Resolution No. 20-10

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF HAMBLEN COUNTY, TENNESSEE IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF NOT TO EXCEED \$20,000,000, IN ONE OR MORE SERIES; MAKING PROVISION FOR THE ISSUANCE, SALE AND PAYMENT OF SAID BONDS, ESTABLISHING THE TERMS THEREOF AND THE DISPOSITION OF PROCEEDS THEREFROM; PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY OF TAXES FOR THE PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL OF, PREMIUM, IF ANY, AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS; AND RATIFYING CERTAIN ACTIONS PREVIOUSLY UNDERTAKEN IN CONNECTION WITH THE ISSUANCE OF THE BONDS.

WHEREAS, 9-21-101, et seq., inclusive, Tennessee Code Annotated, as amended, authorizes the Hamblen County, Tennessee (the "County"), by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners, to issue and sell bonds for the purposes of providing funds for: (i) constructing, improving, repairing, renovating and equipping of courtroom, corrective and detention facilities, schools and other educational facilities, libraries, stormwater drainage facilities, parks and recreations facilities and other public buildings, including any equipment required therefor; (ii) constructing and improving roads, streets, bridges and highways; (iii) payment of legal, fiscal, administrative, architectural and engineering costs incident to all of the foregoing (collectively, the "Projects"); (iv) reimbursement to the appropriate fund of the County for prior expenditures for the foregoing costs, if applicable; and (v) payment of costs incident to the issuance of the bonds authorized herein; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of the County hereby determines that it is necessary and advisable to issue general obligation bonds, in one or more series, for the purpose of financing the Projects and the foregoing described costs; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of the County did adopt on October 24, 2019, an initial resolution (the "Initial Resolution") authorizing the issuance of not to exceed \$85,000,000 for the purposes described above; and

WHEREAS, the Initial Resolution, together with the notice required by Section 9-21-206, Tennessee Code Annotated, as amended, was published on October 25, 2019 as required by law; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners of the County to adopt this resolution for the purpose of authorizing not to exceed \$20,000,000 in aggregate principal amount of bonds for the above-described purposes, providing for the issuance, sale and payment of said bonds, establishing the terms thereof, and the disposition of proceeds therefrom, and providing for the levy of a tax for the payment of principal thereof, premium, if any, and interest thereon.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Hamblen County, Tennessee, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Authority</u>. The bonds authorized by this resolution are issued pursuant to 9-21-101, et seq., Tennessee Code Annotated, as amended, and other applicable provisions of law.

<u>Section 2.</u> <u>Definitions</u>. In addition to the terms defined in the preamble above, the following terms shall have the following meanings in this resolution unless the text expressly or by necessary implication requires otherwise:

(a) "Bonds" means the not to exceed \$20,000,000 General Obligation Bonds of the County, to be dated their date of issuance, and having such series designation or such other dated date as shall be determined by the County Mayor pursuant to Section 8 hereof.

(b) "Book-Entry Form" or "Book-Entry System" means a form or system, as applicable, under which physical bond certificates in fully registered form are issued to a Depository, or to its nominee as Registered Owner, with the certificate of bonds being held by and "immobilized" in the custody of such Depository, and under which records maintained by persons, other than the County or the Registration Agent, constitute the written record that identifies, and records the transfer of, the beneficial "book-entry" interests in those bonds.

(c) "Code" means the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and all regulations promulgated thereunder.

(d) "County Mayor" shall mean the County Mayor of the County.

(e) "Depository" means any securities depository that is a clearing agency under federal laws operating and maintaining, with its participants or otherwise, a Book-Entry System, including, but not limited to, DTC.

(f) "DTC" means the Depository Trust Company, a limited purpose company organized under the laws of the State of New York, and its successors and assigns.

(g) "DTC Participant(s)" means securities brokers and dealers, banks, trust companies and clearing corporations that have access to the DTC System.

(h) "Municipal Advisor" for the Bonds authorized herein means Cumberland Securities Company, Inc., Knoxville, Tennessee.

(i) "Projects" means: (i) constructing, improving, repairing, renovating and equipping of courtroom, corrective and detention facilities, schools and other educational facilities, libraries, stormwater drainage facilities, parks and recreations facilities and other public buildings, including any equipment required therefor; (ii) constructing and improving roads, streets, bridges and highways; and (iii) payment of legal, fiscal, administrative, architectural and engineering costs incident to all of the foregoing.

(j) "Registration Agent" means the registration and paying agent appointed by the County Mayor pursuant to the terms hereof, or any successor designated by the Governing Body.

Section 3. Findings of the Governing Body; Compliance with Debt Management Policy.

(a) In conformance with the directive of the State Funding Board of the State of Tennessee, the County has heretofore adopted its Debt Management Policy. The Governing Body hereby finds that the issuance and sale of the Bonds, as proposed herein, is consistent with the County's Debt Management Policy.

(b) The Governing Body finds that the Municipal Advisor has provided the Governing Body with sufficient information regarding the estimated interest expense relating to the Bonds and costs of issuance of the Bonds for the Governing Body to make an informed decision in connection with the issuance of the Bonds in compliance with the County's Debt Management Policy.

Section 4. Authorization and Terms of the Bonds.

For the purpose of providing funds to finance, in whole or in part, the cost of the Projects (a) and costs incident thereto; reimbursement to the appropriate fund of the County for prior expenditures for the foregoing costs, if applicable; and payment of costs incident to the issuance and sale of the Bonds, there is hereby authorized to be issued bonds, in one or more series, of the County in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$20,000,000. The Bonds shall be issued in one or more series, in fully registered, book-entry form (except as otherwise set forth herein), without coupons, and subject to the adjustments permitted hereunder, shall be known as "General Obligation Bonds", shall be dated their date of issuance, and shall have such series designation or such other dated date as shall be determined by the County Mayor pursuant to the terms hereof. The Bonds shall bear interest at a rate or rates not to exceed the maximum rate per annum permitted by law at the time of issuance of each series of the Bonds, payable (subject to the adjustments permitted hereunder) semi-annually on June 1 and December 1 in each year, commencing on the June 1st or December 1st following the issuance of the series of Bonds being issued or such other date as is established pursuant to Section 8 hereof. The Bonds shall be issued initially in \$5,000 denominations or integral multiples thereof, as shall be requested by the original purchaser thereof. Subject to the adjustments permitted pursuant to the terms hereof, each series of the Bonds shall mature serially or be subject to mandatory redemption and shall be payable on June 1 of each year, subject to prior optional redemption as hereinafter provided and subject to adjustment as provided herein, over a period that does not exceed thirty (30) years from the date of issuance of the applicable series of Bonds in such a manner that all Bonds issued pursuant to this resolution shall provide for approximately level debt service in each year following the construction period of the Projects.

(b) Subject to the adjustments permitted under Section 8 hereof, Bonds maturing on June 1, 2030 and thereafter shall be subject to redemption prior to maturity at the option of the County on June 1, 2029 and thereafter, as a whole or in part at any time at the redemption price of par plus accrued interest to the redemption date.

If less than all the Bonds shall be called for redemption, the maturities to be redeemed shall be selected by the Governing Body in its discretion. If less than all of the Bonds within a single maturity shall be called for redemption, the interests within the maturity to be redeemed shall be selected as follows:

(i) if the Bonds are being held under a Book-Entry System by DTC, or a successor Depository, the Bonds to be redeemed shall be determined by DTC, or such successor Depository, by lot or such other manner as DTC, or such successor Depository, shall determine; or

(ii) if the Bonds are not being held under a Book-Entry System by DTC, or a successor Depository, the Bonds within the maturity to be redeemed shall be selected by the Registration Agent by lot or such other random manner as the Registration Agent in its discretion shall determine.

(c) Pursuant to the terms hereof, the County Mayor is authorized to sell the Bonds, or any maturities thereof, as term bonds ("Term Bonds") with mandatory redemption requirements corresponding to the maturities set forth herein or as determined by the County Mayor. In the event any or all the Bonds are sold as Term Bonds, the County shall redeem Term Bonds on redemption dates corresponding to the maturity dates set forth herein, in aggregate principal amounts equal to the maturity amounts established pursuant to the terms hereof for each redemption date, as such maturity amounts may be adjusted pursuant to the terms hereof, at a price of par plus accrued interest thereon to the date of

redemption. Any Term Bonds to be redeemed within a single maturity shall be selected in the manner described above with respect to the partial optional redemption of a single maturity of the Bonds.

At its option, to be exercised on or before the forty-fifth (45th) day next preceding any such mandatory redemption date, the County may (i) deliver to the Registration Agent for cancellation Bonds to be redeemed, in any aggregate principal amount desired, and/or (ii) receive a credit in respect of its redemption obligation under this mandatory redemption provision for any Bonds of the maturity to be redeemed which prior to said date have been purchased or redeemed (otherwise than through the operation of this mandatory sinking fund redemption provision) and cancelled by the Registration Agent and not theretofore applied as a credit against any redemption obligation under this mandatory sinking fund provision. Each Bond so delivered or previously purchased or redeemed shall be credited by the Registration Agent at 100% of the principal amount thereof on the obligation of the County on such payment date and any excess shall be credited on future redemption obligations in chronological order, and the principal amount of Bonds to be redeemed by operation of this mandatory sinking fund provision shall be accordingly reduced. The County shall on or before the forty-fifth (45th) day next preceding each payment date furnish the Registration Agent with its certificate indicating whether or not and to what extent the provisions of clauses (i) and (ii) of this subsection are to be availed of with respect to such payment and confirm that funds for the balance of the next succeeding prescribed payment will be paid on or before the next succeeding payment date.

Notice of any call for redemption shall be given by the Registration Agent on behalf of (d) the County not less than twenty (20) nor more than sixty (60) days prior to the date fixed for redemption by sending an appropriate notice to the registered owners of the Bonds to be redeemed by first-class mail, postage prepaid, at the addresses shown on the Bond registration records of the Registration Agent as of the date of the notice; but neither failure to mail such notice nor any defect in any such notice so mailed shall affect the sufficiency of the proceedings for redemption of any of the Bonds for which proper notice was given. The notice may state that it is conditioned upon the deposit of moneys in an amount equal to the amount necessary to effect the redemption with the Registration Agent no later than the redemption date ("Conditional Redemption"). As long as DTC, or a successor Depository, is the registered owner of the Bonds, all redemption notices shall be mailed by the Registration Agent to DTC, or such successor Depository, as the registered owner of the Bonds, as and when above provided, and neither the County nor the Registration Agent shall be responsible for mailing notices of redemption to DTC Participants or Beneficial Owners. Failure of DTC, or any successor Depository, to provide notice to any DTC Participant or Beneficial Owner will not affect the validity of such redemption. The Registration Agent shall mail said notices as and when directed by the County pursuant to written instructions from an authorized representative of the County (other than for a mandatory sinking fund redemption, notices of which shall be given on the dates provided herein) given at least forty-five (45) days prior to the redemption date (unless a shorter notice period shall be satisfactory to the Registration Agent). From and after the redemption date, all Bonds called for redemption shall cease to bear interest if funds are available at the office of the Registration Agent for the payment thereof and if notice has been duly provided as set forth herein. In the case of a Conditional Redemption, the failure of the Municipality to make funds available in part or in whole on or before the redemption date shall not constitute an event of default, and the Registration Agent shall give immediate notice to the Depository, if applicable, or the affected Bondholders that the redemption did not occur and that the Bonds called for redemption and not so paid remain outstanding.

(e) The Governing Body hereby authorizes and directs the County Mayor to appoint the Registration Agent for the Bonds and hereby authorizes the Registration Agent so appointed or the Registration Agent for the Bonds to maintain Bond registration records with respect to the Bonds, to authenticate and deliver the Bonds as provided herein, either at original issuance or upon transfer, to effect transfers of the Bonds, to give all notices of redemption as required herein, to make all payments of

principal and interest with respect to the Bonds as provided herein, to cancel and destroy Bonds which have been paid at maturity or upon earlier redemption or submitted for exchange or transfer, to furnish the County at least annually a certificate of destruction with respect to Bonds cancelled and destroyed, and to furnish the County at least annually an audit confirmation of Bonds paid, Bonds outstanding and payments made with respect to interest on the Bonds. The County Mayor is hereby authorized to execute and the County Clerk is hereby authorized to attest such written agreement between the County and the Registration Agent as they shall deem necessary and proper with respect to the obligations, duties and rights of the Registration Agent. The payment of all reasonable fees and expenses of the Registration Agent for the discharge of its duties and obligations hereunder or under any such agreement is hereby authorized and directed.

The Bonds shall be payable, both principal and interest, in lawful money of the United (f) States of America at the main office of the Registration Agent. The Registration Agent shall make all interest payments with respect to the Bonds by check or draft on each interest payment date directly to the registered owners as shown on the Bond registration records maintained by the Registration Agent as of the close of business on the fifteenth day of the month next preceding the interest payment date (the "Regular Record Date") by depositing said payment in the United States mail, postage prepaid, addressed to such owners at their addresses shown on said Bond registration records, without, except for final payment, the presentation or surrender of such registered Bonds, and all such payments shall discharge the obligations of the County in respect of such Bonds to the extent of the payments so made. Payment of principal of and premium, if any, on the Bonds shall be made upon presentation and surrender of such Bonds to the Registration Agent as the same shall become due and payable. All rates of interest specified herein shall be computed on the basis of a three hundred sixty (360) day year composed of twelve (12) months of thirty (30) days each. In the event the Bonds are no longer registered in the name of DTC, or a successor Depository, if requested by the Owner of at least \$1,000,000 in aggregate principal amount of the Bonds, payment of interest on such Bonds shall be paid by wire transfer to a bank within the continental United States or deposited to a designated account if such account is maintained with the Registration Agent and written notice of any such election and designated account is given to the Registration Agent prior to the record date.

Any interest on any Bond that is payable but is not punctually paid or duly provided for (g) on any interest payment date (hereinafter "Defaulted Interest") shall forthwith cease to be payable to the registered owner on the relevant Regular Record Date; and, in lieu thereof, such Defaulted Interest shall be paid by the County to the persons in whose names the Bonds are registered at the close of business on a date (the "Special Record Date") for the payment of such Defaulted Interest, which shall be fixed in the following manner: the County shall notify the Registration Agent in writing of the amount of Defaulted Interest proposed to be paid on each Bond and the date of the proposed payment, and at the same time the County shall deposit with the Registration Agent an amount of money equal to the aggregate amount proposed to be paid in respect of such Defaulted Interest or shall make arrangements satisfactory to the Registration Agent for such deposit prior to the date of the proposed payment, such money when deposited to be held in trust for the benefit of the persons entitled to such Defaulted Interest as in this Section provided. Thereupon, not less than ten (10) days after the receipt by the Registration Agent of the notice of the proposed payment, the Registration Agent shall fix a Special Record Date for the payment of such Defaulted Interest which date shall be not more than fifteen (15) nor less than ten (10) days prior to the date of the proposed payment to the registered Owners. The Registration Agent shall promptly notify the County of such Special Record Date and, in the name and at the expense of the County, not less than ten (10) days prior to such Special Record Date, shall cause notice of the proposed payment of such Defaulted Interest and the Special Record Date therefor to be mailed, first-class postage prepaid, to each registered owner at the address thereof as it appears in the Bond registration records maintained by the Registration Agent as of the date of such notice. Nothing contained in this Section or in the Bonds shall impair any statutory or other rights in law or in equity of any registered owner arising as a result of the failure of the County to punctually pay or duly provide for the payment of principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds when due.

The Bonds are transferable only by presentation to the Registration Agent by the (h) registered owner, or his legal representative duly authorized in writing, of the registered Bond(s) to be transferred with the form of assignment included therein completed in full and signed with the name of the registered owner as it appears upon the face of the Bond(s) accompanied by appropriate documentation necessary to prove the legal capacity of any legal representative of the registered owner. Upon receipt of the Bond(s) in such form and with such documentation, if any, the Registration Agent shall issue a new Bond or the Bond to the assignee(s) in \$5,000 denominations, or integral multiples thereof, as requested by the registered owner requesting transfer. The Registration Agent shall not be required to transfer or exchange any Bond during the period commencing on a Regular or Special Record Date and ending on the corresponding interest payment date of such Bond, nor to transfer or exchange any Bond after the publication of notice calling such Bond for redemption has been made, nor to transfer or exchange any Bond during the period following the receipt of instructions from the County to call such Bond for redemption; provided, the Registration Agent, at its option, may make transfers after any of said dates. No charge shall be made to any registered owner for the privilege of transferring any Bond, provided that any transfer tax relating to such transaction shall be paid by the registered owner requesting transfer. The person in whose name any Bond shall be registered shall be deemed and regarded as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes and neither the County nor the Registration Agent shall be affected by any notice to the contrary whether or not any payments due on the Bonds shall be overdue. The Bonds, upon surrender to the Registration Agent, may, at the option of the registered owner, be exchanged for an equal aggregate principal amount of the Bonds of the same maturity in any authorized denomination or denominations.

(i) The Bonds shall be executed in such manner as may be prescribed by applicable law, in the name, and on behalf, of the County with the signature of the County Mayor and the attestation of the County Clerk.

(j) Except as otherwise provided in this resolution, the Bonds shall be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of DTC, which will act as securities depository for the Bonds. References in this Section to a Bond or the Bonds shall be construed to mean the Bond or the Bonds that are held under the Book-Entry System. One Bond for each maturity of the Bonds shall be issued to DTC and immobilized in its custody or a custodian of DTC. The Bond Registrar is a custodian and agent for DTC, and the Bond will be immobilized in its custody. A Book-Entry System shall be employed, evidencing ownership of the Bonds in authorized denominations, with transfers of beneficial ownership effected on the records of DTC and the DTC Participants pursuant to rules and procedures established by DTC.

Each DTC Participant shall be credited in the records of DTC with the amount of such DTC Participant's interest in the Bonds. Beneficial ownership interests in the Bonds may be purchased by or through DTC Participants. The holders of these beneficial ownership interests are hereinafter referred to as the "Beneficial Owners." The Beneficial Owners shall not receive the Bonds representing their beneficial ownership interests. The ownership interests of each Beneficial Owner shall be recorded through the records of the DTC Participant from which such Beneficial Owner purchased its Bonds. Transfers of ownership interests in the Bonds shall be accomplished by book entries made by DTC and, in turn, by DTC Participants acting on behalf of Beneficial Owners. SO LONG AS CEDE & CO., AS NOMINEE FOR DTC, IS THE REGISTERED OWNER OF THE BONDS, THE REGISTRATION AGENT SHALL TREAT CEDE & CO. AS THE ONLY HOLDER OF THE BONDS FOR ALL PURPOSES UNDER THIS RESOLUTION, INCLUDING RECEIPT OF ALL PRINCIPAL OF, PREMIUM, IF ANY, AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS, RECEIPT OF NOTICES, VOTING AND

REQUESTING OR DIRECTING THE REGISTRATION AGENT TO TAKE OR NOT TO TAKE, OR CONSENTING TO, CERTAIN ACTIONS UNDER THIS RESOLUTION.

Payments of principal, interest, and redemption premium, if any, with respect to the Bonds, so long as DTC is the only owner of the Bonds, shall be paid by the Registration Agent directly to DTC or its nominee, Cede & Co., as provided in the Letter of Representation relating to the Bonds from the County and the Registration Agent to DTC (the "Letter of Representation"). DTC shall remit such payments to DTC Participants, and such payments thereafter shall be paid by DTC Participants to the Beneficial Owners. The County and the Registration Agent shall not be responsible or liable for payment by DTC or DTC Participants for sending transaction statements or for maintaining, supervising or reviewing records maintained by DTC or DTC Participants.

In the event that (1) DTC determines not to continue to act as securities depository for the Bonds, or (2) to the extent permitted by the rules of DTC, the County determines that the continuation of the Book-Entry System of evidence and transfer of ownership of the Bonds would adversely affect their interests or the interests of the Beneficial Owners of the Bonds, then the County shall discontinue the Book-Entry System with DTC or, upon request of such original purchaser, deliver the Bonds to the original purchaser in the form of fully-registered Bonds, as the case may be. If the County fails to identify another qualified securities depository to replace DTC, the County shall cause the Registration Agent to authenticate and deliver replacement Bonds in the form of fully-registered Bonds to each Beneficial Owner. If the purchaser(s) certifies that it intends to hold the Bonds for its own account, then the County may issue certificated Bonds without the utilization of DTC and the Book-Entry System.

THE COUNTY AND THE REGISTRATION AGENT SHALL NOT HAVE ANY RESPONSIBILITY OR OBLIGATIONS TO ANY PARTICIPANT OR ANY BENEFICIAL OWNER WITH RESPECT TO (i) THE BONDS; (ii) THE ACCURACY OF ANY RECORDS MAINTAINED BY DTC OR ANY DTC PARTICIPANT; (iii) THE PAYMENT BY DTC OR ANY DTC PARTICIPANT OF ANY AMOUNT DUE TO ANY BENEFICIAL OWNER IN RESPECT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS; (iv) THE DELIVERY OR TIMELINESS OF DELIVERY BY DTC OR ANY DTC PARTICIPANT OF ANY NOTICE DUE TO ANY BENEFICIAL OWNER THAT IS REQUIRED OR PERMITTED UNDER THE TERMS OF THIS RESOLUTION TO BE GIVEN TO BENEFICIAL OWNERS; (v) THE SELECTION OF BENEFICIAL OWNERS TO RECEIVE PAYMENTS IN THE EVENT OF ANY PARTIAL REDEMPTION OF THE BONDS; OR (vi) ANY CONSENT GIVEN OR OTHER ACTION TAKEN BY DTC OR ITS NOMINEE, CEDE & CO., AS OWNER.

(k) The Registration Agent is hereby authorized to take such action as may be necessary from time to time to qualify and maintain the Bonds for deposit with DTC, including but not limited to, wire transfers of interest and principal payments with respect to the Bonds, utilization of electronic book entry data received from DTC in place of actual delivery of Bonds and provision of notices with respect to Bonds registered by DTC (or any of its designees identified to the Registration Agent) by overnight delivery, courier service, telegram, telecopy or other similar means of communication. No such arrangements with DTC may adversely affect the interest of any of the owners of the Bonds; provided, however, that the Registration Agent shall not be liable with respect to any such arrangements it may make pursuant to this Section.

(1) The Registration Agent is hereby authorized to authenticate and deliver the Bonds to the original purchaser, upon receipt by the County of the proceeds of the sale thereof and to authenticate and deliver Bonds in exchange for Bonds of the same principal amount delivered for transfer upon receipt of the Bond(s) to be transferred in proper form with proper documentation as hereinabove described. The

Bonds shall not be valid for any purpose unless authenticated by the Registration Agent by the manual signature of an officer thereof on the certificate set forth herein on the Bond form.

(m) In case any Bond shall become mutilated, or be lost, stolen, or destroyed, the County, in its discretion, shall issue, and the Registration Agent, upon written direction from the County, shall authenticate and deliver, a new Bond of like tenor, amount, maturity and date, in exchange and substitution for, and upon the cancellation of, the mutilated Bond, or in lieu of and in substitution for such lost, stolen or destroyed Bond, or if any such Bond shall have matured or shall be able to mature, instead of issuing a substituted Bond the County may pay or authorize payment of such Bond without surrender thereof. In every case, the applicant shall furnish evidence satisfactory to the County and the Registration Agent; and the County may charge the applicant for the issue of such new Bond an amount sufficient to reimburse the County for the expense incurred by it in the issue thereof.

<u>Section 5.</u> <u>Source of Payment</u>. The Bonds shall be payable from unlimited ad valorem taxes to be levied on all taxable property within the County. For the prompt payment of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds, the full faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged.

DTC shall remit such payments to DTC Participants, and such payments thereafter shall be paid by DTC Participants to the Beneficial Owners, as defined in the Resolution. Neither the County nor the Registration Agent shall be responsible or liable for payment by DTC or DTC Participants, for sending transaction statements or for maintaining, supervising or reviewing records maintained by DTC or DTC Participants. From and after any redemption date, all Bonds called for redemption shall cease to bear interest if funds are available at the office of the Registration Agent for the payment thereof and it notice has been duly provided as set forth in the Resolution, as hereafter defined. In the case of a Conditional Redemption, the failure of the Municipality to make funds available in part or in whole on or before the redemption date shall not constitute an event of default, and the Registration Agent shall give immediate notice to the Depository, if applicable, or the affected Bondholders that the redemption did not occur and that the Bonds called for redemption and not so paid remain outstanding.

This Bond is transferable by the registered owner hereof in person or by such owner's attorney duly authorized in writing at the principal corporate trust office of the Registration Agent set forth on the front side hereof, but only in the manner, subject to limitations and upon payment of the charges provided in the Resolution, as hereafter defined, and upon surrender and cancellation of this Bond. Upon such transfer, a new Bond or Bonds of authorized denominations of the same maturity and interest rate for the same aggregate principal amount will be issued to the transferee in exchange therefor. The person in whose name this Bond is registered shall be deemed and regarded as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes and neither the County nor the Registration Agent shall be affected by any notice to the contrary whether or not any payments due on the Bond shall be overdue. Bonds, upon surrender to the Registration Agent, may, at the option of the registered owner thereof, be exchanged for an equal aggregate principal amount of the Bonds of the same maturity in authorized denomination or denominations, upon the terms set forth in the Resolution. The Registration Agent shall not be required to transfer or exchange any Bond during the period commencing on a Regular Record Date or Special Record Date and ending on the corresponding interest payment date of such Bond, nor to transfer or exchange any Bond after the notice calling such Bond for redemption has been made, nor during a period following the receipt of instructions from the County to call such Bond for redemption.

This Bond is one of a total authorized issue aggregating \$______ and issued by the County for the purposes of providing funds for: (i) constructing, improving, repairing, renovating and equipping of courtroom, corrective and detention facilities, schools and other educational facilities, libraries, stormwater drainage facilities, parks and recreations facilities and other public buildings, including any equipment required therefor; (ii) constructing and improving roads, streets, bridges and highways; (iii) payment of legal, fiscal, administrative, architectural and engineering costs incident to all of the foregoing (collectively, the "Projects"); (iv) reimbursement to the appropriate fund of the County for prior

expenditures for the foregoing costs, if applicable; and (v) payment of costs incident to the issuance of the bonds authorized therein, pursuant to 9-21-101, <u>et seq</u>., Tennessee Code Annotated, as amended, and pursuant to resolutions adopted by the Board of County Commissioners of the County on October 24, 2019 and January 14, 2020 (the "Resolution").

The Bonds shall be payable from unlimited ad valorem taxes to be levied on all taxable property within the County. For the prompt payment of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds, the full faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged.

This Bond and the income therefrom are exempt from all present state, county and municipal taxes in Tennessee except (a) Tennessee excise taxes on interest on the Bond during the period the Bond is held or beneficially owned by any organization or entity, other than a sole proprietorship or general partnership, doing business in the State of Tennessee, and (b) Tennessee franchise taxes by reason of the inclusion of the book value of the Bond in Tennessee franchise tax base of any organization or entity, other than a sole proprietorship or general partnership, doing business in the State of Tennessee franchise tax base of any organization or entity, other than a sole proprietorship or general partnership, doing business in the State of Tennessee.

It is hereby certified, recited, and declared that all acts, conditions and things required to exist, happen and be performed precedent to and in the issuance of this Bond exist, happen and be performed in due time, form and manner as required by law, and that the amount of this Bond, together with all other indebtedness of the County, does not exceed any limitation prescribed by the constitution and statutes of the State of Tennessee.

Section 7. Levy of Tax. The County, through its Governing Body, shall annually levy and collect a tax upon all taxable property within the County, in addition to all other taxes authorized by law, sufficient to pay principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds when due, and for that purpose there is hereby levied a direct annual tax in such amount as may be found necessary each year to pay principal and interest coming due on the Bonds in said year. Principal and interest falling due at any time when there are insufficient funds from this tax levy on hand shall be paid from the current funds of the County and reimbursement therefor shall be made out of the taxes hereby provided to the levied when the same shall have been collected. The tax herein provided may be reduced to the extent of any direct appropriations from other funds, taxes and revenues of the County to the payment of debt service on the Bonds.

Section 8. Sale of Bonds.

(a) The Bonds shall be offered for competitive public sale in one or more series, at a price of not less than 98.0% of par, plus accrued interest, as a whole or in part from time to time as shall be determined by the County Mayor, in consultation with the Municipal Advisor. The Bonds, or any series thereof, shall be sold by delivery of bids via physical delivery, mail, fax, or telephone or by electronic bidding means of an Internet bidding service as shall be determined by the County Mayor, in consultation with the Municipal Advisor.

(b) If the Bonds are sold in more than one series, the County Mayor is authorized to cause to be sold in each series an aggregate principal amount of Bonds less than that shown in Section 4 hereof for each series, so long as the total aggregate principal amount of all series issued does not exceed the total aggregate of Bonds authorized to be issued herein.

(c) The County Mayor is further authorized with respect to each series of Bonds to:

(1) change the dated date of the Bonds, or any series thereof, to a date other than the date of issuance of the Bonds;

(2) change the designation of the Bonds, or any series thereof, to a designation other than "General Obligation Bonds" and to specify the series designation of the Bonds, or any series thereof;

(3) establish the first interest payment date on the Bonds, or any series thereof, provided that such date is not later than twelve months from the dated date of such series of Bonds;

(4) establish and adjust the principal and interest payment dates and the maturity amounts of the Bonds, or any series thereof, provided that (A) the total principal amount of all series of Bonds does not exceed the total amount of Bonds authorized herein; (B) the final maturity date of each series shall not be later than thirty (30) years from the date of issuance of each series of the Bonds and (C) the debt service on any series of the Bonds shall not result in balloon indebtedness that requires the approval of the Director of State and Local Finance.

(5) Establish, adjust or remove the County's optional redemption provisions of each series of the Bonds, provided that the premium amount to be paid on Bonds or any series thereof does not exceed two percent (2%) of the principal amount thereof;

(6) sell the Bonds, or any series thereof, or any maturities thereof as Term Bonds with mandatory redemption requirements corresponding to the maturities set forth herein or as otherwise determined by the County Mayor, as he shall deem most advantageous to the County; and

(7) cause all or a portion of the Bonds to be insured by a bond insurance policy issued by a nationally recognized bond insurance company if such insurance is requested and paid for by the winning bidder of the Bonds, or any series thereof.

The form of the Bond set forth in Section 6 hereof shall be conformed to reflect any changes made pursuant to this Section 8 hereof.

(d) The County Mayor is authorized to sell the Bonds, or any series thereof, simultaneously with any other bonds or notes authorized by resolution or resolutions of the Governing Body. The County Mayor is further authorized to sell the Bonds, or any series thereof, as a single issue of bonds with any other bonds with substantially similar terms authorized by resolution or resolutions of the Governing Body, in one or more series as the County Mayor shall deem to be advantageous to the County and in doing so, the County Mayor is authorized to change the designation of the Bonds to a designation other than "General Obligation Bonds"; provided, however, that the total aggregate principal amount of combined bonds to be sold does not exceed the total aggregate principal amount of Bonds authorized by this resolution or bonds authorized by any other resolution or resolutions adopted by the Governing Body.

(e) The County Mayor is authorized to award the Bonds, or any series thereof, in each case to the bidder whose bid results in the lowest true interest cost to the County, provided the rate or rates on the Bonds does not exceed the maximum rate prescribed by Section 4 hereof. The award of the Bonds by the County Mayor to the lowest bidder shall be binding on the County, and no further action of the Governing Body with respect thereto shall be required.

(f) The County Mayor and County Clerk are authorized to cause the Bonds, in book-entry form (except as otherwise permitted herein), to be authenticated and delivered by the Registration Agent to the successful bidder and to execute, publish, and deliver all certificates and documents, including an official statement and closing certificates, as they shall deem necessary in connection with the sale and delivery of the Bonds.

(g) The Governing Body finds that the publication of the Initial Resolution in a newspaper of general circulation in the County occurred as required by applicable law and that twenty (20) days has passed from the date of publication thereof, and no legally sufficient petition, as defined by Section 9-21-207, Tennessee Code Annotated, was filed within such 20-day period.

<u>Section 9.</u> <u>Disposition of Bond Proceeds</u>. The proceeds of the sale of the Bonds shall be disbursed as follows:

(a) all accrued interest, if any, shall be deposited to the appropriate fund of the County to be used to pay interest on the Bonds on the first interest payment date following delivery of the Bonds; and

the remainder of the proceeds of the sale of the Bonds shall be deposited with a financial (b) institution regulated by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or similar federal agency in a special fund known as the 2019 Construction Fund (the "Construction Fund"), or such other designation as shall be determined by the County Mayor to be kept separate and apart from all other funds of the County. The County shall disburse funds in the Construction Fund to pay costs of issuance of the Bonds, including necessary legal, accounting and fiscal expenses, printing, engraving, advertising and similar expenses, administrative and clerical costs, Registration Agent fees, bond insurance premiums, if any, and other necessary miscellaneous expenses incurred in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds. Notwithstanding the foregoing, costs of issuance of the Bonds may be withheld from the good faith deposit or purchase price of the Bonds and paid to the Municipal Advisor to be used to pay costs of issuance of the Bonds. The remaining funds in the Construction Fund shall be disbursed solely to pay the costs of the Projects and to reimburse the County for any funds previously expended for costs of the Projects. Money in the Construction Fund shall be secured in the manner prescribed by applicable statutes relative to the securing of public or trust funds, if any, or, in the absence of such a statute, by a pledge of readily marketable securities having at all times a market value of not less than the amount in said Construction Fund. Money in the Construction Fund shall be invested at the direction of the Finance Director in such investments as shall be permitted by applicable law to the extent permitted by applicable law.

Section 10. Official Statement. The officers of the County, or any of them, are hereby authorized and directed to provide for the preparation and distribution of a Preliminary Official Statement describing the Bonds. After bids have been received and the Bonds have been awarded, the officers of the County, or any of them, shall make such completions, omissions, insertions and changes in the Preliminary Official Statement not inconsistent with this resolution as are necessary or desirable to complete it as a final Official Statement for purposes of Rule 15c2-12(e)(3) of the Securities and Exchange Commission. The officers of the County, or any of them, shall arrange for the delivery to the successful bidder on the Bonds of a reasonable number of copies of the Official Statement within seven business days after the Bonds have been awarded for delivery, by the successful bidder on the Bonds, to each potential investor requesting a copy of the Official Statement and to each person to whom such bidder and members of his bidding group initially sell the Bonds.

The County Mayor and the County Clerk, or either of them, are authorized, on behalf of the County, to deem the Preliminary Official Statement and the Official Statement in final form, each to be final as of its date within the meaning of Rule 15c2-12(b)(1), except for the omission in the Preliminary Official Statement of certain pricing and other information allowed to be omitted pursuant to such Rule 15c2-12(b)(1). The distribution of the Preliminary Official Statement and the Official Statement in final form shall be conclusive evidence that each has been deemed in final form as of its date by the County except for the omission in the Preliminary Official Statement of such pricing and other information.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, no Official Statement is required to be prepared if the Bonds, or any series thereof, are purchased by a purchaser that certifies that such purchaser intends to hold the Bonds, or any series thereof, for its own account and has no present intention to reoffer the Bonds, or any series thereof.

<u>Section 11.</u> <u>Discharge and Satisfaction of Bonds</u>. If the County shall pay and discharge the indebtedness evidenced by any series of the Bonds in any one or more of the following ways:

(a) By paying or causing to be paid, by deposit of sufficient funds as and when required with the Registration Agent, the principal of and interest on such Bonds as and when the same become due and payable;

(b) By depositing or causing to be deposited with any trust company or financial institution whose deposits are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or similar federal agency and which has trust powers (an "Agent"; which agent may be the Registration Agent) in trust or escrow, on or before the date of maturity or redemption, sufficient money or Defeasance Obligations, as hereafter defined, the principal of and interest on which, when due and payable, will provide sufficient moneys to pay or redeem such Bonds and to pay interest thereon when due until the maturity or redemption date (provided, if such Bonds are to be redeemed prior to maturity thereof, proper notice of such redemption shall have been given or adequate provision shall have been made for the giving of such notice); or

(c) By delivering such Bonds to the Registration Agent for cancellation by it;

and if the County shall also pay or cause to be paid all other sums payable hereunder by the County with respect to such Bonds, or make adequate provision therefor, and by resolution of the Governing Body instruct any such Escrow Agent to pay amounts when and as required to the Registration Agent for the payment of principal of and interest on such Bonds when due, then and in that case the indebtedness evidenced by such Bonds shall be discharged and satisfied and all covenants, agreements and obligations of the County to the holders of such Bonds shall be fully discharged and satisfied and shall thereupon cease, terminate and become void.

If the County shall pay and discharge the indebtedness evidenced by any of the Bonds in the manner provided in either clause (a) or clause (b) above, then the registered owners thereof shall thereafter be entitled only to payment out of the money or Defeasance Obligations deposited as aforesaid.

Except as otherwise provided in this Section, neither Defeasance Obligations nor moneys deposited with the Registration Agent pursuant to this Section nor principal or interest payments on any such Defeasance Obligations shall be withdrawn or used for any purpose other than, and shall be held in trust for, the payment of the principal and interest on said Bonds; provided that any cash received from such principal or interest payments on such Defeasance Obligations deposited with the Registration Agent, (A) to the extent such cash will not be required at any time for such purpose, shall be paid over to the County as received by the Registration Agent and (B) to the extent such cash will be required for such purpose at a later date, shall, to the extent practicable, be reinvested in Defeasance Obligations maturing at times and in amounts sufficient to pay when due the principal and interest to become due on said Bonds on or prior to such redemption date or maturity date thereof, as the case may be, and interest earned from such reinvestments shall be paid over to the County, as received by the Registration Agent. For the purposes of this Section, Defeasance Obligations shall direct obligations of, or obligations, the principal of and interest on which are guaranteed by, the United States of America, or obligations of any agency or instrumentality of the United States, which obligations shall not be subject to redemption prior to their maturity other than at the option of the registered owner thereof.

Section 12. Federal Tax Matters Related to the Bonds.

(a) The County intends that the Bonds will be issued as tax-exempt bonds under the Code. If so issued, the County hereby covenants that it will take all such actions as are necessary under the Code so that the Bonds will qualify and continue to qualify for such tax-exemption, including, without limitation, not permitting the use of any proceeds of the Bonds in a manner that would cause the Bonds to be subjected to treatment under Section 148 of the Code, and applicable regulations thereunder, as an "arbitrage bond". The County further covenants that it will, throughout the term of the Bonds and through the date that the final rebate, if any, must be made to the United States in accordance with Section 148 of the Code, comply with the provisions of Sections 103 and 141 through 150 of the Code and all regulations proposed and promulgated thereunder that must be satisfied in order that interest on the Bonds shall be and continue to be excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes under Section 103 of the Code.

(b) It is reasonably expected that the County will reimburse itself for certain expenditures made by it in connection with the Projects by issuing the Bonds. This resolution shall be placed in the minutes of the Governing Body and shall be made available for inspection by the general public at the office of the Governing Body. This resolution constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

(c) The appropriate officers of the County are authorized and directed, on behalf of the County, to execute and deliver all such certificates and documents that may be required of the County in order to comply with the provisions of this Section related to the issuance of the Bonds and to administer the County's Federal Tax Compliance Policies and Procedures with respect to the Bonds.

Section 13. Continuing Disclosure. The County hereby covenants and agrees that it will provide annual financial information and material event notices if and as required by Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities Exchange Commission for the Bonds. The County Mayor is authorized to execute at the Closing of the sale of the Bonds an agreement for the benefit of and enforceable by the owners of the Bonds specifying the details of the financial information and material event notices to be provided and its

obligations relating thereto. Failure of the County to comply with the undertaking herein described and to be detailed in said closing agreement shall not be a default hereunder, but any such failure shall entitle the owner or owners of any of the Bonds to take such actions and to initiate such proceedings as shall be necessary and appropriate to cause the County to comply with their undertaking as set forth herein and in said agreement, including the remedies of mandamus and specific performance.

<u>Section 14.</u> <u>Reasonably Expected Economic Life</u>. The "reasonably expected economic life" of the Project within the meaning of Sections 9-21-101, <u>et seq</u>., Tennessee Code Annotated, is greater than the term of the Bonds authorized herein.

<u>Section 15.</u> <u>Resolution a Contract</u>. The provisions of this resolution shall constitute a contract between the County and the registered owners of the Bonds, and after the issuance of the Bonds, no change, variation or alteration of any kind in the provisions of this resolution shall be made in any manner until such time as the Bonds and interest due thereon shall have been paid in full.

<u>Section 16.</u> <u>Separability</u>. If any section, paragraph or provision of this resolution shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this resolution.

<u>Section 17.</u> <u>Repeal of Conflicting Resolutions and Effective Date</u>. All other resolutions and orders, or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this resolution, including Resolution 19-18 of the Governing Body, are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed and this resolution shall be in immediate effect from and after its adoption.

<u>Section 18.</u> <u>Ratification of Prior Actions</u>. All actions taken in furtherance of the issuance of the Bonds by the County Mayor and/or the County Clerk or the Municipal Advisor on behalf of the County prior to the date hereof, are hereby ratified and affirmed. Without limitation, all actions of the Municipal Advisor to arrange for the publication of the Initial Resolution, which actions are hereby found to have been taken within the scope of the Municipal Advisor's normal scope of services to the County, are hereby ratified and confirmed. The County Clerk is hereby authorized to correct the certification form attached to the Initial Resolution to note that such Initial Resolution was adopted at a regular meeting of the Governing Body.

This Resolution shall be in immediate effect from and after its adoption, the public welfare requiring it.




DIVISION OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT AUDIT









General Fund Fund Balances

Summary of Audit Findings

Annual Financial Report Hamblen County, Tennessee For the Year Ended June 30, 2019

Scope

We have audited the basic financial statements of Hamblen County as of and for the year ended June 30, 2019.

Results

Our report on Hamblen County's financial statements is unmodified.

Our audit resulted in three findings, which we have reviewed with Hamblen County management. The detailed findings, recommendations, and management's responses are included in the Single Audit section of this report.

Finding

The following are summaries of the audit findings:

OFFICE OF TRUSTEE - FORMER TRUSTEE JOHN BASKETTE

- Former county trustee did not maintain county funds in interest-bearing accounts.
- Former county trustee entered into a contract without the county commission's approval.
- Discrepancies in the operations of the Trustee's Office disclosed in Investigative Report.

In Accordance with Tennessee Code Annotated (T.C.A.) Section 9-3-405 Section 5 the duties of the Audit Committee are:

(a) To carefully review, upon completion of the county's annual audit, all audit findings in audit report and consult with the external auditors regarding any irregularities and deficiencies disclosed in the annual audit. The Audit Committee is empowered to meet with management to discuss audit findings and/or disagreements with the external auditors. The committee should satisfy itself that appropriate and timely corrective action has been taken by management to remedy any identified weaknesses. The committee should determine what corrective action, if any, should be recommended to the County Commission.

(b) To consider the effectiveness of the internal control system, including information technology security and control, review the effectiveness of the system for monitoring compliance with laws and regulations, and review the process for communicating the county's ethics policies to county personnel and monitoring compliance therewith.

(c) To establish a process by which employees, taxpayers, or other citizens may confidentially report suspected illegal, improper, wasteful or fraudulent activity under provisions of T.C.A. § 9-3-406.

(d) To annually present a written committee report detailing how it discharged its duties and any committee recommendations to the full County Commission

Best Places to Work in Manufacturing – 2019 Edition

Finding steady income in a reliable sector is an important consideration for where Americans decide to put down roots and take out a mortgage. The manufacturing industry, one such robust sector, accounts for 8% of the U.S. workforce. Those 12.8 million employees are scattered nationwide, the percentage of the local workforce consisting of manufacturing workers is higher in some places than in others. That's why SmartAsset uncovered the best places to work in manufacturing in the U.S.

In this study, we examined the best places to work in manufacturing by considering the percentage of the workforce employed by the manufacturing industry, job and income growth and how average incomes compare to median annual housing costs in each metro area. For more information on our data sources and how we put all the information together to create our final rankings, check out the Data and Methodology section below.

Key Findings

- The Midwest and South rank well. Of the top 10 places to work in manufacturing, three are in the Midwest, and the remaining seven are in the South. Moreover, there are 11 Midwestern states and 11 Southern states in the top 25. The metro areas in these regions excel at job growth and income growth for manufacturing workers.
- The fluctuation in manufacturing jobs varies greatly by place. On average, across the 376 areas in our study, manufacturing jobs have increased by more than 4% from 2014 through 2017. Yet, this growth is not evenly distributed. During this time period, 21 metro areas in our study saw the number of manufacturing jobs increase by more than 20%, while eight metro areas saw a decrease of over 20%.



1. Elkhart-Goshen, IN

Manufacturing is the largest industry in Elkhart-Goshen, Indiana, employing 55.2% of the workforce, the highest percentage for this metric out of the 376 metro areas in our study. In 2017, there were almost 73,000 manufacturing workers, an increase of about 20.5% from $2014 - \text{the } 19^{\text{th}}\text{-highest}$ increase in the study overall – and about 6.4% from $2016 - \text{the } 60^{\text{th}}\text{-highest}$ increase in the study.

2. Greenville, NC

Though the manufacturing industry in Greenville, North Carolina is much smaller than in Elkhart-Goshen, it has grown substantially over the past several years. In 2014, there were a total of 5,319 manufacturing workers, and in 2017, there were 7,521, marking an increase of more than 40% over that four-year period. Additionally, from 2016 to 2017 alone, the number of manufacturing jobs in Greenville grew by 30.8% – the biggest increase for this metric across all 376 metro areas in our study.

3. Elizabethtown-Fort Knox, KY

Elizabethtown-Fort Knox, Kentucky has seen relatively substantial growth in the number of manufacturing jobs in recent years. According to Census Data, the number of manufacturing jobs in the Elizabethtown metro area increased from 2014 through 2017 by 27.3%, the ninth-highest increase of any area in the study. Furthermore, from 2016 to 2017, there was an increase of 11.9%, the 16th-highest increase overall. Average incomes for manufacturing workers also grew by 6.6%, from just over \$50,000 in 2016 to almost \$53,500 in 2017.

4. Spartanburg, SC

Spartanburg, South Carolina ranks in the top third of metro areas for all six metrics we considered. Specifically, 2017 data from the County Business Patterns Survey shows that a whopping 23.7% of the workforce was employed by the manufacturing industry, the 17th-highest percentage of any metro area in our study. Additionally, we estimated that annual housing costs in the metro area are only 15.8% of average incomes for manufacturing workers, the 44th-best rate for affordability across all 376 metro areas in our study.

5. Jonesboro, AR

Job and income growth for manufacturing workers in Jonesboro, Arkansas has been strong in recent years. Between 2016 and 2017, the number of manufacturing jobs grew by 10.3%, and average incomes for manufacturing workers increased by 4.4%. Over the four years leading up to 2017, manufacturing jobs grew by 17.4%, and average incomes increased by 9.0%. Those employed in the manufacturing industry who have kids are in luck: Jonesboro ranks as one of the top places for working parents.

6. Morristown, TN

From 2014 to 2017, the number of manufacturing jobs in Morristown, Tennessee increased by 12.7%, the 56th-highest rate for this metric across all 376 metro areas in our study. That growth contributes to the fact that Morristown has the second-largest percentage of its workforce employed by the manufacturing industry of any area in our top 10, following only our No. 1 metro area, Elkhart-Goshen. In 2017, more than 12,000 residents in the Morristown metro area worked in manufacturing, which equals almost a third of its total workforce.

7. Greenville-Anderson-Mauldin, SC

Greenville-Anderson-Mauldin, South Carolina ranks in the top third of all 376 metro areas in our study for all six metrics. It has the 89th-highest percentage of its workforce employed by the manufacturing industry and ranks 103rd- and 100th- best out of 376 for its large one-year and four-year increases in number of manufacturing jobs. It also ranks within the top 10% of the study for four-year income growth from 2014 through 2017, at 13.4%.

8. Athens-Clarke County, GA

Athens-Clarke County, Georgia stands out as one of the best places to work in manufacturing because of its strong job growth in recent years. From 2014 to 2017, the number of manufacturing jobs increased by 32.5%, the seventh-highest increase of any area in the study. Moreover, from just 2016 to 2017, the number of manufacturing jobs increased by 22.0%, the sixth-highest rate across all 376 metro areas in our study.

9. Rockford, IL

The number of manufacturing jobs in Rockford, Illinois has remained relatively flat over the past several years. Though they had a slight increase of 0.6% from 2016 to 2017, over a longer time period of 2014 through 2017, the number of manufacturing jobs decreased by 0.5%. Despite this, Rockford performs in the top 20% of the study for the four other metrics we considered, which contributes to its No. 9 spot overall. About 24.3% of the workforce worked in manufacturing in 2017, and average incomes increased by 11.2% from 2016 to 2017, the highest increase of any metro in our top 10 and 19th-highest overall.

10. Lima, OH

Though average incomes for manufacturing workers have remained relatively flat in Lima, Ohio over the past several years, they are high relative to the other metro areas we considered in this study. In 2017, the average income for a worker in manufacturing in Lima was almost \$64,000. Due to high income and lower housing costs, housing costs as a percentage of average income for manufacturing workers is the lowest of any metro in our top 10 and 22nd-lowest overall. We estimate that annual housing costs make up only 13.8% of the average income for a manufacturing worker in Lima.

Our analysis also includes two metrics that are not on this table: four-year manufacturing job growth and four-year Income growth for manufacturing workers.

Note: Tie indicates that these metro areas scored the same average ranking across all metrics analyzed.

Data and Methodology


In last year's study on the best places to work in manufacturing, we looked at 480 metro and micro areas. This year, we considered only metro areas, looking at 376 of them for which complete data was available. We considered the following six factors:

- Manufacturing as a percentage of the workforce. This is the percentage of all workers employed by manufacturing firms. Data comes from the Census Bureau's 2017 County Business Patterns Survey.
- Four-year job growth. This is the percentage change in the number of people employed by manufacturing firms from 2014 through 2017. Data comes from the Census Bureau's 2014 County Business Patterns Survey and Census Bureau's 2017 County Business Patterns Survey.
- One-year job growth. This is the percentage change in the number of people employed by manufacturing firms from 2016 to 2017. Data comes from the Census Bureau's 2016 County Business Patterns Survey and Census Bureau's 2017 County Business Patterns Survey.
- Four-year income growth. This is the percentage change in manufacturing workers' average incomes from 2014 through 2017. Data comes from the Census Bureau's 2014 County Business Patterns Survey and Census Bureau's 2017 County Business Patterns Survey.
- One-year income growth. This is the percentage change in manufacturing workers' average incomes from 2016 to 2017. Data comes from the Census Bureau's 2016 County Business Patterns Survey and Census Bureau's 2017 County Business Patterns Survey.
- Housing costs as a percentage of average income for manufacturing workers. Data on median housing costs comes from the Census Bureau's 2018 1-year American Community Survey. Data on the average income for manufacturing workers comes from the Census Bureau's 2017 County Business Patterns Survey.

First, we ranked each metro area in every metric, giving all metrics an equal weighting except manufacturing as a percentage of the workforce, which was double weighted. We then found each area's average ranking and used the average to determine a final score. The metro area with the highest average ranking received a score of 100. The metro area with the lowest average ranking received a score of 0.

RESOLUTION 20-02

A RESOLUTION TO AMEND SECTION 7.4 DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS FOR AUTOMOBILE WRECKING, JUNK, SALVAGE YARDS, AND DUMPS AND SECTION 9.7 ENVIRONMENTAL INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT (I-2) OF THE HAMBLEN COUNTY ZONING RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Hamblen County Board of Commissioners, in accordance with Section 13-7-105 of the Tennessee Code Annotated, may amend the "Zoning Resolution of Hamblen County, Tennessee", and

WHEREAS, the Hamblen County Regional Planning Commission and the Morristown Municipal/Regional Planning Commission have reviewed and made recommendations regarding the proposed amendment of the "Zoning Resolution of Hamblen County, Tennessee", in accordance with Section 13-7-105(a) of the Tennessee Code Annotated; and

WHEREAS, public notice has been provided in a newspaper of general circulation for the public hearing to be held by the Hamblen County Board of Commissioners to consider such zoning amendment of the "Zoning Resolution of Hamblen County, Tennessee" with a complete summary of such amendment, in accordance with Section 13-7-105(b) of the Tennessee Code Annotated; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Hamblen County, Tennessee:

Section 7.4 be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

- 7.4 Development Standards for Automobile Wrecking, Junk and Salvage vards and dumps. Because of the nature and character of their operations, automobile wrecking and salvage yards, junkyards and similar uses of land can have a decidedly detrimental effect upon surrounding properties. Salvage and wrecking yards tend to create problems of noise, dust, traffic and health hazards and may adversely affect property values by their general appearance. The following standards shall be used as a guide in evaluating whether proposed land uses, such as those outlined above, will have properly minimized their objectionable characteristics:
 - A. These uses are only permitted in the I-2, Environmental Industrial District. See Article II, Section 9.7.C and D. for set back and other dimensional regulations.
 - B. All motor vehicles stored or kept in such yards shall be so kept that they will not catch or hold water in which mosquitoes may breed or so that they will not constitute a place or places in which rats, mice, or other vermin may be harbored, reared or propagated.

- C. Because of the tendency for salvage yards, Junkyard or automobile wrecking yards to promote the breeding of vermin, no such operation shall be permitted closer than five hundred (500) feet from any established residence.
- All automobile wrecking, junk and salvage yards located on a county road shall be conducted entirely within either an enclosed opaque fence, screen, or wall, except driveway areas, from eight (8) feet to twelve (12) feet in height or a screen or wall composed of white pine, eastern hemlocks, scotch pines or Leland cypress trees, no less than five (5) in height at planting, at ten (10) intervals between tree trunks along the fence lines, excepting driveways areas. Any fence, screen or wall for screening purposes shall be properly painted or otherwise maintained in good condition. Any material associated with the operations, as defined in Article V. Definitions, pertaining to junkyards shall not exceed a maximum of twelve (12) feet in height
- E. All such yards shall be so maintained as to be in a sanitary condition and so as not to be a menace to the public health or safety.
- F. Off Road Parking No vehicles may be parked outside of the fence, screen or wall.
- G. Ingress and Egress The number of vehicular access driveways permitted on any single street frontage shall be limited to:
 - 1. One (1) driveway where the parcel to be used has a maximum road or street frontage of one hundred (100) feet or less.
 - 2. Two (2) driveways where the road or street frontage exceeds one hundred (100) feet.
- H. Except for grandfathered, non-conforming yards, no automobile wrecking, junk or salvage yards shall be permitted within three hundred (300) feet of any public road in Hamblen County.
- I. Application for Automobile Wrecking, Junk, or Salvage Yard Permit: No person shall own or maintain an automobile wrecking, junk or salvage yard within Hamblen County until he has secured a permit from the Hamblen County Board of Zoning Appeals. An application for said permit shall be filed and shall be accompanied by a detailed Site Plan, a schedule for construction, and any other information herein required.
- J. <u>Dumps</u> No person shall own or maintain a landfill or waste dump within Hamblen County until a Site Plan has been submitted and approved by the Planning Commission, received approval as a special exception by the Board of Zoning Appeals; and received a permit issued by the Tennessee Department of Health and Environment, Division of Solid Waste. No such landfill or dump shall

be permitted within five hundred (500) feet of a residence, school, church, park, or public gathering place. All debris must be covered daily from public view. The dumping of chemicals or toxins is not permitted. Other standards required for junkyards shall also be required for dumps.

- K. <u>Saving Clause</u>- If any of the provisions of this Article 7.4 conflict with the provisions of general law regarding the regulation of junkyards, by being less restrictive than the general law or otherwise, then the general law provisions shall govern the matter at issue.
- L. Expansions-An expansion of these type business/operations shall constitute extending the operation to a separate lot of record that is distinct from the lot of record the operation originally took place upon regardless of the ownership. Any expansion to a new separate lot must conform to all the regulations pertaining to these uses.

Section 9.7.A.8. Uses Permitted in the Environmental Industrial District, I-2 be amended to state:

8. Automobile Wrecking, Junk and Salvage yards and dumps.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Hamblen County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on the 19th day of December, 2019, hereby adopting the proposed amend to Section 7.4 of the Hamblen County Zoning Resolution as recommended by the planning commission and written above.

BE IT FRUTHER RESOLVED, that the zoning amendment adopted hereby shall be effective upon passage of this Resolution.

BACKGROUND:

This is a staff-initiated proposal to amend Section 7.4. Development Standards for Automobile Wrecking, Junk and Salvage yards and dumps and Section 9.7.A.8. Uses Permitted in the Environment Industrial District, I-2

The proposed amendments to Section 7.4. have been an ongoing discussion since 2018. Joe Barrett, Planner for the East Tennessee Development Distric,t pointed out in an August 22, 2018 memo that Subsection K, Amortization Schedule which removed the grandfather status of nonconforming junkyards was in violation of State law. Under Tennessee Code Annotated (TCA) 13-7-208, commercial, industrial, and multifamily uses are allowed to continue in perpetuity or up to thirty months after the use is abandoned. This position was recently confirmed by Chris Capp, County Attorney in a letter dated September 6, 2019 (see attached)

The most significant change to the proposed amendments is to remove Subsection K, Amortization Schedule and replace it with language which better explains the provisions under TCA 13-7-208. Other minor changes to Section 7.4 include:

- Adding a sentence specifying where automobile wrecking, junk and salvage yards and dumps can locate and states where the applicable development standards were located in the Zoning Ordinance.
- Reducing the spacing of buffer trees from 20 feet to 10 feet and change the minimum height of buffer trees from 4 feet to 5 feet.
- Establishing a 12 foot maximum height that material could be stacked.

The proposed amendment to Section 9.7.A.8. Environmental Industrial District, I-2, Uses Permitted is to replace the term "Junk Yards" with "Automobile Wrecking, Junk and Salvage yards and dumps" to match the language in Section 7.4.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of the proposed text amendment.

Any fence, screen or wall for screening purposes shall be properly painted or otherwise maintained in good condition. Any material associated with the operations, as defined in Article V. Definitions, pertaining to junkyards shall not exceed a maximum of twelve (12) feet in height. Variances may be granted by the Board of Zoning Appeals where traffic safety is an issue.
 - D. All such yards shall be so maintained as to be in a sanitary condition and so as not to be a menace to the public health or safety.
 - E. Off Road Parking No vehicles may be parked outside of the fence, screen or wall.
 - F. Ingress and Egress The number of vehicular access driveways permitted on any single street frontage shall be limited to:
 - 1. One (1) driveway where the parcel to be used has a maximum road or street frontage of one hundred (100) feet or less.
 - 2. Two (2) driveways where the road or street frontage exceeds one hundred (100) feet.

- J. <u>Saving Clause</u>- If any of the provisions of this Article 7.4 conflict with the provisions of general law regarding the regulation of junkyards, by being less restrictive than the general law or otherwise, then the general law provisions shall govern the matter at issue.
- K. Amortization Schedule-With respect to Article 7.4 A., C., D., E. and F., any nonconforming junkyard considered "grandfathered" under this Resolution or general law shall lose such grandfathered status with regard to Article 7.4 A., C., D., E. and F. three (3) years after the adoption of this amended Article 7.4. (December 22, 2005)
- K. Expansions-An expansion of these type business/operations shall constitute extending the operation to a separate lot of record that is distinct from the lot of record the operation originally took place upon regardless of the ownership. Any expansion to a new separate lot must conform to all the regulations pertaining to these uses.
- 9.7. Environmental Industrial District, I-2: This district's purpose is to allow industrial development for heavy industrial uses, which, by their nature, offer the potential for impacting the environment negatively.
 - A. Uses Permitted In I-2- Environmental Industrial District, the following uses are permitted on review by the Board of Zoning Appeals as special exceptions:

Dear Mr. Shipley, County Commissioners and Hamblen County Planning Commission:

Counties obtain their power to enact zoning ordinances and otherwise regulate the use of land by delegation from the state. (TCA §§ 13-7-101(a) (1) attached) Another statute, TCA §§ 13-7-208 (attached), establishes the right of an industrial or commercial establishment to continue their operations if they were legally permitted prior to the adoption of zoning regulations which due to their location makes the continued operation a "non-conforming use".

All of the "junkyards" or wrecking yards located in Hamblen County were "grandfathered" under this statute when Hamblen County adopted its zoning ordinance in 1990. In 2005, the Commission amended the ordinance originally adopted in 1990 with regard to "automobile wrecking, junk and salvage yards and dumps." (See attached amendment "Article 5")

The junkyards or salvage yards that were affected by this amendment were the same yards that were "grandfathered" by the adoption of the zoning ordinance in 1990 which continue to be "non-conforming uses." After contacting the County Technical Advisory Service ("CTAS") operated by the University of Tennessee, and researching the issue, it is my considered opinioned based upon that research and conversation with other county attorneys, specifically Washington and Knox counties, and upon the holding in <u>Smith County Regional Planning Commission v. by our 2005 zoning amendment. (See attached opinion) This case establishes that a "change in zoning" results in "grandfathered" non-conforming uses, just as an original adoption of zoning does where no zoning law had previously existed.

The amendment of our zoning ordinance in 2005 was meant to affect those junkyards which had been "grandfathered" in 1990. The amendment constituted a "change in zoning" and these junkyards are again "grandfathered" with regard to the application of the 2005 amendment.

Historically a couple of the yards did purchase trees to comply with the 2005 amendment but the trees died and were not replaced, and Hamblen County has not made any efforts to enforce the amendment in many years. Under both the statute, TCA §§ 13-7-208 (b) 1, and the holding in <u>Smith County Regional Planning Commission v. Hiwassee Village Mobile Home Park LLC</u>, the County's attempts to enforce the 2005 amendment regarding screening of junkyards could be successfully defended at the expense of Hamblen County regardless of how well intended and desirable the 2005 Amendment was. The 2010 case cited above was a change to the law existing in 2005.

<u>TN - Tennessee Code Annotated</u> <u>Title 13 Public Planning And Housing</u> <u>Chapter 7</u> <u>Zoning</u> <u>Part 2 Municipal Zoning</u>

13-7-208. Enforcement of ordinances — Remedies — Applicability of provisions.

(a)

(1) The chief legislative body may provide for the enforcement of any ordinance enacted under this part and part 3 of this chapter. A violation of any such ordinance is a <u>Class</u> C misdemeanor.

(2) In case any building or structure is or is proposed to be erected, constructed, reconstructed, altered, converted or maintained, or any building, structure or land is or is proposed to be used in violation of any ordinance enacted under this part and part 3 of this chapter, the building commissioner, municipal counsel or other appropriate authority of the municipality, or any adjacent or neighboring property owner who would be specially damaged by such violation, may, in addition to other remedies, institute injunction, mandamus or other appropriate action or proceeding to prevent such unlawful erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration, conversion, maintenance or use, or to correct or abate such violation, or to prevent the occupancy of the building, structure or land.

(b)

(1) In the event that a zoning change occurs in any land area where such land area was not previously covered by any zoning restrictions of any governmental agency of this state or its political subdivisions, or where such land area is covered by zoning restrictions of a governmental agency of this state or its political subdivisions, and such zoning restrictions differ from zoning restrictions imposed after the zoning change, then any industrial, commercial or business establishment in operation, permitted to operate under zoning regulations or exceptions thereto prior to the zoning change shall be allowed to continue in operation and be permitted; provided, that no change in the use of the land is undertaken by such industry or business.

(2) When the use permitted to continue to expand, or to be rebuilt pursuant to any subsection of this section is an off-premises sign, such use shall not preclude any new or additional conforming use or structure on the property on which the sign structure is located or on any adjacent property under the same ownership; provided, however, that any such new or additional use or structure does not result in any violations of the applicable zoning restrictions other than those nonconformities associated with the off-premises sign as allowed under this subdivision (b)(2).

(c) Industrial, commercial or other business establishments in operation and permitted to operate under zoning regulations or exceptions thereto in effect immediately preceding a change in zoning shall be allowed to expand operations and construct additional facilities which involve an actual continuance and expansion of the activities of the industry or business which were permitted and being conducted prior to the change in zoning; provided, that there is a reasonable amount of space for such expansion on the property owned by such industry or business situated within the area which is affected by the change in zoning, so as to avoid nuisances to adjoining landowners. (1) Industrial, commercial, or other business establishments in operation and permitted to operate under zoning regulations or exceptions thereto immediately preceding a change in zoning shall be allowed to destroy present facilities and reconstruct new facilities necessary to the conduct of such industry or business subsequent to the zoning change; provided, that no destruction and rebuilding shall occur which shall act to change the use classification of the land as classified under any zoning regulations or exceptions thereto in effect immediately prior to or subsequent to a change in the zoning of the land area on which such industry or business is located. No building permit or like permission for demolition, construction or landscaping shall be denied to an industry or business seeking to destroy and reconstruct facilities necessary to the continued conduct of the activities of that industry or business, where such conduct was permitted prior to a change in zoning; provided, that there is a reasonable amount of space for such expansion on the property owned by such industry or business situated within the area which is affected by the change in zoning, so as to avoid nulsances to adjoining landowners.

(2)

(A) Multifamily residential establishments, whether used as owner-occupied property or rental property, which were permitted to operate under zoning regulations or exceptions thereto immediately preceding a change in zoning shall be allowed to reconstruct new facilities necessary to the conduct of such multifamily residential establishment subsequent to the zoning change, in the event of damage, whether partial or complete, by involuntary fire or wind damage or other natural disaster.

(B) If any such new facilities exceed the original height, density, setback, or square-footage of the original facilities in existence immediately prior to the damage, then the new facilities shall constitute a change in the use of the land, and any protections provided hereunder shall be forfeited.

(C) If any such new facilities do not exceed the original height, density, setback, or square-footage of the original facilities in existence immediately prior to the damage, then the new facilities shall constitute a continuation of the use of the land immediately prior to the damage, and any protections provided hereunder shall not be forfeited.

(D) Whenever any ordinance enacted under authority of this chapter establishes stricter terms regarding the amount of partial damage that may be allowed without forfeiture of these protections, then any such ordinance shall govern.

(E) New facilities shall comply with all architectural design standards required under current zoning regulations and be consistent with the architectural context of the immediate and adjacent block faces. (e) Subsections (b)-(d) apply only to land owned and in use by such affected business, and do not operate to permit expansion of an existing industry or business through the acquisition of additional land.

(f) Subsections (b)-(e) do not apply to any municipality defined as a premiere type tourist resort according to § 67-6-103(a)(3)(B).

(g) Except as provided in subsection (*l*), subsections (b)-(d) shall not apply if an industrial, commercial, or other business establishment ceases to operate for a period of thirty (30) continuous months and the industrial, commercial, or other business use of the property did not conform with the land use classification as denoted in the existing zoning regulations for the zoning district in which it is located. Anytime after the thirty-month cessation, any use proposed to be established on the site, including any existing or proposed on-site sign, must conform to the provisions of the existing zoning regulations. For the purposes of this subsection (g), the thirty-month period of continuous ceased operation shall be tolled by:

(1) The period in which an industrial, commercial, or other business establishment is party to any action in a court of competent jurisdiction regarding the use of the property until such time that a final settlement, order, decree, or judgment has been rendered; January 23, 2020

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continuous use;

(3) The filing of an application for a building permit for the alteration, renovation or reconstruction of a structure which is nonconforming or of a structure in which or out of which a nonconforming industrial, commercial or other business use operates or is located; or

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(4) The reactivation of the nonconforming use any time prior to the end of the thirty-month period; provided, however, that the restrictions of this subsection (g) and subsection (i) shall only apply if the property owner intentionally and voluntarily abandons the nonconforming use of the property. In any contested matter on the use of such property, the government has the burden of proving an overt act of abandonment in such matter.

(h) Subsections (b)-(d) shall apply to an off-site sign which, for the purposes of this subsection (h), means any sign that advertises or gives direction to any business, product, service, attraction, or any other purpose or Interest, other than the industrial, commercial or other business establishment located on the site where the sign is located; provided, however, that any expansion shall be limited as follows: (1) Any off-site sign smaller than a standard 8-sheet poster which, for the purposes of this subsection (h), means an off-site sign with overall dimensions of at least five feet four inches (5' 4") to six feet two inches (6' 2") in height and eleven feet four inches (11' 4") to twelve feet two inches (12' 2") in width shall not be expanded to a size greater than a standard 8-sheet poster;

(2) Any standard 8-sheet poster shall not be expanded to a size greater than a 30-sheet poster which, for the purposes of this subsection (h), means an off-site sign with overall dimensions of twelve feet three inches (12' 3") in height and twenty-four feet six inches (24' 6") in width;

(3) Any standard 30-sheet poster shall not be expanded to a size greater than any standard bulletin which, for the purposes of this subsection (h), means any off-site sign with overall dimensions of ten feet (10') to fourteen feet (14') in height and thirty-six feet (36') to forty-eight feet (48') in width; (4) Any standard bulletin shall not be expanded to a size greater than any super bulletin which, for the purposes of this subsection (h), means any off-site sign with overall dimensions of sixteen feet (16') to twenty feet (20') in height and sixty feet (60') in width;

(5) Any super bulletin shall not be expanded;

(6) Any off-site sign with a height larger than standard 8-sheet poster height or width larger than standard 8-sheet poster width but not meeting the definition of a standard 8-sheet poster, a standard 30-sheet poster, a standard bulletin, or a standard super bulletin shall not be expanded by more than one hundred percent (100%) of its surface area; or

(7) Any operation, rebuilding, or expansion of an off-site sign that has been in existence for ten (10) years or more shall not be denied solely on the basis that the original permit for the sign does not exist to prove that it was a lawful use when constructed.

(i) Notwithstanding subsection (d), any structure rebuilt on the site must conform to the existing zoning regulations as to setbacks, height, bulk, or requirements as to the physical location of a structure upon the site, provided that this subsection (i) shall not apply to off-site signs.

(j) Subsections (g), (h) and (i) do not apply to any home rule municipality; provided, however, that subject to the approval of the local legislative body, a home rule municipality may opt into these subsections.

(k) Notwithstanding subsections (a)-(i), subsection (g) shall not apply to any industrial establishment location where twenty-five percent (25%) or more of the gross annual sales from such location are derived from sales to or contracts with local, state or federal governments or as a subcontractor to contracts with local, state or federal governments, or to any industrial establishment location where seventy-five percent (75%) or more of the gross annual sales from the location are made to agriculture or construction businesses.

(l)

(1) As used in this subsection (/):

(A) "Block" means a unit of land bounded by streets or by a combination of streets and public land, railroad rights-of-way, waterways or any other barrier to the continuity of development; and

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vehicle dealership located on property that is principally used for the marketing and display of new motor vehicles, whether by sale, rental, lease or other commercial or financial means that is primarily housed in a structure and characterized by a mixture of the following secondary supporting uses: (i) An inventory of new or used motor vehicles in operating condition for sale or lease either on the same parcel or at a location affiliated with a franchised retail motor vehicle dealership; and (ii) On-site facilities for the repair and service of motor vehicles previously sold, rented or leased by the retail motor vehicle dealership.

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(2) In any municipality having a metropolitan form of government and a population of over five hundred thousand (500,000), according to the 2000 federal census or any subsequent federal census, any nonconforming motor vehicle business establishment may be terminated after notice and a hearing before the board of zoning appeals upon a finding that all of the following have been established in the record before the board of zoning appeals:

(A) Another motor vehicle business establishment is located within the one thousand feet (1,000') of the nonconforming motor vehicle business establishment, in the same block as the nonconforming motor vehicle business establishment, or in the block across a public street or road from the block in which the nonconforming motor vehicle business establishment is located;

(B) The parcel on which the nonconforming motor vehicle business establishment is located has less than two hundred fifty feet (250') of frontage on any public street or road, excluding any portion of the frontage not owned or leased by the licensed operator of the nonconforming motor vehicle business establishment; and

(C) At least ten percent (10%) of the inventory of the nonconforming motor vehicle business establishment at any point in time consists of motor vehicles titled pursuant to title 55, chapter 3, part 2, including, but not limited to, vehicles with salvage titles, flood titles, rebuilt titles, or nonrepairable vehicle certificates. The operator of the nonconforming motor vehicle business establishment shall make the titles for all of the vehicles located on the premises of the nonconforming motor vehicle business establishment immediately available upon request of a local zoning inspection official, or produce the original titles at the office of the local zoning inspection official within three (3) business days of the request by the local zoning inspection official. (1) If any land area becomes subject to land use restrictions imposed pursuant to a redevelopment plan undertaken by any governmental agency of this state or of its political subdivisions pursuant to chapter 20, part 2 or part 7 of this title, or if the land area is subject to land use restrictions that are amended by any governmental agency of this state or of its political subdivisions pursuant to chapter 20, part 2 or part 7 of this title, and if the land use restrictions differ from the land use restrictions contained in the amended land use restrictions, then any industrial, commercial, or other business establishment in operation and permitted to operate prior to the initial adoption of the land use restrictions or an amendment thereto, shall be allowed to continue in operation and shall be permitted; provided, that no change in the use of the land is undertaken by the industrial, commercial, or business establishment.

(2) Immediately preceding an initial adoption of the land use restrictions or an amendment of the restrictions, industrial, commercial, and other business establishments in operation and permitted to operate under land use restrictions imposed pursuant to a redevelopment plan undertaken by any Return to Regular Calendar

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facilities are acquired by a governmental entity pursuant to the power of eminent domain, or under threat of the exercise of the power of eminent domain, or replace facilities required to be relocated as the result of the acquisition of property by a governmental entity pursuant to the power of eminent domain, or under threat of the exercise of the power of eminent domain, or to rebuild facilities if they are damaged by unplanned casualty or act of God; provided, that:

1.

(A) The replacement facilities shall not be larger in size than the facilities in existence prior to the acquisition, relocation, or damage caused by unplanned casualty or act of God;

(B) The construction of the replacement facilities shall commence within thirty (30) months of the date of the taking or acquisition under threat of the exercise of the power of eminent domain or the date of the damage caused by unplanned casualty or act of God; and

(C) There is a reasonable amount of space for the replacement facilities on the property owned by the industry or business situated within the area that is affected by the adoption of the land use restrictions or an amendment of the restrictions, so as to avoid nuisances to adjoining landowners.

(3) Subdivision (m)(2) applies only to land owned and in use by the affected industrial, commercial, or other business establishment prior to acquisition or relocation resulting from the exercise of the power of eminent domain, or the threat of the exercise of the power of eminent domain, or the damage to facilities caused by unplanned casualty or act of God, and does not operate to permit the replacement of facilities necessary to the conduct of the industry or business through the acquisition of additional land.
(4) Subdivisions (m)(2) and (3) apply only to any acquisition or relocation of facilities within an area subject to land use restrictions imposed pursuant to a redevelopment plan undertaken on or after July 1, 2015, by any governmental agency of this state or of its political subdivisions pursuant to chapter 20, part 2 or part 7 of this title, or to damage to facilities caused by casualty or act of God occurring on or after July 1, 2015, regardless of the redevelopment plan's date of enactment.

PROPOSAL

OF THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE TO THE COUNTY OF HAMBLEN, TENNESSEE:

The DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION of the State of Tennessee, hereinafter "DEPARTMENT", proposes to construct a project in the County of Hamblen, Tennessee, hereinafter "COUNTY", designated as Federal Project No. NH-34(86), State Project No. 32004-2233-14, that is described as "S.R. 34, From S.R. 32 in Morristown To Near Morris Blvd", provided the COUNTY agrees to cooperate with the DEPARTMENT as set forth in this proposal, so that the general highway program may be carried out in accordance with the intent of the General Assembly of the State.

Accordingly, the parties agree as follows:

1. That in the event any civil actions in inverse condemnation or for damages are instituted by reason of the DEPARTMENT, or its contractor, going upon the highway right-ofway and easements, and constructing said project in accordance with the plans and as necessary to make the completed project functional, it will notify in writing the Attorney General of the State, whose address is 425 Fifth Avenue North, Nashville, Tennessee, 37243, of the institution of each civil action, the complaint and all subsequent pleadings, within ten (10) days after the service of each of the same, under penalty of defending such actions and paying any judgments which result therefrom at its own expense.

2. The COUNTY will close or otherwise modify any of its roads or other public ways if indicated on the project plans, as provided by law.

3. The COUNTY will transfer or cause to be transferred to the DEPARTMENT, without cost to the DEPARTMENT, all land owned by the COUNTY or by any of its instrumentalities as

required for right-of-way or easement purposes, provided such land is being used or dedicated for road or other public way purposes.

4. Where privately, publicly or cooperatively owned utility lines, facilities and systems for producing, transmitting or distributing communications, power, electricity, light, heat, gas, oil, crude products, water, steam, waste, storm water not connected with highway drainage, and other similar commodities, including publicly owned facilities such as fire and police signal systems and street lighting systems are located within the right-of-way of any road or other public way owned by the COUNTY, or any of its instrumentalities, the COUNTY agrees that it will take any action necessary to require the removal or adjustment of any of the above-described facilities as would conflict with the construction of the project. But the foregoing may not be a duty of the COUNTY since it shall become operative only after the DEPARTMENT has been unsuccessful in its efforts to provide for said removals or adjustments for the benefit of the COUNTY.

The foregoing does not apply to those utility facilities which are owned by the COUNTY or one of its instrumentalities, it being understood that the COUNTY has the duty to relocate or adjust such facilities, if required, provided the COUNTY is notified to do so by the DEPARTMENT with detailed advice as to this duty of the COUNTY.

5. The COUNTY will maintain any frontage road to be constructed as part of the project;

6. After the project is completed and open to traffic, the COUNTY will accept jurisdiction and maintenance such parts of any existing DEPARTMENT highway to be replaced by the project, as shown on the attached map.

7. The COUNTY will make no changes or alter any segment of a road on its road system that lies within the limits of the right-of-way acquired for any interchange to be constructed as part of the project and will not permit the installation or relocation of any utility facilities within the right-of-way of any such a segment of one of its roads without first obtaining the approval of the DEPARTMENT.

8. No provision hereof shall be construed as changing the maintenance responsibility of the COUNTY for such part of the project as may presently be on its highway, street, road or bridge system.

9. It is understood and agreed between the DEPARTMENT and the COUNTY that all traffic control signs for the control of traffic on a street under the jurisdiction of the COUNTY and located within the DEPARTMENT's right-of-way shall be maintained and replaced by the COUNTY.

10. When traffic control devices for the direction or warning of traffic, lighting of roadways or signing, or any of them, which are operated or function by the use of electric current are constructed or installed as part of the project, they will be furnished with electricity and maintained by the COUNTY.

11. If, as a result of acquisition and use of right-of-way for the project, any building and/or structure improvements become in violation of a COUNTY setback line or building and/or structure requirement, including, but not limited to, on-premise signs, the COUNTY agrees to waive enforcement of the COUNTY setback line or building and/or structure requirement and take other proper governmental action as necessary to accomplish such waiver.

12. If, as a result of acquisition and use of right-of-way for the project, any real property retained by any property owner shall become in violation of a COUNTY zoning regulation or requirement, the COUNTY agrees to waive enforcement of the COUNTY zoning regulation or requirement and take other proper governmental action as necessary to accomplish such waiver.

13. The COUNTY will not authorize encroachments of any kind upon the right-of-way, nor will the COUNTY authorize use of the easements for the project in any manner which affects

the DEPARTMENT's use thereof.

14. The COUNTY will obtain the approval of the DEPARTMENT before authorizing parking on the right-of-way and easements for the project.

15 The COUNTY will not install or maintain any device for the purpose of regulating the movement of traffic on the roadway except as warranted and in conformity with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

16. If the project is classified as full access control (i.e. a project which has no intersecting streets at grade), then the DEPARTMENT will maintain the completed project. If the project is not classified as full access control, then the DEPARTMENT will maintain the pavement from curb to curb where curbs exist, or will maintain full width of the roadway where no curb exist. The COUNTY agrees to maintain all other parts of non-access control projects; provided, however, that any retaining walls, box culverts, or other like structures constructed as part of the project that supports the structural integrity or stability of the roadway surface shall be maintained by the DEPARTMENT.

17. If a sidewalk is constructed as a component of this project, the COUNTY shall be responsible for maintenance of the sidewalk and shall assume all liability for third-party claims for damages arising from its use of the sidewalk or premises beyond the DEPARTMENT'S maintenance responsibilities as set forth in section 16 of this proposal.

18. When said project is completed, the COUNTY thereafter will not permit any additional median crossovers, the cutting of the pavement, curbs, gutters and sidewalks, by any person, firm, corporation, or governmental agency, without first obtaining the approval of the DEPARTMENT.

19. The DEPARTMENT will acquire the right-of-way and easements, construct the project and defend any inverse condemnation for damage or civil actions of which the Attorney

General has received the notice and pleadings provided for herein; provided, however, that if the project is being constructed pursuant to a contract administered by the DEPARTMENT's Local Programs Development Office, the terms of that contract shall control in the event of a conflict with this proposal.

20. The project plans hereinbefore identified by number and description are incorporated herein by reference and shall be considered a part of this proposal, including any revisions or amendments thereto, provided a copy of each is furnished the COUNTY.

21. The acceptance of this proposal shall be evidenced by the passage of a resolution or by other proper governmental action, which shall incorporate this proposal verbatim or make reference thereto.

WHEREAS, the terms and conditions of said Proposal to Hamblen County as submitted by the State of Tennessee, Department of Transportation, are accepted and approved by the Hamblen County Legislative Body, and Hamblen County shall fulfill all obligations thereto; now

PROPOSAL

OF THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE TO THE COUNTY OF HAMBLEN, TENNESSEE:

The DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION of the State of Tennessee, hereinafter "DEPARTMENT", proposes to construct a project in the County of Hamblen, Tennessee, hereinafter "COUNTY", designated as Federal Project No. HSIP-34(105), State Project No. 32004-2226-94, that is described as "Intersection at Commerce Boulevard in Morristown Route: SR-34", provided the COUNTY agrees to cooperate with the DEPARTMENT as set forth in this proposal, so that the general highway program may be carried out in accordance with the intent of the General Assembly of the State.

Accordingly, the parties agree as follows:

1. That in the event any civil actions in inverse condemnation or for damages are instituted by reason of the DEPARTMENT, or its contractor, going upon the highway right-ofway and easements, and constructing said project in accordance with the plans and as necessary to make the completed project functional, it will notify in writing the Attorney General of the State, whose address is 425 Fifth Avenue North, Nashville, Tennessee, 37243, of the institution of each civil action, the complaint and all subsequent pleadings, within ten (10) days after the service of each of the same, under penalty of defending such actions and paying any judgments which result therefrom at its own expense.

2. The COUNTY will close or otherwise modify any of its roads or other public ways if indicated on the project plans, as provided by law.

3. The COUNTY will transfer or cause to be transferred to the DEPARTMENT, without cost to the DEPARTMENT, all land owned by the COUNTY or by any of its instrumentalities as

required for right-of-way or easement purposes, provided such land is being used or dedicated for road or other public way purposes.

4. Where privately, publicly or cooperatively owned utility lines, facilities and systems for producing, transmitting or distributing communications, power, electricity, light, heat, gas, oil, crude products, water, steam, waste, storm water not connected with highway drainage, and other similar commodities, including publicly owned facilities such as fire and police signal systems and street lighting systems are located within the right-of-way of any road or other public way owned by the COUNTY, or any of its instrumentalities, the COUNTY agrees that it will take any action necessary to require the removal or adjustment of any of the above-described facilities as would conflict with the construction of the project. But the foregoing may not be a duty of the COUNTY since it shall become operative only after the DEPARTMENT has been unsuccessful in its efforts to provide for said removals or adjustments for the benefit of the COUNTY.

The foregoing does not apply to those utility facilities which are owned by the COUNTY or one of its instrumentalities, it being understood that the COUNTY has the duty to relocate or adjust such facilities, if required, provided the COUNTY is notified to do so by the DEPARTMENT with detailed advice as to this duty of the COUNTY.

5. The COUNTY will maintain any frontage road to be constructed as part of the project;

6. After the project is completed and open to traffic, the COUNTY will accept jurisdiction and maintenance such parts of any existing DEPARTMENT highway to be replaced by the project, as shown on the attached map.

7. The COUNTY will make no changes or alter any segment of a road on its road system that lies within the limits of the right-of-way acquired for any interchange to be constructed as part of the project and will not permit the installation or relocation of any utility facilities within the right-of-way of any such a segment of one of its roads without first obtaining the approval of the DEPARTMENT.

8. No provision hereof shall be construed as changing the maintenance responsibility of the COUNTY for such part of the project as may presently be on its highway, street, road or bridge system.

9. It is understood and agreed between the DEPARTMENT and the COUNTY that all traffic control signs for the control of traffic on a street under the jurisdiction of the COUNTY and located within the DEPARTMENT's right-of-way shall be maintained and replaced by the COUNTY.

10. When traffic control devices for the direction or warning of traffic, lighting of roadways or signing, or any of them, which are operated or function by the use of electric current are constructed or installed as part of the project, they will be furnished with electricity and maintained by the COUNTY.

11. If, as a result of acquisition and use of right-of-way for the project, any building and/or structure improvements become in violation of a COUNTY setback line or building and/or structure requirement, including, but not limited to, on-premise signs, the COUNTY agrees to waive enforcement of the COUNTY setback line or building and/or structure requirement and take other proper governmental action as necessary to accomplish such waiver.

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the DEPARTMENT's use thereof.

14. The COUNTY will obtain the approval of the DEPARTMENT before authorizing parking on the right-of-way and easements for the project.

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17. If a sidewalk is constructed as a component of this project, the COUNTY shall be responsible for maintenance of the sidewalk and shall assume all liability for third-party claims for damages arising from its use of the sidewalk or premises beyond the DEPARTMENT'S maintenance responsibilities as set forth in section 16 of this proposal.

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19. The DEPARTMENT will acquire the right-of-way and easements, construct the project and defend any inverse condemnation for damage or civil actions of which the Attorney

General has received the notice and pleadings provided for herein; provided, however, that if the project is being constructed pursuant to a contract administered by the DEPARTMENT's Local Programs Development Office, the terms of that contract shall control in the event of a conflict with this proposal.

20. The project plans hereinbefore identified by number and description are incorporated herein by reference and shall be considered a part of this proposal, including any revisions or amendments thereto, provided a copy of each is furnished the COUNTY.

21. The acceptance of this proposal shall be evidenced by the passage of a resolution or by other proper governmental action, which shall incorporate this proposal verbatim or make reference thereto.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF HAMBLEN COUNTY, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, Covenant Health, a Tennessee non-profit corporation ("Covenant"), requested The Health, Educational and Housing Facility Board of the County of Knox (the "Knox County Board") to issue up to \$500,000,000 of its revenue bonds, in multiple series (collectively, the "Bonds"), pursuant to Part 3 of Chapter 101 of Title 48 of Tennessee Code Annotated (the "Act"), a portion of the proceeds of which will be used to make a loan to Covenant and its affiliates for various purposes, including but not limited to, financing or refinancing the costs of the expansion, improvement, renovation and equipping of Covenant's and its affiliates' facilities, including Morristown-Hamblen Healthcare System's hospital and related facilities located at 908 West Fourth North Street, Morristown, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated Section 48-101-308(a)(5) provides that a corporation such as the Knox County Board created under the Act may not finance a project located outside Knox County, Tennessee except after the approval of such financing by appropriate resolution duly adopted by an entity designated in said subsection 48-101-308(a)(5); and

WHEREAS, the County Commission of Hamblen County, Tennessee (the "County Commission") is the appropriate governing body, as designated by the Act, to adopt such resolution, with respect to facilities in Hamblen County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

1. The County Commission hereby approves the issuance of the Bonds by the Knox County Board to finance or refinance costs relating to the expansion, improvement, renovation and equipping of the Morristown-Hamblen Healthcare System and approves the issuance of any bonds by the Knox County Board to refund such bonds and/or to finance capital improvements at such facilities that are deemed needed by Morristown-Hamblen within the next three years.

2. The officers of Hamblen County are authorized to execute and deliver all such certificates and statements as may be reasonably required in connection with the issuance of the Bonds, including a public approval certificate to be executed by the County Mayor to comply with federal tax law requirements.

3. Hamblen County approves the Knox County Board holding a public hearing under Section 147 of the Internal Revenue Code on behalf of Hamblen County related to the Project.

4. In no event shall Hamblen County or any instrumentality, board or commission thereof have any obligation with respect to the Bonds, including any obligation to pay such Bonds in any manner whatsoever.

5. This resolution shall take effect upon its passage.

It is also developing a website that will feature videos about the history of the county along with historic photographs and stories. The Committee has requested \$9,000 to pay for these items.

I am recommending that we transfer \$4,750 appropriated for CEASE which has closed its operation in Hamblen County and add \$4,250 in contingent appropriations for the insurance self-insurance fund.



Dear Mayor Brittain & Commissioners:

As I'm sure you are aware, CEASE, the domestic violence agency that has served Hamblen County for almost 40 years closed their doors. This abrupt termination of their services left victims of domestic violence in Hamblen County without the critical services necessary to enhance not only their immediate safety but their long-term safety as well. While the shelter programs surrounding the CEASE coverage area were able to commit to taking in victims who need shelter, none of us had the funding and/or manpower to commit to the services outside of shelter that are just as critical for these victims. Specifically, the non-shelter service of legal advocacy which includes helping these victims get Orders of Protection and accompanying them to both civil and criminal court and advocating for their safety were no longer available.

As soon as CEASE announced their closing our crisis-line was overwhelmed with callers needing someone to come to Hamblen County and help them get Orders of Protection. It grieved us not only not to be able to provide this service but also we knew there was no one to whom we could refer them for this assistance. In response, I contacted the Office of Criminal Justice Programs and requested immediate emergency funding to hire an advocate to offer this service to Hamblen county on a temporary basis in order to give another agency/entity time to perhaps re-establish a shelter and these services in your county. Our funding request was approved beginning February 1, 2020 through June 30, 2020. We immediately hired Nancy Seal who was an advocate at CEASE for 32 years.



This federal money that was granted to us through our existing VOCA grant requires a 20% match. That match amount is \$3250.00. I am respectfully requesting that Hamblen County partner with us to continue providing this critical service by funding this match amount.

Please know that regardless of the CEASE shutdown and prior to it we have and will continue to serve Hamblen County victims within our shelter. Often times these victims don't feel safe being in shelter in the same county in which their abuser resides and it is for this reason that serving victims in shelter from other counties has never been an issue for SafeSpace or any of the shelters in Tennessee. With that being said, last fiscal year we served 11 Hamblen County victims in our shelter with Hamblen County being the 4th highest county in number served in our shelter immediately following our three-county service area of Jefferson, Cocke, and Sevier.

Thank you in advance for considering this funding request. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you need any additional information or questions answered. Otherwise, I look forward to your response.

Recommendation:

A RESOLUTION TO AMEND SECTION 7.4 DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS FOR AUTOMOBILE WRECKING, JUNK, SALVAGE YARDS, AND DUMPS AND SECTION 9.7 ENVIRONMENTAL INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT (I-2) OF THE HAMBLEN COUNTY ZONING RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Hamblen County Board of Commissioners, in accordance with Section 13-7-105 of the Tennessee Code Annotated, may amend the "Zoning Resolution of Hamblen County, Tennessee", and

WHEREAS, the Hamblen County Regional Planning Commission and the Morristown Municipal/Regional Planning Commission have reviewed and made recommendations regarding the proposed amendment of the "Zoning Resolution of Hamblen County, Tennessee", in accordance with Section 13-7-105(a) of the Tennessee Code Annotated; and

WHEREAS, public notice has been provided in a newspaper of general circulation for the public hearing to be held by the Hamblen County Board of Commissioners to consider such zoning amendment of the "Zoning Resolution of Hamblen County, Tennessee" with a complete summary of such amendment, in accordance with Section 13-7-105(b) of the Tennessee Code Annotated; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Hamblen County, Tennessee:

Section 7.4 be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

- 7.4 Development Standards for Automobile Wrecking, Junk and Salvage vards and dumps. Because of the nature and character of their operations, automobile wrecking and salvage yards, junkyards and similar uses of land can have a decidedly detrimental effect upon surrounding properties. Salvage and wrecking yards tend to create problems of noise, dust, traffic and health hazards and may adversely affect property values by their general appearance. The following standards shall be used as a guide in evaluating whether proposed land uses, such as those outlined above, will have properly minimized their objectionable characteristics:
 - A. These uses are only permitted in the I-2, Environmental Industrial District. See Article II, Section 9.7.C and D. for set back and other dimensional regulations.
 - B. All motor vehicles stored or kept in such yards shall be so kept that they will not catch or hold water in which mosquitoes may breed or so that they will not constitute a place or places in which rats, mice, or other vermin may be harbored, reared or propagated.

- C. Because of the tendency for salvage yards, junkyard or automobile wrecking yards to promote the breeding of vermin, no such operation shall be permitted closer than five hundred (500) feet from any established residence.
- D. All automobile wrecking, Junk and salvage yards located on a county road shall be conducted entirely within either an enclosed opaque fence, screen, or wall, except driveway areas, from eight (8) feet to twelve (12) feet in helght or a screen or wall composed of white pine, eastern hemlocks, scotch pines or Leland cypress trees, no less than five (5) in height at planting, at ten (10) intervals between tree trunks along the fence lines, excepting driveways areas. Any fence, screen or wall for screening purposes shall be properly painted or otherwise maintained in good condition. Any material associated with the operations, as defined in Article V. Definitions, pertaining to junkyards shall not exceed a maximum of twelve (12) feet in height
- E. All such yards shall be so maintained as to be in a sanitary condition and so as not to be a menace to the public health or safety.
- F. Off Road Parking No vehicles may be parked outside of the fence, screen or wall.
- G. Ingress and Egress The number of vehicular access driveways permitted on any single street frontage shall be limited to:
 - 1. One (1) driveway where the parcel to be used has a maximum road or street frontage of one hundred (100) feet or less.
 - 2. Two (2) driveways where the road or street frontage exceeds one hundred (100) feet.
- H. Except for grandfathered, non-conforming yards, no automobile wrecking, junk or salvage yards shall be permitted within three hundred (300) feet of any public road in Hamblen County.
- I. Application for Automobile Wrecking, Junk, or Salvage Yard Permit: No person shall own or maintain an automobile wrecking, junk or salvage yard within Hamblen County until he has secured a permit from the Hamblen County Board of Zoning Appeals. An application for said permit shall be filed and shall be accompanied by a detailed Site Plan, a schedule for construction, and any other information herein required.
- J. <u>Dumps</u> No person shall own or maintain a landfill or waste dump within Hamblen County until a Site Plan has been submitted and approved by the Planning Commission, received approval as a special exception by the Board of Zoning Appeals; and received a permit issued by the Tennessee Department of Health and Environment, Division of Solid Waste. No such landfill or dump shall

be permitted within five hundred (500) feet of a residence, school, church, park, or public gathering place. All debris must be covered daily from public view. The dumping of chemicals or toxins is not permitted. Other standards required for junkyards shall also be required for dumps.

- Saving Clause- If any of the provisions of this Article 7.4 conflict with the provisions of general law regarding the regulation of junkyards, by being less restrictive than the general law or otherwise, then the general law provisions shall govern the matter at issue.
- L. Expansions-An expansion of these type business/operations shall constitute extending the operation to a separate lot of record that is distinct from the lot of record the operation originally took place upon regardless of the ownership. Any expansion to a new separate lot must conform to all the regulations pertaining to these uses.

Section 9.7.A.8. Uses Permitted in the Environmental Industrial District, I-2 be amended to state:

8. Automobile Wrecking, Junk and Salvage yards and dumps.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Hamblen County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on the 20th day of February 2020, hereby adopting the proposed amend to Section 7.4 of the Hamblen County Zoning Resolution as recommended by the planning commission and written above.

BACKGROUND:

This is a staff-initiated proposal to amend Section 7.4. Development Standards for Automobile Wrecking, Junk and Salvage yards and dumps and Section 9.7.A.8. Uses Permitted in the Environment Industrial District, I-2

The proposed amendments to Section 7.4. have been an ongoing discussion since 2018. Joe Barrett, Planner for the East Tennessee Development Distric,t pointed out in an August 22, 2018 memo that Subsection K, Amortization Schedule which removed the grandfather status of nonconforming junkyards was in violation of State law. Under Tennessee Code Annotated (TCA) 13-7-208, commercial, industrial, and multifamily uses are allowed to continue in perpetuity or up to thirty months after the use is abandoned. This position was recently confirmed by Chris Capp, County Attorney in a letter dated September 6, 2019 (see attached)

The most significant change to the proposed amendments is to remove Subsection K, Amortization Schedule and replace it with language which better explains the provisions under TCA 13-7-208. Other minor changes to Section 7.4 include:

- Adding a sentence specifying where automobile wrecking, junk and salvage yards and dumps can locate and states where the applicable development standards were located in the Zoning Ordinance.
- Reducing the spacing of buffer trees from 20 feet to 10 feet and change the minimum height of buffer trees from 4 feet to 5 feet.
- Establishing a 12 foot maximum height that material could be stacked.

The proposed amendment to Section 9.7.A.8. Environmental Industrial District, I-2, Uses Permitted is to replace the term "Junk Yards" with "Automobile Wrecking, Junk and Salvage yards and dumps" to match the language in Section 7.4.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of the proposed text amendment.

All automobile wrecking, junk and salvage yards located on a county road shall be conducted entirely within either an enclosed opaque fence, screen, or wall, except driveway areas, from eight (8) feet to twelve (12) feet in height or a screen or wall composed of white pine, eastern hemlocks, scotch pines or Leland cypress trees, no less than five (5) four feet in height at planting, at ten (10) 20² intervals between tree trunks along the fence lines, excepting driveways areas. Any fence, screen or wall for screening purposes shall be properly painted or otherwise maintained in good condition. Any material associated with the operations, as defined in Article V. Definitions, pertaining to junkyards shall not exceed a maximum of twelve (12) feet in height. Variances may be granted by the Board of Zoning Appeals where traffic safety is an issue.
 - D. All such yards shall be so maintained as to be in a sanitary condition and so as not to be a menace to the public health or safety.
 - E. Off Road Parking No vehicles may be parked outside of the fence, screen or wall.
 - F. Ingress and Egress The number of vehicular access driveways permitted on any single street frontage shall be limited to:
 - 1. One (1) driveway where the parcel to be used has a maximum road or street frontage of one hundred (100) feet or less.
 - 2. Two (2) driveways where the road or street frontage exceeds one hundred (100) feet.

- G. Except for grandfathered, non-conforming yards, no automobile wrecking, junk or salvage yards shall be permitted within three hundred (300) feet of any public road in Hamblen County.

No such landfill or dump shall be permitted within five hundred (500) feet of a residence, school, church, park, or public gathering place. All debris must be covered daily from public view. The dumping of chemicals or toxins is not permitted. Other standards required for junkyards shall also be required for dumps.
- J. <u>Saving Clause</u>- If any of the provisions of this Article 7.4 conflict with the provisions of general law regarding the regulation of junkyards, by being less restrictive than the general law or otherwise, then the general law provisions shall govern the matter at issue.
- K. Amortization Schedule–With respect to Article 7.4 A., C., D., E. and F., any nonconforming junkyard considered "grandfathered" under this Resolution or general law shall lose such grandfathered status with regard to Article 7.4 A., C., D., E. and F. three (3) years after the adoption of this amended Article 7.4. (December 22, 2005)
- K Expansions-An expansion of these type business/operations shall constitute extending the operation to a separate lot of record that is distinct from the lot of record the operation originally took place upon regardless of the ownership. Any expansion to a new separate lot must conform to all the regulations pertaining to these uses.
- 9.7. Environmental Industrial District, I-2: This district's purpose is to allow industrial development for heavy industrial uses, which, by their nature, offer the potential for impacting the environment negatively.
 - A. Uses Permitted In I-2- Environmental Industrial District, the following uses are permitted on review by the Board of Zoning Appeals as special exceptions:

- 1. Landfills
- 2. Smelting Plants
- 3. Asphalt Plants
- 4. Slaughtering Houses
- 5. Incinerators for the burning of garbage materials or medical waste
- 6. Paper/Pulp Products Plants

Dear Mr. Shipley, County Commissioners and Hamblen County Planning Commission:

Counties obtain their power to enact zoning ordinances and otherwise regulate the use of land by delegation from the state. (TCA §§ 13-7-101(a) (1) attached) Another statute, TCA §§ 13-7-208 (attached), establishes the right of an industrial or commercial establishment to continue their operations if they were legally permitted prior to the adoption of zoning regulations which due to their location makes the continued operation a "non-conforming use".

All of the "junkyards" or wrecking yards located in Hamblen County were "grandfathered" under this statute when Hamblen County adopted its zoning ordinance in 1990. In 2005, the Commission amended the ordinance originally adopted in 1990 with regard to "automobile wrecking, junk and salvage yards and dumps." (See attached amendment "Article 5")

The junkyards or salvage yards that were affected by this amendment were the same yards that were "grandfathered" by the adoption of the zoning ordinance in 1990 which continue to be "nonconforming uses." After contacting the County Technical Advisory Service ("CTAS") operated by the University of Tennessee, and researching the issue, it is my considered opinioned based upon that research and conversation with other county attorneys, specifically Washington and Knox counties, and upon the holding in <u>Smith County Regional Planning Commission v. Hiwassee</u> <u>Village Mobile Home Park LLC</u>, 304 S.W. 2d 302 (Tenn. 2010) that Hamblen County does not have authority to require our existing non-conforming use junkyards to screen the yards as required

by our 2005 zoning amendment. (See attached opinion) This case establishes that a "change in zoning" results in "grandfathered" non-conforming uses, just as an original adoption of zoning does where no zoning law had previously existed.

The amendment of our zoning ordinance in 2005 was meant to affect those junkyards which had been "grandfathered" in 1990. The amendment constituted a "change in zoning" and these junkyards are again "grandfathered" with regard to the application of the 2005 amendment.

Historically a couple of the yards did purchase trees to comply with the 2005 amendment but the trees died and were not replaced, and Hamblen County has not made any efforts to enforce the amendment in many years. Under both the statute, *TCA* §§ 13-7-208 (b) 1, and the holding in <u>Smith County Regional Planning Commission v. Hiwassee Village Mobile Home Park LLC</u>, the County's attempts to enforce the 2005 amendment regarding screening of junkyards could be successfully defended at the expense of Hamblen County regardless of how well intended and desirable the 2005 Amendment was. The 2010 case cited above was a change to the law existing in 2005.

13-7-208. Enforcement of ordinances — Remedies — Applicability of provisions.

(a)

(1) The chief legislative body may provide for the enforcement of any ordinance enacted under this part and part 3 of this chapter. A violation of any such ordinance is a <u>Class C misdemeanor</u>.

(2) In case any building or structure is or is proposed to be erected, constructed, reconstructed, altered, converted or maintained, or any building, structure or land is or is proposed to be used in violation of any ordinance enacted under this part and part 3 of this chapter, the building commissioner, municipal counsel or other appropriate authority of the municipality, or any adjacent or neighboring property owner who would be specially damaged by such violation, may, in addition to other remedies, institute injunction, mandamus or other appropriate action or proceeding to prevent such unlawful erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration, conversion, maintenance or use, or to correct or abate such violation, or to prevent the occupancy of the building, structure or land.

(b)

(1) In the event that a zoning change occurs in any land area where such land area was not previously covered by any zoning restrictions of any governmental agency of this state or its political subdivisions, or where such land area is covered by zoning restrictions of a governmental agency of this state or its political subdivisions, and such zoning restrictions differ from zoning restrictions imposed after the zoning change, then any industrial, commercial or business establishment in operation, permitted to operate under zoning regulations or exceptions thereto prior to the zoning change shall be allowed to continue in operation and be permitted; provided, that no change in the use of the land is undertaken by such industry or business.

(2) When the use permitted to continue to expand, or to be rebuilt pursuant to any subsection of this section is an off-premises sign, such use shall not preclude any new or additional conforming use or structure on the property on which the sign structure is located or on any adjacent property under the same ownership; provided, however, that any such new or additional use or structure does not result in any violations of the applicable zoning restrictions other than those nonconformities associated with the off-premises sign as allowed under this subdivision (b)(2).

(c) Industrial, commercial or other business establishments in operation and permitted to operate under zoning regulations or exceptions thereto in effect immediately preceding a change in zoning shall be allowed to expand operations and construct additional facilities which involve an actual continuance and expansion of the activities of the industry or business which were permitted and being conducted prior to the change in zoning; provided, that there is a reasonable amount of space for such expansion on the property owned by such industry or business situated within the area which is affected by the change in zoning, so as to avoid nuisances to adjoining landowners. No building permit or like

(d)

(1) Industrial, commercial, or other business establishments in operation and permitted to operate under zoning regulations or exceptions thereto immediately preceding a change in zoning shall be allowed to destroy present facilities and reconstruct new facilities necessary to the conduct of such industry or business subsequent to the zoning change; provided, that no destruction and rebuilding shall occur which shall act to change the use classification of the land as classified under any zoning regulations or exceptions thereto in effect immediately prior to or subsequent to a change in the zoning of the land area on which such industry or business is located. No building permit or like permission for demolition, construction or landscaping shall be denied to an industry or business seeking to destroy and reconstruct facilities necessary to the continued conduct of the activities of that industry or business, where such conduct was permitted prior to a change in zoning; provided, that there is a reasonable amount of space for such expansion on the property owned by such industry or business situated within the area which is affected by the change in zoning, so as to avoid nuisances to adjoining landowners.

(2)

(A) Multifamily residential establishments, whether used as owner-occupied property or rental property, which were permitted to operate under zoning regulations or exceptions thereto immediately preceding a change in zoning shall be allowed to reconstruct new facilities necessary to the conduct of such multifamily residential establishment subsequent to the zoning change, in the event of damage, whether partial or complete, by involuntary fire or wind damage or other natural disaster.

(B) If any such new facilities exceed the original height, density, setback, or square-footage of the original facilitles in existence immediately prior to the damage, then the new facilities shall constitute a change in the use of the land, and any protections provided hereunder shall be forfeited.

(C) If any such new facilities do not exceed the original height, density, setback, or square-footage of the original facilities in existence immediately prior to the damage, then the new facilities shall constitute a continuation of the use of the land immediately prior to the damage, and any protections provided hereunder shall not be forfeited.

(D) Whenever any ordinance enacted under authority of this chapter establishes stricter terms regarding the amount of partial damage that may be allowed without forfeiture of these protections, then any such ordinance shall govern.

(E) New facilities shall comply with all architectural design standards required under current zoning regulations and be consistent with the architectural context of the immediate and adjacent block faces. (e) Subsections (b)-(d) apply only to land owned and in use by such affected business, and do not operate to permit expansion of an existing industry or business through the acquisition of additional land.

(f) Subsections (b)-(e) do not apply to any municipality defined as a premiere type tourist resort according to § 67-6-103(a)(3)(B).

(g) Except as provided in subsection (/), subsections (b)-(d) shall not apply if an industrial, commercial, or other business establishment ceases to operate for a period of thirty (30) continuous months and the industrial, commercial, or other business use of the property did not conform with the land use classification as denoted in the existing zoning regulations for the zoning district in which it is located. Anytime after the thirty-month cessation, any use proposed to be established on the site, including any existing or proposed on-site sign, must conform to the provisions of the existing zoning regulations. For the purposes of this subsection (g), the thirty-month period of continuous ceased operation shall be tolled by:

(1) The period in which an industrial, commercial, or other business establishment is party to any action in a court of competent jurisdiction regarding the use of the property until such time that a final settlement, order, decree, or judgment has been rendered;

(3) The filing of an application for a building permit for the alteration, renovation or reconstruction of a structure which is nonconforming or of a structure in which or out of which a nonconforming industrial, commercial or other business use operates or is located; or

(4) The reactivation of the nonconforming use any time prior to the end of the thirty-month period; provided, however, that the restrictions of this subsection (g) and subsection (i) shall only apply if the property owner intentionally and voluntarily abandons the nonconforming use of the property. In any contested matter on the use of such property, the government has the burden of proving an overt act of abandonment in such matter.

(h) Subsections (b)-(d) shall apply to an off-site sign which, for the purposes of this subsection (h), means any sign that advertises or gives direction to any business, product, service, attraction, or any other purpose or interest, other than the industrial, commercial or other business establishment located on the site where the sign is located; provided, however, that any expansion shall be limited as follows: (1) Any off-site sign smaller than a standard 8-sheet poster which, for the purposes of this subsection (h), means an off-site sign with overall dimensions of at least five feet four inches (5' 4") to six feet two inches (6' 2") in height and eleven feet four inches (11' 4") to twelve feet two inches (12' 2") in width shall not be expanded to a size greater than a standard 8-sheet poster;

(2) Any standard 8-sheet poster shall not be expanded to a size greater than a 30-sheet poster which, for the purposes of this subsection (h), means an off-site sign with overall dimensions of twelve feet three inches (12' 3") in height and twenty-four feet six inches (24' 6") in width;

(3) Any standard 30-sheet poster shall not be expanded to a size greater than any standard bulletin which, for the purposes of this subsection (h), means any off-site sign with overall dimensions of ten feet (10') to fourteen feet (14') in height and thirty-six feet (36') to forty-eight feet (48') in width;

(7) Any operation, rebuilding, or expansion of an off-site sign that has been in existence for ten (10) years or more shall not be denied solely on the basis that the original permit for the sign does not exist to prove that it was a lawful use when constructed.

(i) Notwithstanding subsection (d), any structure rebuilt on the site must conform to the existing zoning regulations as to setbacks, height, bulk, or requirements as to the physical location of a structure upon the site, provided that this subsection (i) shall not apply to off-site signs.

(j) Subsections (g), (h) and (i) do not apply to any home rule municipality; provided, however, that subject to the approval of the local legislative body, a home rule municipality may opt into these subsections.

(k) Notwithstanding subsections (a)-(i), subsection (g) shall not apply to any industrial establishment location where twenty-five percent (25%) or more of the gross annual sales from such location are derived from sales to or contracts with local, state or federal governments or as a subcontractor to contracts with local, state or federal governments, or to any industrial establishment location where seventy-five percent (75%) or more of the gross annual sales from the location are made to agriculture or construction businesses.

(1) As used in this subsection (/):

(A) "Block" means a unit of land bounded by streets or by a combination of streets and public land, railroad rights-of-way, waterways or any other barrier to the continuity of development; and

(B) The parcel on which the nonconforming motor vehicle business establishment is located has less than two hundred fifty feet (250') of frontage on any public street or road, excluding any portion of the frontage not owned or leased by the licensed operator of the nonconforming motor vehicle business establishment; and

(C) At least ten percent (10%) of the inventory of the nonconforming motor vehicle business establishment at any point in time consists of motor vehicles titled pursuant to title 55, chapter 3, part 2, including, but not limited to, vehicles with salvage titles, flood titles, rebuilt titles, or nonrepairable vehicle certificates. The operator of the nonconforming motor vehicle business establishment shall make the titles for all of the vehicles located on the premises of the nonconforming motor vehicle business days of the original titles at the office of the local zoning inspection official within three (3) business days of the request by the local zoning inspection official. The failure of the nonconforming motor vehicle business establishment to make the titles for the vehicles located on the premises of the nonconforming motor vehicle business days of the request by the local zoning inspection official. (1) If any land area becomes subject to land use restrictions imposed pursuant to a redevelopment plan undertaken by any governmental agency of this state or of its political subdivisions pursuant to chapter 20, part 2 or part 7 of this title, or if the land area is subject to land use restrictions that are amended by any governmental agency of this state or of its political subdivisions pursuant to chapter 20, part 2 or part 7 of this title, and if the land use restrictions differ from the land use restrictions contained in the amended land use restrictions, then any industrial, commercial, or other business establishment in operation and permitted to operate prior to the initial adoption of the land use restrictions or an amendment thereto, shall be allowed to continue in operation and shall be permitted; provided, that no change in the use of the land is undertaken by the industrial, commercial, or business establishment.

(2) Immediately preceding an initial adoption of the land use restrictions or an amendment of the restrictions, industrial, commercial, and other business establishments in operation and permitted to operate under land use restrictions imposed pursuant to a redevelopment plan undertaken by any

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facilities are acquired by a governmental entity pursuant to the power of eminent domain, or under threat of the exercise of the power of eminent domain, or replace facilities required to be relocated as the result of the acquisition of property by a governmental entity pursuant to the power of eminent domain, or under threat of the exercise of the power of eminent domain, or to rebuild facilities if they are damaged by unplanned casualty or act of God; provided, that:

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(A) The replacement facilities shall not be larger in size than the facilities in existence prior to the acquisition, relocation, or damage caused by unplanned casualty or act of God;

(B) The construction of the replacement facilities shall commence within thirty (30) months of the date of the taking or acquisition under threat of the exercise of the power of eminent domain or the date of the damage caused by unplanned casualty or act of God; and

(C) There is a reasonable amount of space for the replacement facilities on the property owned by the industry or business situated within the area that is affected by the adoption of the land use restrictions or an amendment of the restrictions, so as to avoid nuisances to adjoining landowners.

(3) Subdivision (m)(2) applies only to land owned and in use by the affected industrial, commercial, or other business establishment prior to acquisition or relocation resulting from the exercise of the power of eminent domain, or the threat of the exercise of the power of eminent domain, or the damage to facilities caused by unplanned casualty or act of God, and does not operate to permit the replacement of facilities necessary to the conduct of the industry or business through the acquisition of additional land.
(4) Subdivisions (m)(2) and (3) apply only to any acquisition or relocation of facilities within an area subject to land use restrictions imposed pursuant to a redevelopment plan undertaken on or after July 1, 2015, by any governmental agency of this state or of its political subdivisions pursuant to chapter 20, part 2 or part 7 of this title, or to damage to facilities caused by casualty or act of God occurring on or after July 1, 2015, regardless of the redevelopment plan's date of enactment.

Subject:	Street Naming of SR66 for 911 purposes

State Route 66 (SR66) is nearing completion. It was asked by GIS staff if there is an actual name, instead of the roadway being called the temporary name of the I-81 Exit 4 connector. Each governing agency has the authority to name their roadways, and it should conform to 9-1-1 requirements (such as no duplication of street names, within acceptable address ranges, etc).

Currently, the 1st section of this roadway is called Merchants Greene Blvd, from W. Andrew Johnson Hwy/ US Hwy 11E to the north, traversing in a southerly direction to the end of the City of Morristown's corporation boundary (near SR160). The length of this is approximately 6,650 feet. It should be noted that this section is also listed as SR474, but that state route designation will disappear once the entire SR66 is open to traffic.

The next 2 sections are within Hamblen County that will need to be named for 911 purposes.

The first of which is approximately 300 feet from the City of Morristown's corporation boundary, to the 1st traffic signal on the SR66 bridge.

The second section is from the 1st traffic signal on the SR66 bridge to the Hamblen County – Jefferson County boundary. The length is approximately 11,515 feet.

The right-of-way of SR66 within these 2 sections of Hamblen County are controlled access, thus there is no direct access from private property onto SR66.

The 3rd section of SR66 that is to be named is within Jefferson County, which is approximately 12,200 feet in length. The right-of-way of SR66 within this section of

Jefferson County is controlled access as well, thus there is no direct access from private property onto SR66.


The last section is within the White Pine corporation boundary. It is approximately 1,400 feet in length. White Pine personnel stated that they are going to continue with the Roy Messer Hwy designation (which currently exists on SR341, and SR66 ties in directly with Roy Messer Hwy/ SR341).

There is a SR66 Corridor Management Agreement (CMA) committee that meets to discuss issues concerning SR66. Its membership consists of personnel from each of the local agencies, as well as TDOT. This group is just an advisory board as they can make recommendations, but do not have any authoritative power. It is anticipated that this group will meet in February or in March, 2020, and the street naming of SR66 will be an item to be discussed.

REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT



Members,

Many of you have received questions regarding refugee resettlement in Tennessee. This issue received attention nationally as a result of changes that were made by a new executive order issued September 26, 2019, by President Trump. We are sharing this information to help answer questions you may have about how this program could affect your county and to help you be able to better answer questions from constituents. We are posting a number of materials regarding this issue on our website www.tncounties.org, under the resources tab.

What did the executive order do?

The executive order reduced the total number of refugees being accepted into the United States and gave the State Department 90 days to develop a process to ensure to the greatest degree possible that refugees would only be resettled into locations where both the state and local governments have consented to receive refugees. As a result of the executive order, refugee resettlement agencies working in Tennessee reached out to Governor Lee and to certain county mayors in December to request their consent to continue resettling refugees into this state.

Which counties are affected?

This has primarily been an issue affecting the four largest urban counties. According to a report from the Department of State, 5610 individuals were resettled in Tennessee during the five year period from October 1, 2014 to October 1, 2019. The vast majority of those individuals were resettled in Shelby, Davidson, Knox and Hamilton Counties. For example, during the quarterly period from July 1, 2019 to September 30, 2019, a total of 221 individuals were resettled in Tennessee. Of that number 210 were placed in one of those four counties.

Is this issue currently in litigation?

A federal court in Maryland issued a preliminary injunction January 15, 2020, stopping the implementation of the executive order until a court determines its constitutionality. Resettlement agencies in that state had challenged the constitutionality of delegating immigration decisions to state and local governments. Prior to this injunction, Governor Lee and the mayors of some of the urban counties where these programs operated had consented to continue receiving refugees. Depending on the outcome of the litigation, it is unknown whether consent will still be required.

Is this issue being considered at the General Assembly?

In response to Governor Lee's decision, some legislators filed bills to require local governments to be authorized by the General Assembly before they could agree to receive refugees. These bills have not been scheduled for consideration yet.

REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT

Does my county need to act?

If your county was not contacted by an agency requesting your permission to accept refugees, there is really nothing you need to do. Under the executive order, you did not have to opt-out; you had to opt-in or consent to receive refugees.

How many people are we talking about?

For the federal fiscal year 2019 under the reduced number of total refugees allowed in the country, it is projected that 583 individuals may be resettled in Tennessee, with all of those expected to be placed in Shelby, Davidson, Knox and Hamilton Counties.

Do cities have to consent as well?

Our understanding is that the executive order directed the State Department to get consent from state and county governments or county equivalents. The county equivalent language is to address consolidated governments and states that have alternate forms of local government (boroughs or parishes) or for independent cities that are not part of a county. Tennessee does not have boroughs, parishes or independent cities, so the decision is made at the county level.

Who is a refugee?

A refugee is an individual who flees his/her country due to a well-founded fear of persecution based on of five protected classes: religion, political opinion, race, nationality, or membership in a particular social group. Refugee status must be applied for and received after the screening process proves the well-founded fear is true. Refugees must also be otherwise admissible to the US and not firmly resettled in a third country^[1].

[1] 101 (a)(42) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA).

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What is the difference between a refugee and an immigrant?

An immigrant is any person who comes to permanently live in a different country. Refugees are one category of immigrants. Not all immigrants are refugees; other categories of immigrants to the US include business people, foreign spouses of US citizens, and family members of US citizens, for example.

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What is the difference between a refugee and an asylee?

Asylum status is a form of protection available to people who:

- Meet the definition of refugee
- Are already in the United States
- Are seeking admission at a port of entry
- Learn more about these two designations.

Chairman Horner called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

Updates

Mayor Brittain updated the Committee with the following items:

- a. Inmate Population- Mayor Bill Brittain presented the Committee the inmate population totals as of today verses 2019. The total inmates as of today were 376 and the average daily population in 2019 was 435. He complemented Jail Administrator Captain Teresa Laws and her team for their good efforts in getting the number of inmates lowered to an acceptable amount.
- b. Fire Marshall Inspection Mayor Brittain presented the Committee the final Fire Marshall report dated Friday, February 7, 2020 from the Division of Fire Prevention Coeds and Enforcement Section. The Complaint investigation by the Fire Marshall has now been "Closed" noting the deficiencies in prior inspections were corrected.
- c. **Bond Issue-January 14, 2020**-Mayor Brittain notified the Committee the \$20 Million Bonds were sold with maturities of 3 to 30 years and were issued at an average interest rate of 2.39%. The County had budgeted/projected the rate would be 3.25%. There was a premium of \$885,000 to be set aside for end of project expenses. The money will continue to earn interest until the funds are used.
- d. **Property Acquisitions-**Mayor Brittain addressed the Committee with the following recommendations on the property acquisitions which would be closing soon.
 - 1. Wilder Property-Written Contract should be ready by the Commission Meeting on February 20, 2020 and recommends the purchase of the property be added to the Agenda/Regular Calendar for the Commission meeting.
 - Rescue Squad/EMS Property-the County is working on a property swap with the Rescue Squad/EMS and requested to add this Agreement to the Agenda/Regular Calendar Motion (Howard Shipley/Randy DeBord, all in favor) to add the Wilder Property Purchase and the Property Swap for the Rescue Squad/EMS Building to the Agenda/Regular Calendar for the Commission Meeting on February 20, 2020.
 - 3. Asbestos/Lead Paint Study-Mayor Brittain notified the Committee that the Asbestos/Lead Paint Study has been completed on all 7 properties including the Hale house. Asbestos was located in 3 of the 7 properties (Law Office, Maintenance Building, Hale house). Lead Paint was located in 5 of the 7 properties, mostly encapsulated by vinyl siding on the exteriors and other areas. Work will have to be completed before any properties are demolished. All work on asbestos and lead paint removal would have to be bid out for the total cost.

4. Hale Property- Mayor Brittain proposed ideas about how to utilize the Hale Property when purchased by the County. The maintenance building would be demolished and a new maintenance building constructed at the rear of the property. This would leave room for at least 75 additional parking spaces. In addition, two or three offices would be relocated in the Hale Property. The house would also have to comply and be updated to the ADA laws. Use of the second story may be limited based on ADA requirements.

Motion (Howard Shipley/Mike Minnich, all in favor) to proceed with the purchase of the Hale Property, retaining an Architect to design the new maintenance building with the parking lot and prepare the ADA Compliance Plans for the Hale Property.

- e. **Moseley Architects' Update.** Bryan Payne of Moseley Architects presented a recap of the design of the new Justice Center for the Committee. Discussion involved:
 - Work Release Dormitory with 30 additional beds to make the total bed count 616.
 Motion (Jim Stepp/Goins, No Vote from Bobby Haun, rest in favor) to include a Work Release Dormitory Housing unit in the project design.
 - 2. Vacuum Waste System vs. Gravity Based System-Benefits included Water use reduction, Limited underground piping, and ease of maintenance, no grinder pump station and fully integrated management system. This would increase the cost of the project and estimated \$1,872,161. The ROI from savings in water and sewer fees was estimated at 15 years. Maintenance Supervisor Terry Myers and Commissioner Tim Horner were asked their opinion based on a visit the prior week to a detention facility in South Carolina which had the Vacuum Waste System. They did not recommend using the vacuum waste system.

Motion (Joe Huntsman, Sr. /Thomas Doty, all in favor) to use the Gravity System in the new project.

3. Water Management Systems- Jason Forsyth from Moseley Architects discussed the benefits of a water management system. The benefits include added control and monitoring usage of commodes, sinks, showers, less inmate contraband disposal and water use reduction. The cost would be \$200,000. Forsyth recommended to purchase the system from a fixture manufacturer instead of a third-party vendor.

Motion (Mike Minnich/Chris Cutshaw, all in favor) to install a water management system from a fixture manufacturer, not a third party system.

- Emergency Generator System-Jason Forsyth lastly discussed the Emergency Generator System Options. Four options were presented including using Diesel Generators or Natural Gas Generators. *Motion (Thomas Doty/Randy DeBord, all in favor) to use Option 3 – (2)* 500kW Natural Gas Generators (Jail/Life Safety).
- f. Jail Staffing Study-Mayor Brittain notified the Committee that the Staffing Study for the new Justice Center would be completed in April. March 16th, and 17th, 2020, Jim Hart with CTAS will be onsite to conduct the study.
