,
 - vi. Photographic documentation of BMP's, and
 - vii. Specific maintenance items or violations that need to be corrected by the BMP owner along with deadlines and reinspection dates.
- c. Owners or operators shall maintain documentation of these inspections. The County may require submittal of this documentation.

(4) Requirements for all existing locations and ongoing developments. The following requirements shall apply to all locations and developments at which land disturbing activities have occurred previous to the enactment of this resolution:

- a. Denuded areas must be vegetated or covered under the standards and guidelines specified in the BMP Manual and on a schedule acceptable to the County.
- b. Cuts and slopes must be properly covered with appropriate vegetation and/or retaining walls constructed.
- c. Drainage ways shall be appropriately stabilized.
- d. Trash, junk, rubbish, etc. shall be cleared from drainage ways.
- e. Stormwater runoff shall, at the discretion of the County, be treated to the maximum extent practicable to prevent its pollution. Such control measures may include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - i. Ponds
 1. Detention pond
 2. Extended detention pond
 3. Wet pond
 4. Alternative storage measures

- ii. Constructed wetlands
- iii. Infiltration systems
 - 1. Infiltration/percolation trench
 - 2. Infiltration basin
 - 3. Drainage/recharge well
 - 4. Porous pavement
- iv. Filtering systems
 - 1. Media Filter
 - 2. Sand filter
 - 3. Filter/absorption bed
 - 4. Filter and buffer strips
- v. Open channel
 - 1. Swale

(5) Corrections of problems subject to appeal. Corrective measures imposed by the County under this section are subject to appeal under section 1-110 of this chapter.

1-107. Illicit discharges.

This section shall apply to all water generated on developed or undeveloped land entering the County's separate storm sewer system.

(1) Prohibition of illicit discharges. No person shall introduce or cause to be introduced into the municipal separate storm sewer system any discharge that is not composed entirely of stormwater. No person shall allow discharges that flow from a stormwater facility that is not inspected in accordance with section 1-106. Non-stormwater discharges shall include, but shall not be limited to, sanitary wastewater, car wash wastewater, radiator flushing disposal, spills from roadway accidents, carpet cleaning wastewater, effluent from septic tanks, improper oil disposal, laundry wastewater/gray water, improper disposal of auto and household toxics. The commencement, conduct or continuance of any non-stormwater discharge to the municipal separate storm sewer system is prohibited except as described as follows:

- a. Water line flushing
- b. Landscape irrigation
- c. Diverted stream flows
- d. Rising ground waters

- e. Uncontaminated ground water infiltration (Infiltration is defined as water other than wastewater that enters a sewer system, including sewer service connections and foundation drains, from the ground through such means as defective pipes, pipe joints, connections, or manholes. Infiltration does not include, and is distinguished from, inflow.)
- f. Uncontaminated pumped ground water
- g. Discharges from potable water sources
- h. Air conditioning condensation
- i. Irrigation water
- j. Springs
- k. Water from crawl space pumps
- l. Footing (foundation) drains
- m. Lawn watering
- n. Individual residential car washing
- o. Flows from riparian habitats and wetlands
- p. Dechlorinated swimming pool discharges
- q. Street wash water with no soaps or solvents
- r. Discharges or flows from firefighting activities

Unless the County determines they are significant contributors of pollutants to the MS4.

(2) Prohibition of illicit connections. The construction, use, maintenance or continued existence of illicit connections to the municipal separate storm sewer system is prohibited. This prohibition expressly includes, without limitation, illicit connections made in the past, regardless of whether the connection was permissible under law or practices applicable or prevailing at the time of connection. This prohibition expressly includes SCM's connected to the system not properly inspected and maintained in accordance with this resolution.

- a. Any person responsible for a property or premises, which is, or may be, the source of an illicit discharge, may be required to implement, at the person's expense, the BMP's necessary to prevent the further discharge of pollutants to the municipal separate storm sewer system. Compliance with all terms and conditions of a valid NPDES permit authorizing the discharge of stormwater associated with industrial activity, to the extent practicable, shall be deemed in compliance with the provisions of this section. Discharges from existing SCM's that have not been maintained and/or inspected in accordance with this resolution shall be prohibited.

- (3) Notification of spills. Notwithstanding other requirements of law, as soon as any person responsible for a facility or operation, or responsible for emergency response for a facility or operation has information of any known or suspected release of materials which are resulting in, or may result in, illicit discharges or pollutants discharging into, the municipal separate storm sewer system, the person shall take all necessary steps to ensure the discovery, containment, and cleanup of such release. In the event of such a release of hazardous materials the person shall immediately notify emergency response agencies of the occurrence via emergency dispatch services. In the event of a release of non-hazardous materials, the person shall notify the County in person or by telephone, fax, or email, no later than the next business day. Notifications in person or by telephone shall be confirmed by written notice addressed and mailed to the County within three (3) business days of the telephone notice. If the discharge of prohibited materials emanates from a commercial or industrial establishment, the owner or operator of such establishment shall also retain an on-site written record of the discharge and the actions taken to prevent its recurrence. Such records shall be retained for at least three (3) years.
- (4) No illegal dumping allowed. No person shall dump or otherwise deposit outside an authorized landfill, convenience center or other authorized garbage or trash collection point, any trash or garbage of any kind or description on any private or public property, occupied or unoccupied, inside the Hamblen County. Such illegal activity exposes runoff to contamination, generating an illicit discharge. Therefore, any individual or corporation guilty of illegal dumping may have committed a violation of this resolution.

1-108. Enforcement.

- (1) Enforcement authority. Hamblen County shall have the authority to issue notices of violation and citations, and to impose civil penalties to anyone that violates this chapter, who violates the provisions of any permit issued pursuant to this chapter, or who fails or refuses to comply with any lawful communication or notice to abate or take corrective action by the County, The County's enforcement authority includes (as set forth in the County's Enforcement Response Plan (ERP)):
 - (a) Verbal Warnings – At a minimum, verbal warnings must specify the nature of the violation and required corrective actions.
 - (b) Written Notices – Written notices must stipulate the nature of the violation and the required corrective action, with deadlines for taking such action.
 - (c) Stop Work Orders – Stop work orders that require construction activities to be halted, except for those activities directed at cleaning up, abating discharge, and installing appropriate control measures.
 - (d) Citations with Administrative Penalties – The County has the authority to assess monetary penalties, which may include civil and administrative penalties.

- (e) **Withholding of Plan Approvals or Other Authorizations** – Where a facility is in noncompliance, the County’s own approval process affecting the facility’s ability to discharge to the MS4 can be used to abate the violation.

- (f) **Additional Measures** – The County may also use other escalated measures provided under local legal authorities. The County may perform work necessary to improve erosion control measures and collect the funds from the responsible party in an appropriate manner, such as collecting against the project’s bond or directly billing the responsible party to pay for work and materials.

(2) Notification of violation:

- (a) **Verbal warning.** Verbal warning may be given at the discretion of the inspector when it appears the condition can be corrected by the violator within a reasonable time, which time shall be approved by the inspector.

- (b) **Written notice.** Whenever Hamblen County staff finds that any permittee or any other person discharging stormwater has violated or is violating this resolution or a permit or order issued hereunder, the County may serve upon such person written notice of the violation. Within ten (10) business days of this notice, an explanation of the violation and a plan for the satisfactory correction and prevention thereof, to include specific required actions, shall be submitted to the County. Submission of this plan in no way relieves the discharger of liability for any violations occurring before or after receipt of the notice of violation.

- (c) **Consent orders.** The County is empowered to enter into consent orders, assurances of voluntary compliance, or other similar documents establishing an agreement with the person responsible for the noncompliance. Such orders will include specific action to be taken by the person to correct the noncompliance within a time period also specified by the order. Consent orders shall have the same force and effect as administrative orders issued pursuant to paragraphs (d) and (e) below.

- (d) **Show cause hearing.** Hamblen County may order any person who violates this chapter or permit, or order issued hereunder, to show cause why a proposed enforcement action should not be taken. Notice shall be served on the person specifying the time and place for the meeting, the proposed enforcement action and the reasons for such action, and a request that the violator show cause why this proposed enforcement action should not be taken. The notice of the meeting shall be served personally or by registered or certified mail (return receipt requested) at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing.

- (e) Compliance order. When Hamblen County finds that any person has violated or continues to violate this chapter or a permit or order issued thereunder, he may issue an order to the violator directing that, following a specific time period, adequate structures or devices be installed and/or procedures implemented and properly operated. Orders may also contain such other requirements as might be reasonably necessary and appropriate to address the noncompliance, including the construction of appropriate structures, installation of devices, self-monitoring, and management practices.

- (f) Cease and desist and stop work orders. When Hamblen County finds that any person has violated or continues to violate this chapter or any permit or order issued hereunder, the County may issue a stop work order or an order to cease and desist all such violations and direct those persons in noncompliance to:
 - (i) Comply forthwith; or
 - (ii) Take such appropriate remedial or preventive action as may be needed to properly address a continuing or threatened violation; including halting operations except for terminating the discharge and installing appropriate control measures.

- (g) Suspension, revocation or modification of permit. Hamblen County may suspend, revoke or modify the permit authorizing the land development project or any other project of the applicant or other responsible person within the County. A suspended, revoked or modified permit may be reinstated after the applicant or other responsible person has taken the remedial measures set forth in the notice of violation or has otherwise cured the violations described therein, provided such permit may be reinstated upon such conditions as the County may deem necessary to enable the applicant or other responsible person to take the necessary remedial measures to cure such violations.

- (h) Conflicting standards. Whenever there is a conflict between any standard contained in this chapter and in the BMP manual(s) adopted by the County under this resolution, the strictest standard shall prevail.

1-109. Penalties. Violations. Any person who shall commit any act declared unlawful under this chapter, who violates any provision of this chapter, who violates the provisions of any permit issued pursuant to this chapter, or who fails or refuses to comply with any lawful communication or notice to abate or take corrective action by the County, shall be guilty of a civil offense.

- (1) Penalties. Under the authority provided in Tennessee Code Annotated § 68-221-1106, the County declares that any person violating the provisions of this chapter may be assessed a civil penalty by the County of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and not more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) per day for each day of violation. Each day of violation shall constitute a separate violation.

- (2) Measuring civil penalties. In assessing a civil penalty, Hamblen County shall consider:
 - (a) The harm done to the public health or the environment;
 - (b) Whether the civil penalty imposed will be a substantial economic deterrent to the illegal activity;
 - (c) The economic benefit gained by the violator;
 - (d) The amount of effort put forth by the violator to remedy this violation;
 - (e) Any unusual or extraordinary enforcement costs incurred by the County; The amount of penalty established by ordinance or resolution for specific categories of violations; and
 - (f) Any equities of the situation which outweigh the benefit of imposing any penalty or damage assessment.

- (3) Recovery of damages and costs. In addition to the civil penalty in subsection (2) above, the County may recover:
 - (a) All damages proximately caused by the violator to the County, which may include any reasonable expenses incurred in investigating violations of, and enforcing compliance with, this chapter, or any other actual damages caused by the violation.
 - (b) A claim against the stormwater bond will be made if infrastructure installation needs to be addressed.
 - (c) The costs of the County's maintenance of stormwater facilities when the user of such facilities fails to maintain them as required by this chapter.

- (4) Referral to TDEC. In accordance with the County's Enforcement Response Plan and the NPDES Permit requirements, the County may also notify TDEC of violations.

- (5) Other remedies. The County may bring legal action to enjoin the continuing violation of this chapter, and the existence of any other remedy, at law or equity, shall be no defense to any such actions.

- (6) Remedies cumulative. The remedies set forth in this section shall be cumulative, not exclusive, and it shall not be a defense to any action, civil or criminal, that one (1) or more of the remedies set forth herein has been sought or granted.

1-110. Appeals. Pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated § 68-221-1106(d), any person aggrieved by the imposition of a civil penalty or damage assessment as provided by this chapter may appeal said penalty or damage assessment to the Board of Zoning Appeals.

(1) Appeals to be in writing. The appeal shall be in writing and filed with the municipal recorder or clerk within fifteen (15) days after the civil penalty and/or damage assessment is served in any manner authorized by law.

(2) Public hearing. Upon receipt of an appeal, Hamblen County's Board of Zoning Appeals shall hold a public hearing within thirty (30) days. Ten (10) days prior notice of the time, date, and location of said hearing shall be published in a daily newspaper of general circulation. Ten (10) days' notice by registered mail shall also be provided to the aggrieved party, such notice to be sent to the address provided by the aggrieved party at the time of appeal. The decision of the governing body of the County shall be final.

(3) Appealing decisions of the County's governing body. Any alleged violator may appeal a decision of the BZA appeal decision pursuant to the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated, title 27, chapter 8.

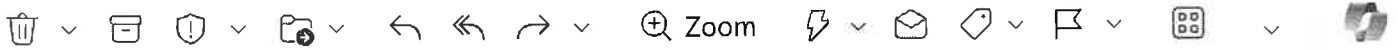
